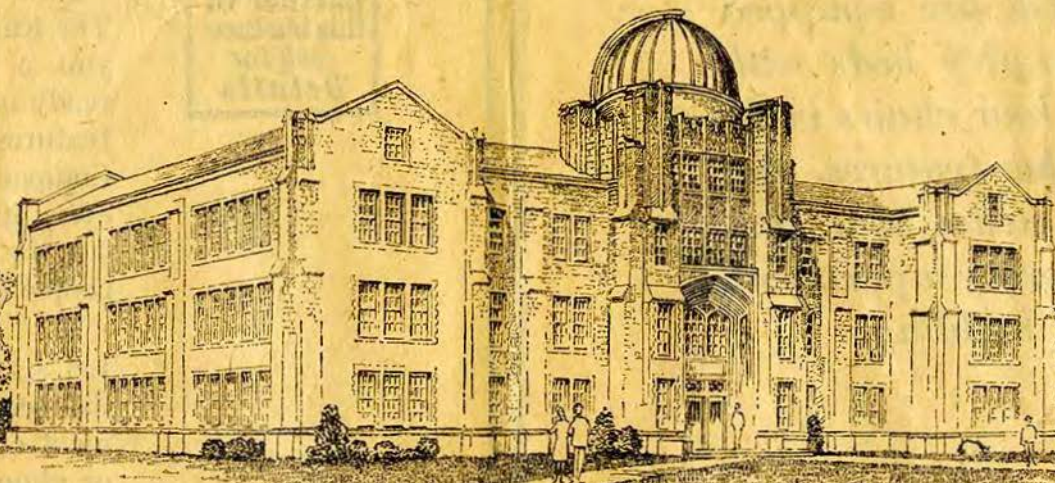

Most Up to Date Science Hall in State Planned for Hays Teachers College

Hays Teachers college will have perhaps the most complete and up-to-date science hall of any college in the state when its new \$150,000 science hall is completed. In the opinion of Charles D. Cuthbert, state architect. Cuthbert has completed the plans for the new building at Hays, and the contract will be let January 17.

The building will be constructed

of native stone taken from the state ground at Hays, with fireproof concrete interior construction, asbestos shingle roof, copper gutters, and a huge copper covered observatory dome. The new hall will have a frontage of 144 feet and a depth of 90 feet, with chemical laboratories, individual and class room; grain grading laboratories; dairy laboratories, a chicken testing laboratory

and administration and class rooms, also a large general lecture room on the third floor.

Cuthbert also reports several other large state building projects practically ready for letting the contracts. The contract for the new A. O. U. W. building at the Norton Tuberculosis sanatorium will be let January 17. The contract

for the \$150,000 training school building for the Emporia Teachers college will be let early in February. Plans for Snow hall, the new \$200,000 Zoology building at the University of Kansas, will be completed about February 15, and plans for the \$150,000 music hall at Pittsburg Teachers college will be completed about the same time.
