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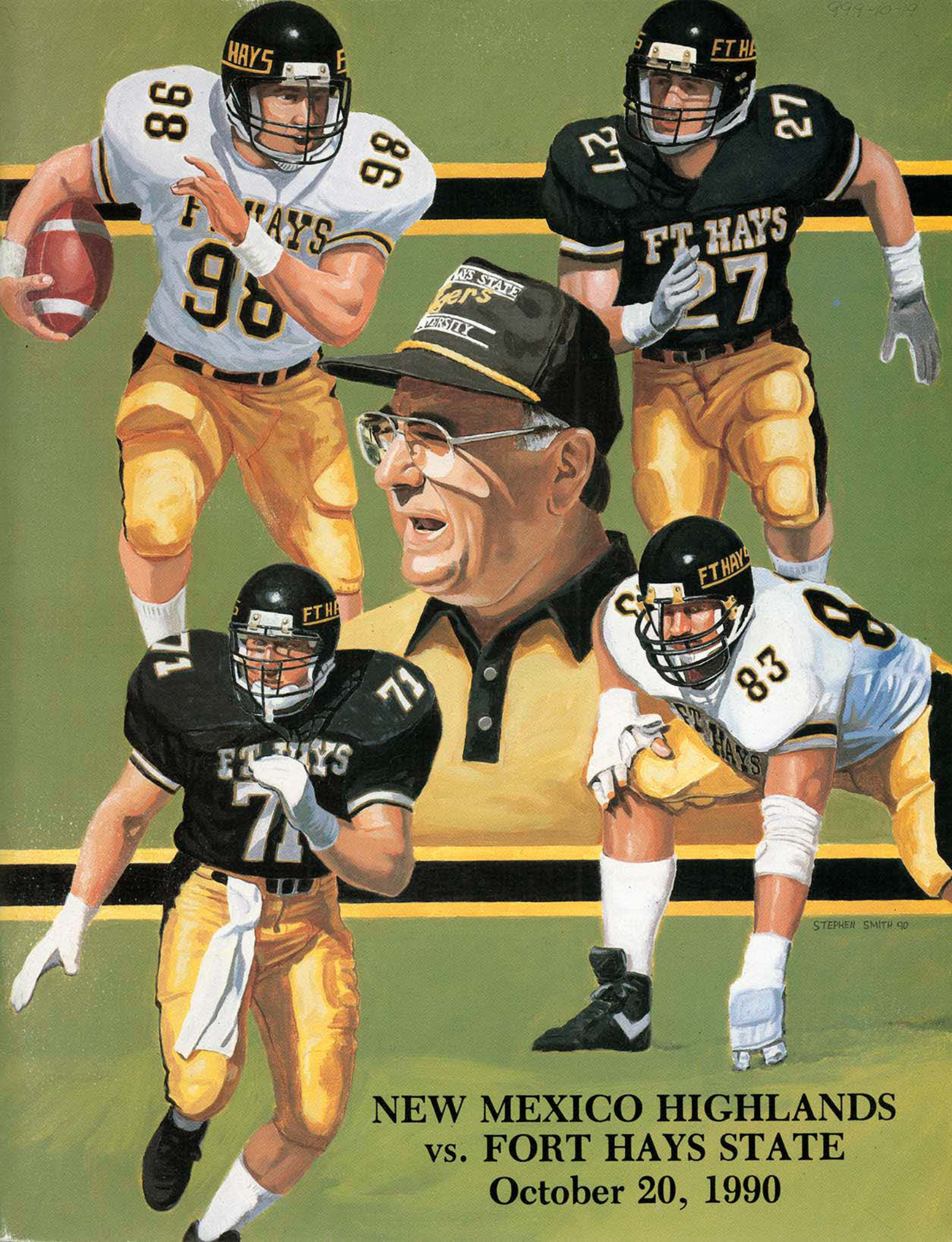
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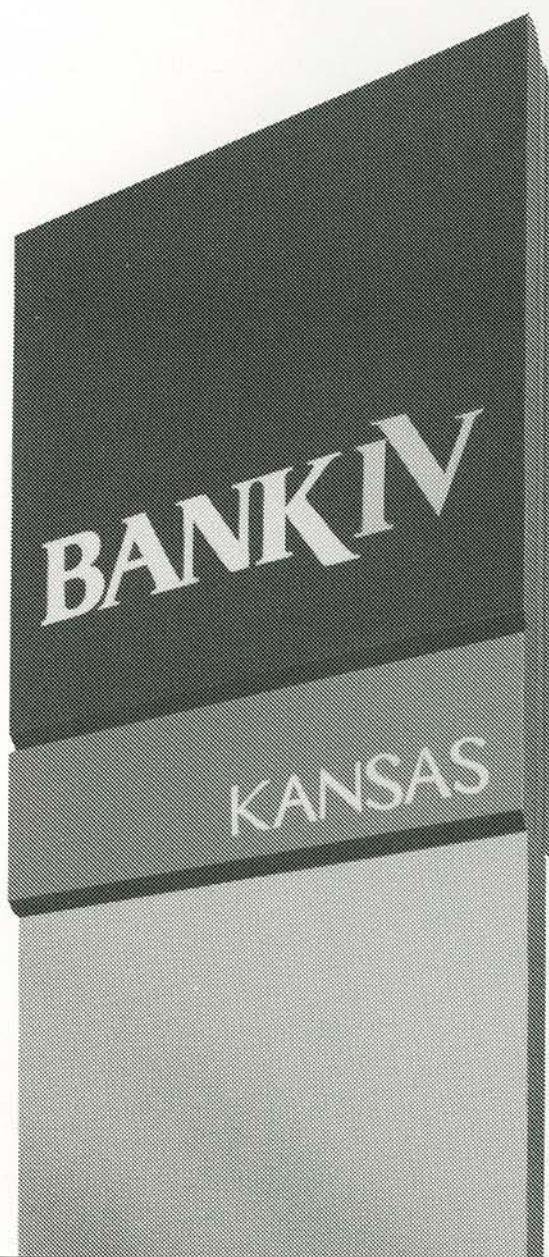

