The draught bit us pretty hard as well as others, we won't have half a con erch, but on kafir com is five and will make an interes erch if we do not have prost too soon, we have about ten a eleven acres, we have a 20 acre meddow of prarie hay, we had art about 2/3 of it before the rains cam and it was very short, but it has grown Do much since the rains that I think we can cut it again. We have had a little fruit in spite of the late fosts the draught and hail, I canned 21gts. of cherrier and 18 2 gtr of friadus and we will have some fears and a few apples, I have canned 9 gtr of beets, hut we have had no tomatoer 15 put up get just a few to eat, but the viner are full of blooms and small over so I may get some yet to faut up, I hope so for we are all so fond of them. I think we shall have all the strain and hornips we want and black eyed pear. We had to dig the potatoes for
