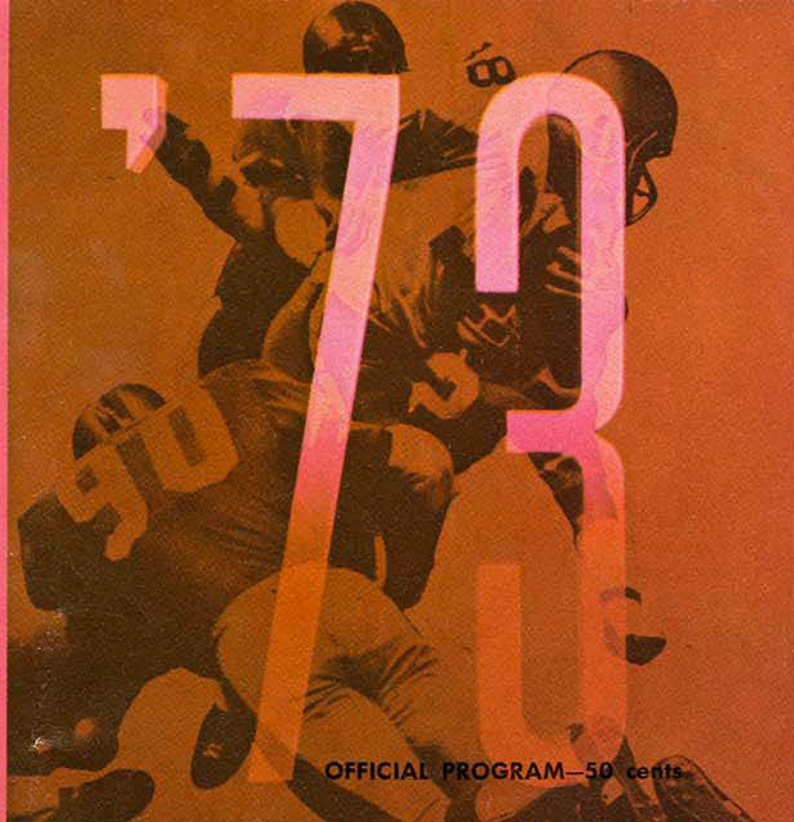
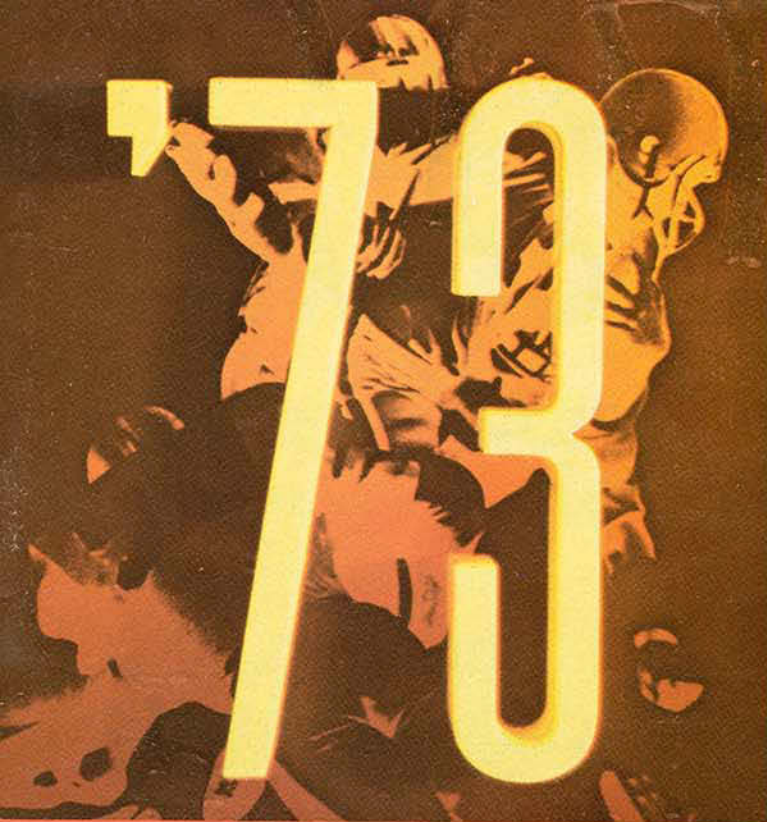

