GPOUND IS BROKEN AT HAYS FOR NEW BUILDING

HAYS, Kan., Feb. 6.—Ground breaking ceremonies were observed at the State Teachers College here Feb. 1 for the new \$150,000 science had appropriated by the 1927 legislature. Construction is to begin at once.

Wendell Burditt, Ness City, a senior, Edward Cain, Hays, a junior, Harold Copeland, Hays, a sophomore, and Dorothy King, Hays, a freshman, spoke at the program as representatives of the four classes.

The spade used in the rites was presented to Prof. Roy Rankin, chairman of the science group of the faculty, by Pres. W. A.
