Dear Kent:

Thank you for your courtesies extended to me in our recent telephone conversations and I regret that I did not get to see you personally while in Hays.

Even though we are late in getting this information to you due to changing and lack of continuity in personnel we hope that you and the committee will consider what Schulmerich Carillons, Inc. has to offer. I am sure that you are well acquainted with the Schulmerich products and know that we are the world's largest manufacturer of bells, chimes, and carillons and have experienced men in the field to install and service our bell systems.

Realizing that you now have another system on demo it is my purpose to show you that we can furnish equal and more adequate equipment at a reasonable price.

The system that we would offer you is the Arlington Americana Bell System 181-53 with 25 English Bells and 25 Harp Bells (total of 50 bells) played from a separate, beautiful 2-manual console (bench included), enabling you to play a melody on the English Bells on one manual with an accompaniment on the harp on the second manual. This would be a great asset to your Music Department and to the students who would be interested in learning the art of the carillonneur. The system would include 2 tape decks, one for automatic playing and the other for your Alma Mater tape.

The outside speaker system would consist of 8-31inch weather-proof speakers each equipped with a 60-watt driver; there is also one inside speaker.

The automatic functions would be activated by a Program Clock with Power Failure Indicator. Another basic function of the system would be the Westminster Chimes which could be programmed

for any desired hours and times. All of the above to be powered by a solid state amplifier of 480 watts (960 watts peak power).

I am assuming that the console would be no greater distance from the amplifier than 50 ft. (A greater distance would require extra cost of expensive cable).

We could make the above complete installation, including a recital by one of our carilloneurs, for \$13,975.

However, if you are not interested in the possibilities of the additional 25 harp bells and second manual and desire only a system of 25 English Bells, we propose the Coronation 181-53 identical in all other respects to the Arlington 181-53 except for the 25 harp bells and second keyboard.

This would be a bell instrument comparable to that which you have on demo at this time. The price of the Schulmerich Coronation described above, including recital, would be \$11,820.