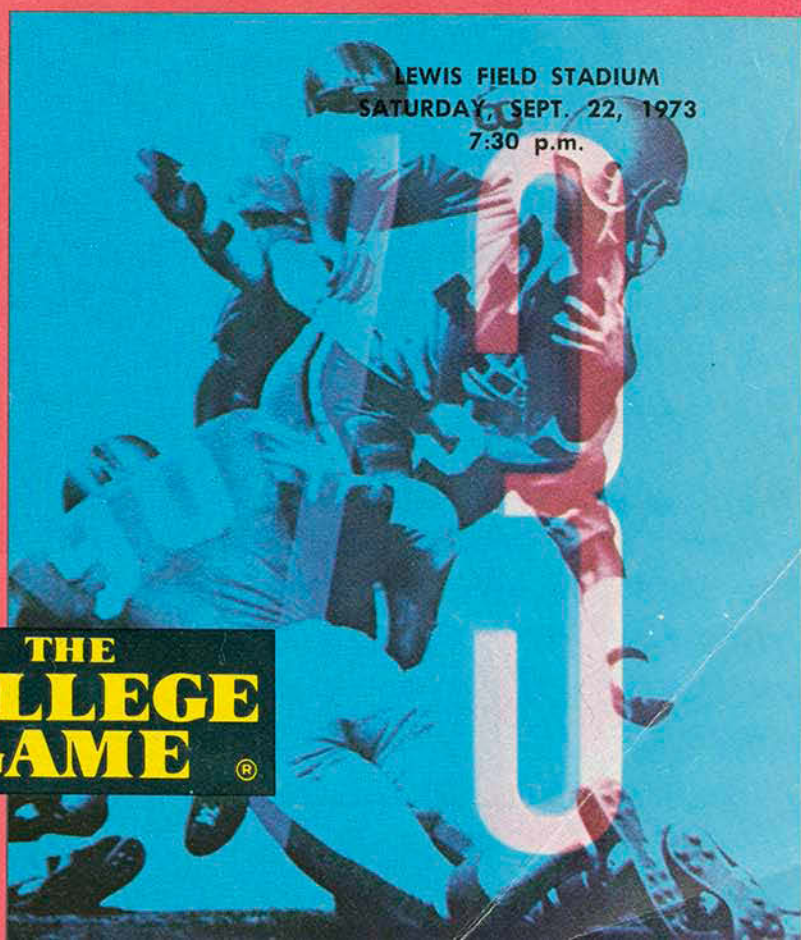

A Look at Tonight's Game—

Kearney State College of Nebraska visits Fort Hays State with two wins already under its belt this season.

Last season in Head Coach Claire Boroff's first year at the helm, the Antelopes compiled a 7-2 record, including a narrow 24-21 victory over the Tigers.

A damaging blow was dealt to the Kearney State offense last week when fullback Tom Kropp was lost for the remainder of the season with a knee injury. However, the Antelopes gained 263 yards rushing and 242 yards through the air in a 42-7 trouncing of Eastern Montana.

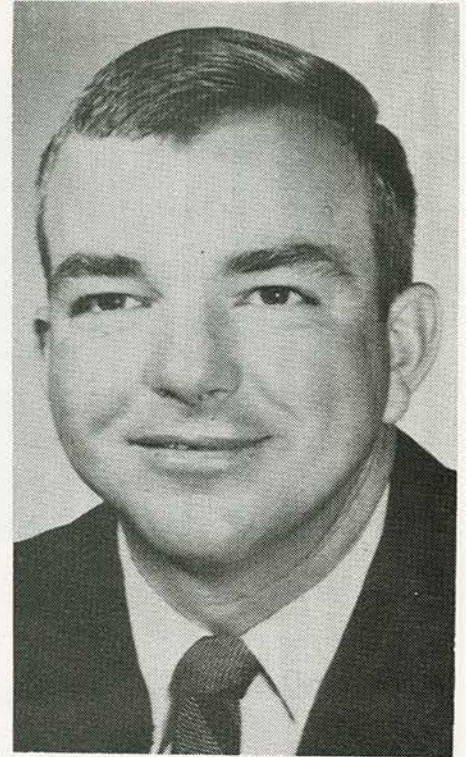
Senior quarterback Scott Maline heads up the offense with backfield help from halfback Dallas Wymore and Kropp's replacement, Bill Simon. On defense, the Antelopes are anchored in the secondary by two all-district selections, Tom Ambrose and Alan Sheffield.