THE WEEK IN SPORTS

FOOTBALL... The #8 ranked Tigers have a tough road ahead of them with all but today's final home game on the road. FHSU has Wayne State (NE), Kearney State (NE), and Panhandle State (OK) remaining after today's meeting with New Mexico Highlands University.

The Cowboys enter the game today with a 2-5-0 mark while the Tigers come in at 5-2-0. NMHU has many offensive weapons and should be an entertaining team to watch in today's matchup.

CROSS COUNTRY... Fort Hays State hosted the Tiger Invitational cross country meet this morning and should have fared well. The men have ran very well this season and have a good chance to win the District 10 Championship.

The Tiger women have fielded a full squad only a few times this season as the injury bug has bothered their performance all season.

VOLLEYBALL... The Lady Tiger are also at home this weekend with Round II of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference league play taking place at Gross Memorial Coliseum. FHSU played three matches yesterday and have two more scheduled for today.

The Lady Tigers won only one of six matches in the first round of RMAC play and must play well this weekend to place in the upper half of the conference.

FORT HAYS STATE vs. NEW MEXICO HIGHLANDS

THE GAME TODAY

THE MATCHUP: Fort Hays State will play its final regular season home game of the 1990 campaign against New Mexico Highlands University of Las Vegas, NM. The Tigers enter the contest with a 5-2 record and the Cowboys come in at 2-5 on the season.

FHSU moved up five notches in the NAIA Top 20 coaches poll to the number eight spot. The Tigers were #13 a week ago and have been ranked as high as seventh this season. (See the box on this page to see how FHSU has been ranked week-by-week)

The Black & Gold is coming off a huge win over intrastate rival Emporia State last week by a 11-8 score. Both squads entered the contest with 4-2 marks and the Tiger defense held down the vaunted running attack of the Hornets to gain FHSU's fifth win of the season.

