Tonight's Game

Unbeaten Kearney Antelopes Are First Foe at Home

Fort Hays State makes its home debut tonight after two tough weeks on the road . . . and the Tigers couldn't face a more formidable foe in their first appearance before the home fans.

Saddled with a 7-7 tie at Northwest Missouri State and a 42-0 pounding at Colorado Western, the Tigers face undefeated and ambitious Kearney State College tonight.

Kearney has trounced three straight opponents, dumping Washburn, 19-14; Wayne (Neb.) State, 51-14, and Peru (Neb.) State, 35-0. This gives the veteran Antelopes a 105-28 scoring advantage in just three outings.

It also just about wraps up their second straight Nebraska College Conference championship. Wayne and Peru were considered the top threats in pre-season guessing.

Coach Al Zikmund's squad is already hoping for a post-season bowl bid, and Kearney publicity is boosting sensational southpaw passer Dick Butolph for Little All-America honors.

Butolph is the top star in Kearney's crown. The 190-pound senior can run adequately, plays solid defense and is a fine field general. But his forte is passing—as evidenced by these statistics for the first three games: 33 completions in 46 passing attempts, for 520 yards and seven touchdowns.

Other top Kearney performers to watch are pass-receiving end Jim Irwin, who has caught 17 of 18 passes thrown his way this fall; end Larry McCord; running backs Bill Backes, John Johnson and Sterling Troxel, and linemen Don Hather, Ed Kruml and freshman Randy Rasmusen.

Fort Hays State has a number of incentives tonight, besides making a good first showing at home.

The Tigers will be out to prove that they're a better team than they've shown thus far. Though the Bengal ground defense has been very adequate, the offense hasn't jelled as yet and the pass defense was severely sliced for 222 yards and three touchdowns last weekend at Colorado Western.

Also, the Staters—particularly those returning from last season—will seek to gain revenge for the 27-13 defeat they sustained at Kearney last fall. The 1962 Tigers had whitewashed their first two opponents before falling into the Antelope lair.

Kearney, with only one loss and one tie in its last 15 games over a three-season span, will be favored tonight.

Next Week

Next Saturday night the Tigers will open their conference season by entertaining Omaha University here at Lewis Field Stadium. Game time will be 7:30. The contest highlights Band and Parents Day at FHS. Omaha, the defending CIC champion, is a heavy favorite for a repeat title. The Indians will bring a star-studded cast to Hays, featuring 300-pound Jack Peterson, national sprint champion Roger Sayers and all-CIC quarterback Carl Meyers.

This Game in History . . .

Five years ago . . .

In the midst of their greatest gridiron era, Kearney stopped the Tigers five times inside the KSC 20 to walk off with a 35-7 decision at Kearney. Fullback Chuck Vernon got the only FHS score. Claire Boroff, Gary Schmidt, Gene Lawhead and Larry Jacobsen paced Kearney.



Fort Hays State Roots Planted Deep in Area History

Welcome, sports fans, to the campus of Fort Hays Kansas State College, where once great herds of buffalo grazed, Indians pitched their tepees and prairie dogs dug their burrows.

The site now occupied by Lewis Field Stadium, home of the Tigers, is directly north of the location of Old Fort Hays, one of several Army forts erected along the Union Pacific right-of-way to protect the railroad and the settlers from Indians.

Fort Hays, during its short life from 1867 to 1889, knew the glory of famous Civil War heroes and Indian fighters. Gen. Philip Sheridan, Gen. George Forsyth, Gen. George Custer and his Seventh Cavalry, Buffalo Bill—these were men of history who left their impress on Fort Hays.

But today, the institution of higher learning that bears the name of this landmark in our heritage looks not to the past but to the present and the future. Fort Hays Kansas State College stands as a testimonial to far-sighted Western Kansans who saw a need for a college that would serve this vast area of the Great Plains, and Fort Hays State has set this one simple goal for itself: service to the people of Kansas, particularly Western and Central Kansas.

In this fall semester of 1963, nearly 3,900 students are enrolled on the campus—almost 400 per cent increase since 1950. To give them the instruction, guidance and inspiration they come for, 229 faculty members are presently employed.

What do numbers like these mean to a college like Fort Hays State? Put simply, they mean problems to match the size of the numbers, but all the problems can be tied into one large bundle: How can the college achieve and hold excellence in the face of these numbers?

This is the problem of today and tomorrow as enrollments skyrocket.

With its roots planted deep in the history of this land, and with a heritage of courage from the pioneers and determination of the molders of the college, Fort Hays State works to solve this problem and to achieve its goal of service now and in years to come.



McConnell Heads Coaching Staff for Eighth Year

Coach Wayne J. McConnell leads his Tigers on the field tonight for the 65th game of his eight-year coaching tenure at Fort Hays State.

McConnell came to FHS in 1956 after a highly successful six-year stay at College of Emporia, where four of his teams were undefeated in regular season play. He was named Little All-American Coach of the Year in 1953.

This is also the beginning of Mac's third decade in coaching. Tonight's contest is the 161st game in that career, with an all-time mark of 93 victories, 60 defeats and seven ties behind him.

Ed McNeil is assisting McConnell for the seventh straight year at FHS. His duties are those of line coach and chief scout.

A former third-team All-American tackle at Kansas State, Ed also assisted McConnell for five years at College of Emporia. He was on the coaching staff at North Dakota University two years before coming to FHS in 1957.

Jerry Strecker is a graduate assistant on the coaching staff. A Russell native, Jerry was a four-year Tiger starter as an offensive center. He is working on his master's degree in physical education. Strecker assists with both the varsity and junior varsity.

Ron Gardner is the other graduate assistant on the staff. Ron, a native of Abilene, was also a four-year Bengal starter at tackle and earned second team all-CIC honors last fall. He is working on his master's in physical education. Ron also assists with scouting.







The School . . .


Kearney State College, Kearney, Neb., is a state-supported liberal arts college currently in its 58th year of operation.

Though the college's name was changed from Nebraska State Teachers College last summer by act of the Nebraska legislature, its primary aim is still preparing teachers.

The well-rounded curriculum also includes pre-professional courses and graduate work leading to the master's degree. KSC is on the semester basis with tuition set at \$100 per semester for Nebraska residents. Only 55 of the current enrollment of 2,510 are from outside Nebraska.