The Tigers return home after splitting a pair of games on the road. They upset defending national champion Missouri Southern before dropping a close match-up with Northwestern Oklahoma.

Guiding the offensive attack is quarterback Bruce Hawley with tailback Steve Crosby handling most of the rushing.

Defensively, the front line of Rod Lungren, Lew Kasselman and Mark Hines will try to stop the Antelopes with help from linebackers J. D. Armstrong and Chris Cullen. Senior Jonathan Douglas leads the mobile secondary when the Tigers are on defense.

Looking at both teams' games so far, the result of tonight's contest will be highly unpredictable. Both squads have an offense that can blow the game wide open or a defense that can shut off the scoring.

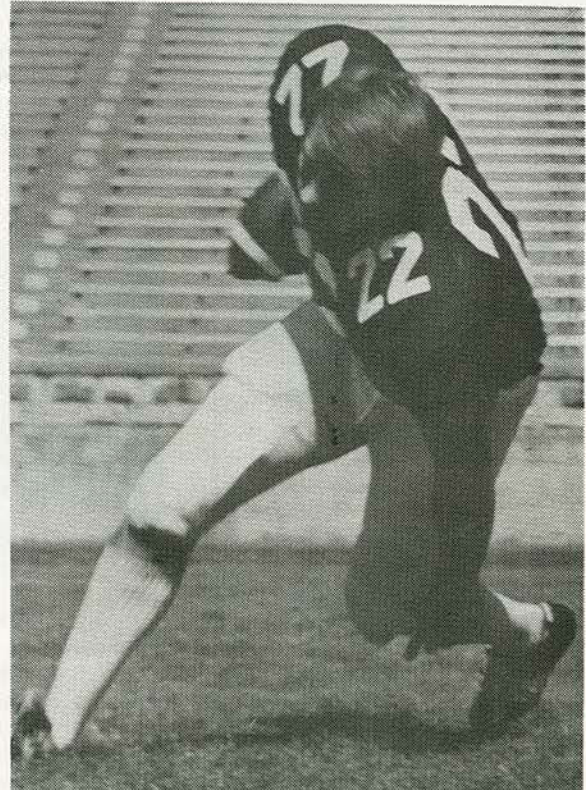

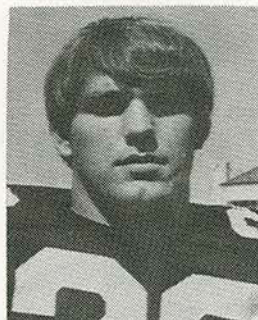
All-America Candidates

Competing for All-America honors on the Fort Hays State football team this year are four senior players, all Kansas natives.

Each of the four has demonstrated the willingness and ability to set an example for their teammates by doing their job, especially when it counts the most. As experienced performers, they have given the team the essential leadership it needs on both offense and defense.

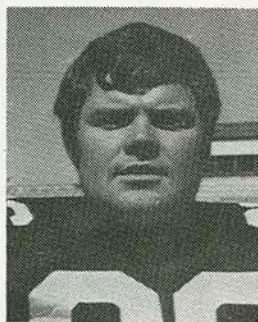
A trait of a winning ball club is having the players who can make the big play in the pressure situations, and Fort Hays State can rely on its veterans to never throw in the towel when things are looking bad.

A strong desire to compete and excel is a driving force in the making of an All-America player. The love for the game held by these outstanding athletes is contagious and is easily spread to their fellow players on the team.



