# R. U. BROOKS



Raymond Brooks joined the FHSU faculty in 1935 and served as superintendent of buildings and professor of industrial education. Mr. Brooks held a bachelor's and master's degree in architectural engineering from Kansas State University. Except for a six-month leave of absence, he served FHSU for 36 continuous years. Mr. Brooks died in 1971. His wife Tina May lives in Hays and is here today.

## C.A. WITT



C.A. (Cliff) Witt joined the FHSU staff in 1934 as a maintenance engineer. He was a contractor in Hays and helped build Custer Hall and the old cafeteria on campus before being hired by the University. Mr. Witt retired from FHSU in 1964 after almost 30 years at the University. Mr. Witt and wife Blanche live in Hays and are with us today.
