Today's Game

CIC Campaign Begins at '64 FHS Homecoming

The 1964 Central Intercollegiate Conference football campaign gets under way today as Fort Hays State and Washburn, two teams with hopes of contending for the championship, clash in the Tigers' Homecoming game.

FHS and the visiting Ichabods each sport a 3-1 record in non-league play. The Topeka squad was a pre-season pick to battle for the crown, but Fort Hays State's meteoric rise to contender's status had been unanticipated.

The contest today pits the Tigers' potent, league-leading offense against Washburn's solid, league-leading defense, giving the game an "irresistible force vs. immovable object" angle.

Also adding spice to today's battle is the revenge motive. Last year Coach Ellis Rainsberger's Blues stomped on the Tigers, 46-0, at Topeka.

Olympic Salute

The cover of today's program was designed by Spencer Advertising Co. as a special tribute to the United States Olympic Team, currently competing in Tokyo. Fort Hays State sports fans join sportsmen the nation over in saluting the U. S. Olympians and cheering their success in Tokyo.

ka in a game that saw six players ejected for fighting and four Tigers carried off with injuries.

Coach Wayne McConnell's Fighting Tigers have dumped Kearney, Neb., State, 35-14; Southwestern Oklahoma, 27-19; and Central Missouri State, 40-6. They lost to undefeated Colorado Western, 23-7.

Washburn dropped its opener to Kearney, 14-12, but bounced back to trounce Central Missouri, 31-0; dump Colorado Mines, 16-0; and edge Southern Colorado State, 12-7.

Washburn's defense is anchored by middle guard Bob Noblitt, former Great Bend gridder who was an All-CIC choice last fall. The offense has been hampered by injuries to halfbacks Frank Pickens and Bob Hardy and prize transfer Bob Wallace, a former University of Iowa quarterback.

Tiger Coach McConnell has labeled this game "the turning point" of the '64 season. The team that wins today must be given an odds-on chance to win the 1964 CIC title.

Next Week

Next Saturday the Fighting Tigers go to Emporia State for another CIC contest. The 2 p.m. affair will highlight E-State's Band Day. Emporia, winless in its first four games and scoreless in three of them, will seek revenge for last year's 28-13 loss to FHS. And Fort Hays State hasn't won at Emporia since 1954. The game will be broadcast by KAYS radio.



Homecoming Welcome from President Cunningham

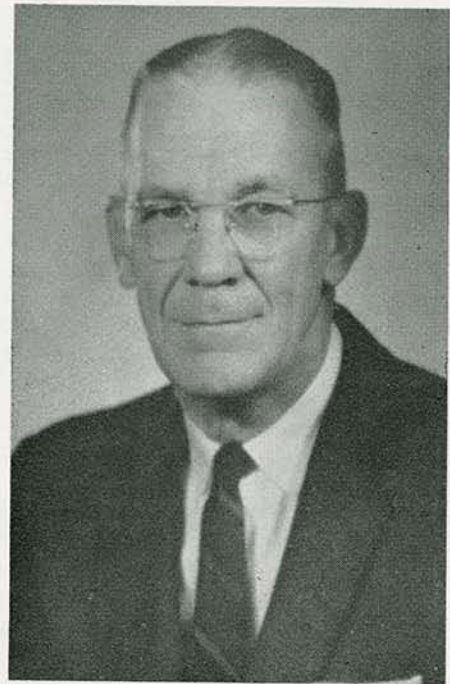

Eighth Annual 'Busch' Gross Award

Athletic Director Paul "Busch" Gross, a native of Hays, served as a Tiger athlete from 1917 through 1921, was head FHS basketball coach from 1930 through 1946 and has been athletic director since 1930. He is in his 35th and final year on the FHS faculty.

It is in recognition of this lifetime of service to Fort Hays State College that the Busch Gross Award is given each year at the Homecoming game.

The award honors the outstanding senior athlete of the past school year, with a committee making the selection on the basis of character, leadership, scholarship and athletic achievement. 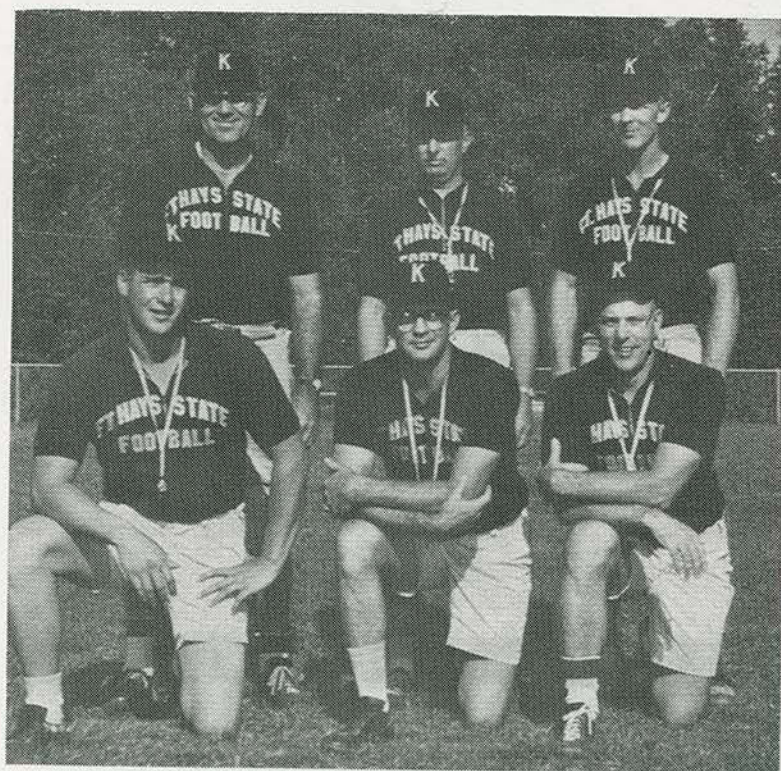

Head football coach Wayne J. McConnell is in his ninth season at Fort Hays State and his 22nd year of coaching.

A 1934 graduate of Washburn—the Tigers' opponent today—he earned his master's at Emporia State. He coached at high schools in Effingham, Gaylord, Downs and Manhattan before becoming head coach at College of Emporia in 1950. He was at C of E for six years.

Wayne's lifetime football coaching record includes 97 victories, 66 losses and seven ties.

Ed McNeil is Tiger line coach for the eighth season and also serves as chief scout. Wendell Liemohn, former Little All-American end at Wartburg College, is a new assistant coach working with the ends.

Jack Hazlett and Darrell Hildebrand are serving as graduate assistants this season, Hazlett in charge of the junior varsity and Hildebrand working with the varsity backs. Both are former Tiger lettermen.

Larry Dreiling, a four-time letterman, is a senior assistant helping with the jayvee squad.