Steve Crosby, TB, 6-1, 210, Pawnee Rock — As Fort Hays State's top rusher during the 1972 campaign, Steve returns to an experienced backfield to lead the Tigers to a winning season. With good moves to both the inside and around end, the NAIA all-District 10 is a key factor in the Tiger ground game this year. "Steve has great balance and runs with the power to make him a top contender for All-America honors," says Head Coach Bill Giles. "With his speed, quickness and leadership ability, he is the best running back FHS has seen for a long time."

Bruce Hawley, QB, 6-3, 175, 20, Phillipsburg — A three-year letterman for the Tigers, Bruce returns with that competitive spirit that last year enabled him to win the passing and total offense titles in the Great Plains Athletic Conference. Having good speed, he throws well from either the drop-back position or the sprint-out pass position with a high percentage of accuracy. "We feel Bruce is the best option quarterback in the conference," states Giles. "We have the confidence that he will be a true leader as the season progresses."



Lewis Kasselmann, DT, 6-0, 230, 25, Ellinwood — "Lew is our strongest defensive lineman," says Giles. And strong he must be to anchor a defensive wall that sees a veteran corps of linemen return to the FHS squad. Originally slated to play at the noseguard position, Kasselmann was moved outside to utilize the strength and quickness he had built up through a summer weightlifting program. "Lew reads the plays and reacts so quickly to the ball that he is taking pressure off other positions on the squad," added Giles.

J. D. Armstrong, LB, 6-1, 230, 23, Liberal — Strong, quick, and aggressive are just the terms needed to describe this two-year veteran of the Tiger line-backing corps. With quickness as the key to his success, Armstrong has shown great improvement over the 1972 season and is the 1973 defensive signal-caller for the Tigers. "J. D. is our strongest individual on the defensive squad," says Giles. "We feel he is the toughest tackler on the squad and the best linebacker in the GPAC."

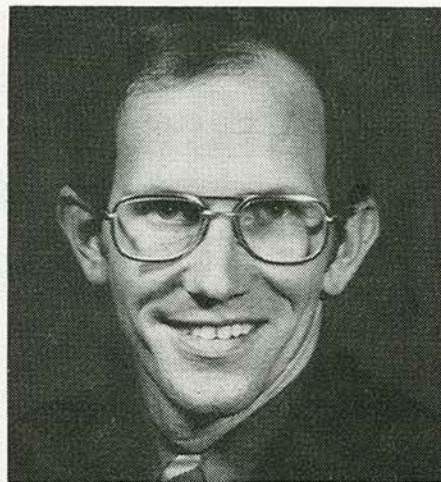

FHS Dedicates Sports Complex

"A dream becomes reality" would best describe the feeling at ceremonies held today for the Paul B. Gross Memorial Coliseum and M. C. Cunningham Hall.