The Tiger offense performed well enough against Emporia State to register 11 points and keep the FHSU defensive unit off of the field, especially in the third period. Senior quarterback Bryan Maring made his first start since the Adams State game on Sept. 22. Maring led the Black & Gold back from a 21-0 halftime deficit against Adams State, but injured a knee in the contest that kept him out of the Fort Lewis game and limited his playing time against Northeastern State (OK).

Today marks the final time 13 Tiger seniors will play at Lewis Field Stadium. The FHSU seniors are: #3 Rick Masters, #9 Bryan Maring, #24 Kurt Dinkel, #27 Mike Allen, #30 Kenny Crandall, #51 Brian Stindt, #55 Andy Adkins, #58 Matt Raasch, #61 Alan Banks, #68 Kevin Weber, #72 Greg Yost, #97 Doug Holthaus, #99 Frank Brown. The Cowboys of New Mexico Highlands enter today's game without several of their key players and have lost their last two times out. New Mexico

Highlands lost last week at Kearney State when the Antelopes scored with :46 left in the game for a 28-21 win. The Cowboys abandoned their powerful passing game against Kearney State because of the loss of their second quarterback, Russ Bailey, with a broken jaw. NMHU lost All-Americ candidate Gabby Lujan during the fourth game of the season against Eastern New Mexico. Lujan is out for the remainder of the year with a broken collarbone. Receiver Kelvin McLeod, a freshman from Albuquerque, NM, stepped in to perform admirably against Kearney State. The quarterback situation for the Cowboys is up in the air coming into today's game with

Bailey a possibility and McLeod listed as the probable starter.

New Mexico Highlands has another pair of offensive weapons that are healthy and will pose problems for FHSU. Split end Carl Bruere is one of the top pass catchers in the NAIA with 55 receptions for 902 yards and seven touchdowns. Tailback Shawn Malone, a sophomore from Nashville, TN, has also produced with 104 carries for 461 yards and eight scores.

THE COACHES: Bob Cortese now stands 5-2-0 in his career at Fort Hays State and can assure the program its first winning season since 1985 with a win today. Now in his 11th season overall as a collegiate head coach, Cortese has compiled a 89-23-3 overall record. He

had a .784 winning percentage in ten seasons at Mesa State College in Colorado. Cortese ranks second on the NAIA's list of winningest active coaches. He is a former Buffalo football letterman and 1967 graduate of the University of Colorado-Boulder.

George Martinez is in his second season at New Mexico Highlands University and has compiled a record of 6-11-0 at the school. He also coached one season at Panhandle State University in Goodwell, OK where he went 1-7-0. Martinez is a 1973 graduate of Northwestern Oklahoma State University.

THE SERIES: Fort Hays State will meet New Mexico Highlands for only the second time on the gridiron today. The Cowboys pulled out a 36-35 win a thriller last year at Las Vegas. NMHU is an NAIA independent, the Tigers are also classified that way by the NAIA, and are making a move to reenter the Rocky Mountain Athletic Association.

LAST YEAR: The Tigers jumped out to a 28-0 lead early in the second period, but the Cowboys came roaring back with 14 second quarter and 22 fourth period points to grab the win, 36-35.

New Mexico Highlands completed the comeback when Tim Ellison scored on a one yard run with :22 showing on the scoreboard clock.

FHSU compiled 469 yards in total offense including 202 yards rushing by quarterback Milt McGriggs. Linebacker Mike Allen was credited with 15 tackles against the Cowboys a year ago.

Dr. Edward H. Hammond - President



Dr. Edward H. Hammond, 46, is the eighth President of Fort Hays State University. A man of boundless enthusiasm and energy, whose style is upbeat and progressive, President Hammond was born in McAllen, Texas, but reared in the Kansas City, Kansas, area.

Prior to his current post, President Hammond gained education experiences and shared his expertise

at the University of Louisville, Seton Hall University, Southern Illinois University, Purdue University, and the University of Missouri-Columbia. The President holds a bachelor's and master's degree from Emporia State University and the Ph.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

President Hammond has been extremely active since assuming the leadership of the University in the summer of 1987. He laid the groundwork for the Western Kansas Educational Compact, a cooperative educational initiative between FHSU and the community colleges in Western Kansas; is watching his dream to totally computerize the campus quickly become reality; created a Western Kansas Coalition, an organization comprised of business and community leaders from 57

Western Kansas counties; helped to establish scholarship programs for potential minority school teachers at Garden City and Liberal; has played a major role in the furthering economic development in Hays and Western Kansas; and recently introduced a voice mail system that will vault the foreign language efforts of FHSU into the an elite class.

