(At the close of the Commencement Address the President of the College will say something to this effect):

PRESIDENT WOOSTER WILL SAY:

"We have now come to the hour for the conferring of degrees and the presentation of diplomas..... It is the function of the College..... A degree granted by the College means.....

"I now call upon the Dean of the College for a report of degrees to be conferred and diplomas to be granted."

DEAN McCARTNEY WILL SAY:

"Mr. President, we take pleasure at this time in reporting that 30 candidates for the Bachelor's degree and 12 candidates for the Master's degree have completed all courses and requirements and are therefore eligible to have appropriate degrees conferred upon them and to receive diplomas as documentary evidence of their accomplishments.

"Mr. President, it may be of interest to say that the summer commencement is a part of the closing activities of the school year of 1941-1942. The candidates who receive degrees tonight are a part of this year's class. (When the exercises are completed this evening it will mean that we will have conferred 130 bachelors degrees and 16 masters degrees in 1941-1942.) Especially in our summer sessions one of the primary functions of the College is the preparation of teachers. Many of the candidates here tonight have done a large part of their college work in summer sessions. These graduation exercises for them are, therefore, the culmination of years of steadfastness of purpose and courage.

"Mr. President, as Dean of the Undergraduate Divisions of the College, I have the pleasure and privilege of presenting 30 candidates who have completed all the requirements for the bachelor's degree."

(bachelor candidates will stand):

DEAN McDARTNEY WILL SAY:

"Mr. President, I present these candidates."

PRESIDENT WOOSTER WILL SAY:

"I hereby confer upon each of you..... The candidates will now come to the platform and receive their diplomas at the hands of Mr. Oscar S. Stauffer, representing the state Board of Regents."

(Mr. Wilson will announce the names of the candidates as they cross the platform to receive their diplomas).

PRESIDENT WOOSTER WILL SAY:

"Professor Albertson, Chairman of the Graduate Division, will present those who have completed their work for the Master's Degree."

MR. ALBERTSON WILL SAY:

"Mr. President, as Chairman of the Graduate Division, I have the pleasure and privilege of presenting 12 candidates who have completed the requirements for the Master's Degree."

(Master candidates will stand).

MR. ALBERTSON WILL SAY:

"Mr. President, I present these candidates."

PRESIDENT WOOSTER WILL SAY:

"Through the authority vested in me by the State of Kansas and the Board of Regents, I hereby confer upon each of you the Master's Degree, with all the rights and privileges pertaining thereto. The candidates will now come to the platform where they will be invested with master's hoods, and will receive their diplomas at the hands of Mr. Stauffer, representing the State Board of Regents."