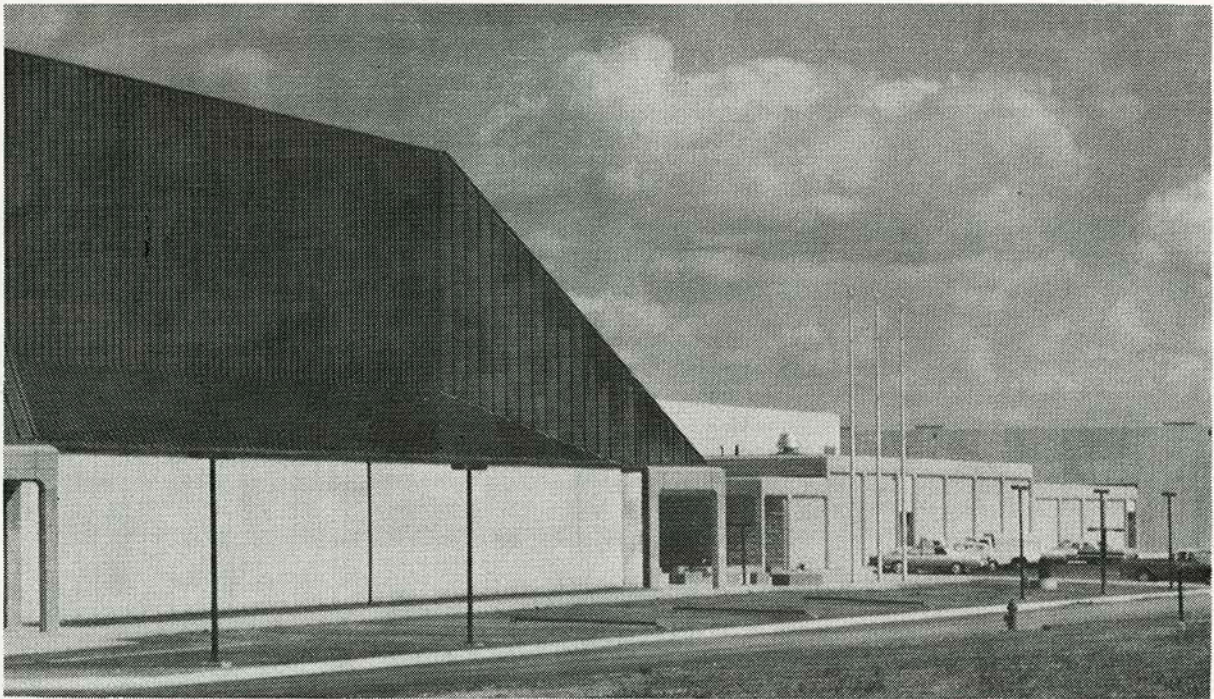
In the planning and construction stage for over five years, the sports complex will house some of the finest facilities in the Midwest. Highlighting the multi-purpose building is the 7,000 seat Paul B. Gross Memorial Coliseum. Easily accessible from all areas of the complex, the seating capacity can be enlarged to 9,000 for college programs and for entertainment facilities, such as homecoming and spring concerts.

An added feature to the new coliseum will be the indoor track, a great help in the conditioning process of all Fort Hays State varsity athletes during the winter months. In conjunction with the training aspect of athletics at FHS, a completely equipped trainer's room, located in the south part of the coliseum, will always be ready to care for the injured athletes.

Housing the Health, Physical Education and Recreation Department, M. C. Cunningham Hall will offer many opportunities to the student. Handball courts, gymnasiums, and dance rooms barely begin to name the areas available for Fort Hays State students to enjoy, either in intramurals or just for their own enjoyment.

Probably the most frequently used in the HPER side of the complex will be the NCAA-size swimming pool. The pool, with two specific areas, one for diving and the other for freestyle swimming, has attracted many students into swimming classes as well as the general public for the weekly family night.

Putting all these facilities together — the coliseum, the new office and classroom space, the gymnasiums, handball courts, dance rooms and the swimming pool, just to name a few — Fort Hays State and the surrounding area have a sports complex that can be labeled "sports center of the Midwest."

Dan Rupp Explains Duties

"There is a lot more to college athletics than what goes on during a game," says Dan Rupp, Fort Hays State's faculty representative to the Great Plains Athletic Conference.

Among the duties of a faculty representative, according to Rupp, are keeping records on each athlete to make sure he is making steady progress toward a degree and to make certain each athlete is eligible for competition.

"I have a record on every athlete in the varsity sports played at Fort Hays State," Rupp explained. "I have to complete all the forms required and send them in to the GPAC commissioner and the NAIA District 10 eligibility chairman."



Conference faculty representatives have an annual meeting at the league office in Denver. In their meeting, they work on mutual problems and look at rules that may need revising or updating. Their recommendations are sent to the conference athletic directors and the commissioner.

"I feel it is an extremely challenging position with a great amount of responsibility to the athletic program," said Rupp. "I have to look at all new developments in rules and work with the coaches on the changes. It is my responsibility to tell the coach about an ineligible player, and I am responsible if the team uses an ineligible player."

Rupp is in his fourth year as the Tigers' representative and he comes well suited for the job. He is a graduate of Benedictine College and participated in basketball there for four years. He was twice named all-conference in the old CIC and was honorable mention all-America one year.

