What is email CLUTTER?

So you can't find a message that you have been told has been sent...perhaps that message has landed Clutter – but what is Clutter and how do you deal with it? First thing to know is that Clutter is not a spam filter. Spam messages will go to your junk mail folder (so be sure to check your junk mail folder occasionally). Clutter will "learn" what your lower priority messages are and place those in the Clutter folder.

If you find a message in your Clutter folder that you prefer goes to your Inbox, drag it to your Inbox. It may take a couple of times or so, but Clutter will learn that particular messages belong in your Inbox, and others are okay to send to Clutter. It may take a little while for you to get used to Clutter, but many people really like this feature once they become accustomed to it, and Clutter learns to put most things in the appropriate place.

Should you decide that you do not like Clutter and wish to turn this off, you will need to login to the Outlook Web Access (your web browser) in order to turn off the feature.

Caryn Mirriam-Goldberg is the 2009-2013 Poet Laureate of Kansas, and the author or editor of 19 books, including the recently published *Poem on the Range: A Poet Laureate's Love Song to Kansas*.
