Hays, Kansas, Nov. _____ The Alumni Association of Fort Hays Kansas State College is making plans for a memorial for the late President W. A. Lewis. A committee of twenty members is responsible for the project, which is to be known as the Lewis Memorial.

This general committee met during the Fort Hays Kansas State College Homecoming to start definite plans. Hugh Burnett of the class of '27, chairman of the general committee, appointed a smaller committee of six to draw up plans and specifications with an architect. The committee membership is as follows: Mr. Burnett, chairman, Mrs. Nita Landrum, Dr. C. E. Rarick, Prof. Ed Davis, Dr. C. J. Wilson, and Mr. Val Weigel.

This committee will meet Friday noon on the Fort Hays Kansas State College campus to begin work on plans, which they hope to have completed and ready to present to the general committee by the middle of December. The campaign for financing the project will begin the first of the year.

In his speech before the Alumni Association, Mr. Burnett introduced the idea of a Campanile, a tower-like structure with chimes, as the memorial. This, he said, had long been a dream of the president for the campus, and therefore would be quite fitting. Both Raymond Custer, superintendent of schools at Wakeeney, Kansas, and Dr. Rarick, acting president of Fort Hays Kansas State College, spoke heartily indorsing this suggestion.