Besides his conference duties, he is also a member of the FHS Faculty Athletic Assn. and the District 10 Eligibility Committee.

"One of the most interesting things I have learned in my job," Rupp commented, "is that the academic requirements for athletes are more difficult than the average college student."

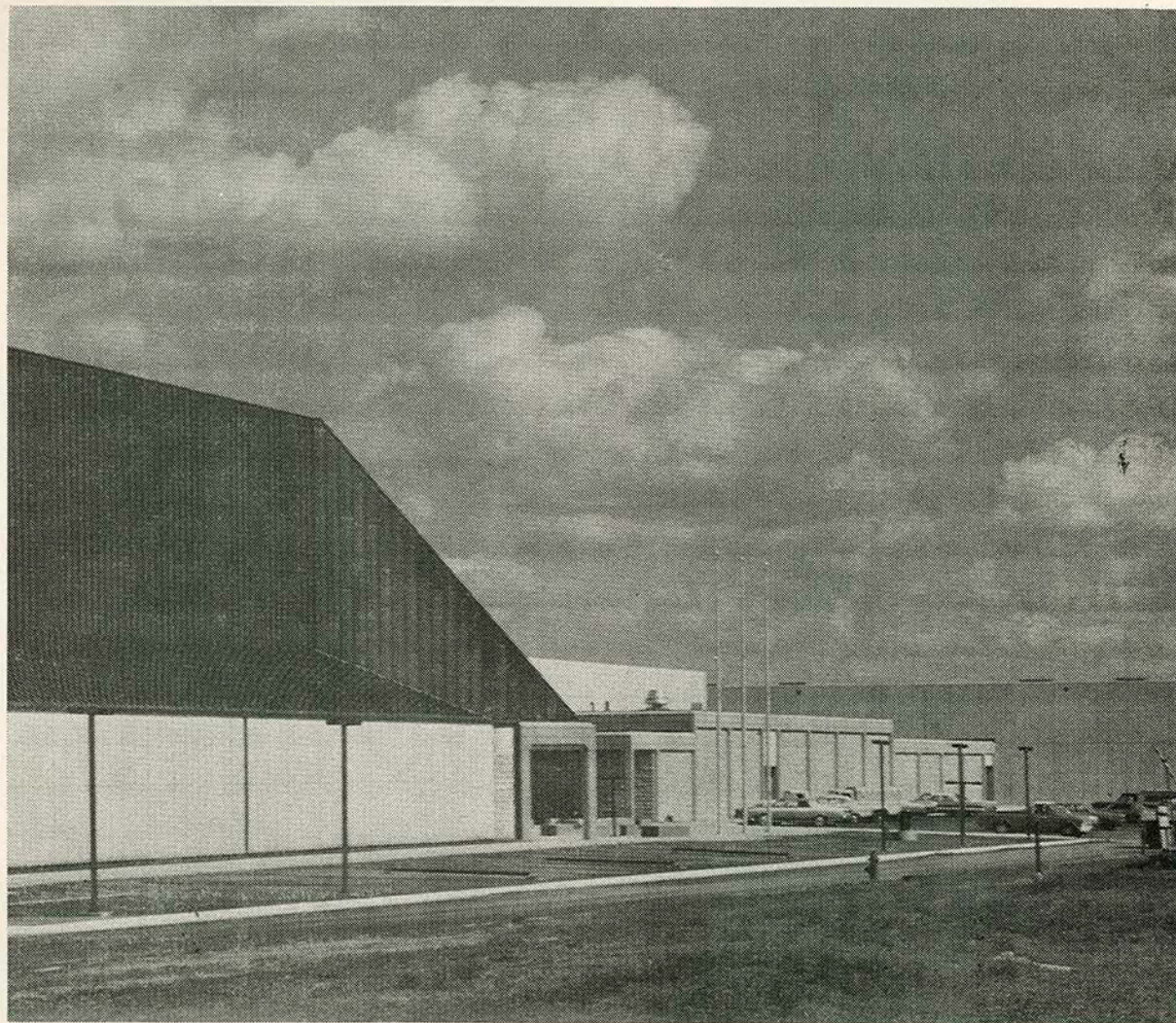

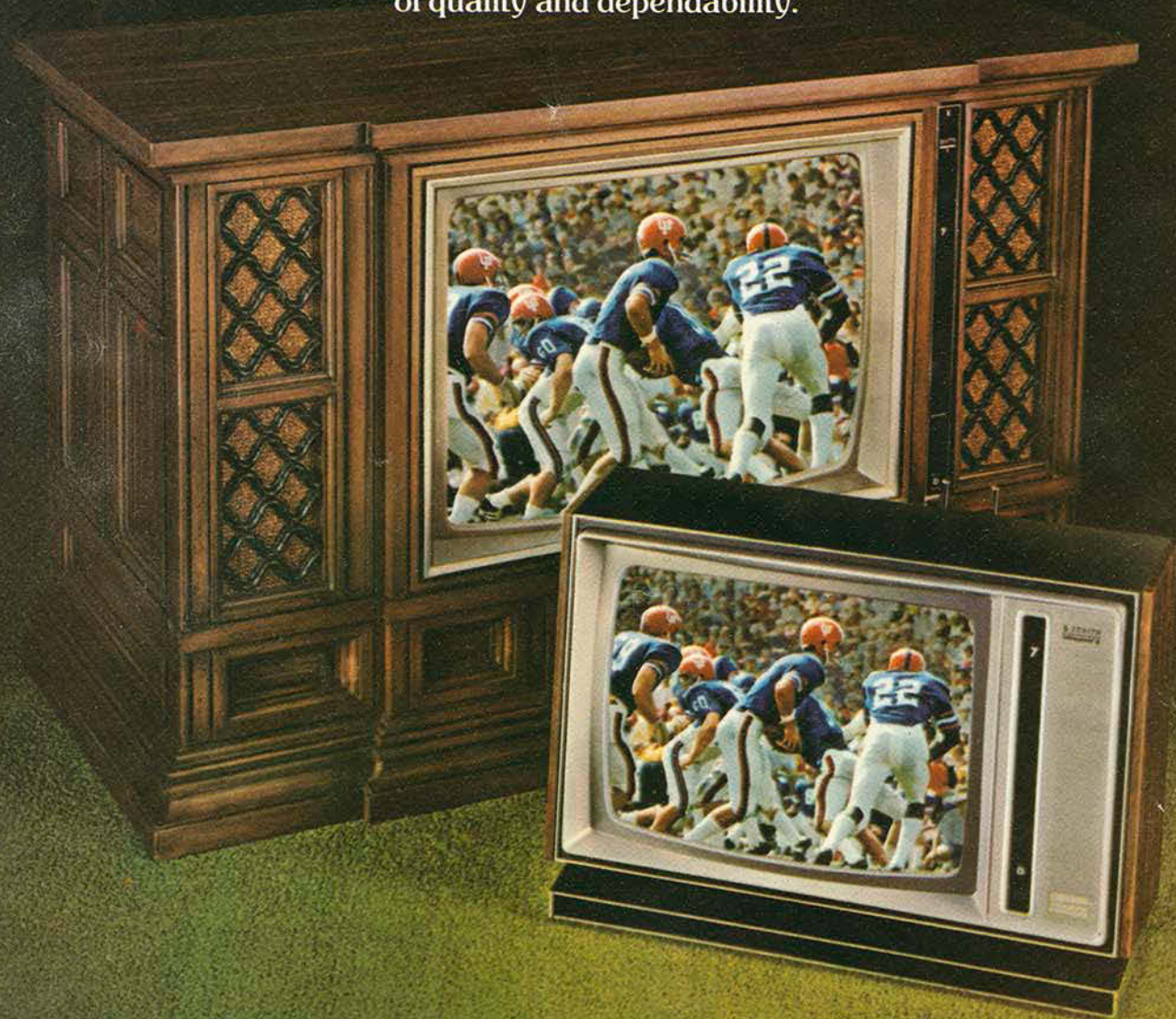