President Hammond has published widely and is in demand nationally as an education consultant because of his expertise in risk management, staff and institutional liability, sexual harassment, and alcohol education issues.

The Hammond family includes wife Viv (Hammeke), formerly of Ellinwood, daughters Kelly and Julie and son Lance.

Tom Spicer - Director of Athletics



When Tom Spicer was named to the director of athletics post at Fort Hays State University on July 27, 1989, he said it was something he had dreamed about for quite some time. Spicer is starting his second year as director of athletics and has emphasized a return to athletic and academic excellence.

A native of Beaver, OK, Spicer

attended secondary schools in Hays. He is a graduate of Hays High School and earned a bachelor of science degree from Fort Hays State in 1972. He played varsity football for the Tigers in his collegiate days. Spicer also received his master of science degree from FHSU in 1977. He is completing a specialist in education degree with work at both Southeastern Oklahoma State University and The Wichita State University.

Spicer made the move from director of athletics and dean of student affairs at Buter County Community College in El Dorado back to FHSU. "I look at this as a good, professional move," Spicer said at the announcement of his appointment at FHSU. "I will have an excellent opportunity to share my knowledge and experiences and will gain some new experiences

at a quality, four-year institution. Everyone in the midwest knows that Fort Hays State University is a great school."

The 39-year-old Spicer also has experience as director of athletics, physical education instructor, head football and track coach for the Durant, OK, School District. Previous to his work in Oklahoma, he taught and coached at Salina South High School, at Bishop Miege High School in Shawnee Mission and at Schlagle High School in Kansas City, KS.

Spicer is married to the former Kathy McGovern of Garden City. She received a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Fort Hays State in 1972. The Spicers have four children: Mathew (15), Amber (12), Kristen (10) and Allison (8).

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Bob Cortese Head Coach



A proven winner. That is how Bob Cortese is perceived in collegiate coaching circles. Cortese brings with him a background of success at the collegiate level.

Cortese was named the 18th head football coach in Fort Hays State history, December 29, 1989, after 10 years as head coach at Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colorado. The Mavericks landed six NAIA playoff berths while establishing an 84-22-3 record with Cortese as its head coach. Mesa State had records of 2-8 and 1-8, respectively, the two seasons prior to Cortese's appointment as head coach. He only had one losing season, 3-6 in his first year, with the Mavericks and never lost more than three games in any season after his first year.

The 47-year-old Rochester, N.Y. native ranks second among the NAIA's winningest active coaches prior to the start of this season with a percentage of .784. He has taken a team to the NAIA playoffs six of the last eight seasons.

"Bob Cortese brings proven leadership and quality to the Fort Hays State football program, but also will provide an exciting brand of football and expectations of winning with integrity and academics as a base," FHSU director of athletics Tom Spicer said.

Along with success comes honors, Cortese was named the NAIA District 7 Coach of the Year six times. He also was a runner-up for NAIA National Coach of the Year honors in 1982 & 1983.

As a collegiate athlete, Cortese excelled on the football field at Northeastern Junior College in Sterling, CO, where he earned J.C. Grid-Wire and UPI All-America honors in 1962. He went on to spend two successful seasons with the University of Colorado. He earned a bachelor of science degree from Colorado in 1967 with a major in physical education. He completed work on a master's degree in curriculum and instruction with an emphasis in vocational education at the University of Northern Colorado in 1973.

After his playing days at the University of Colorado, Cortese spent two seasons as a graduate assistant in the program and later returned to the program under both Bill Mallory and Chuck Fairbanks as a full time assistant.

Cortese was a prep coach in Colorado at Lakewood High School (1979-80), Arvada Senior High School (1974-77), Highland High School (1971-74), and St. Joseph High School (1969-71). His coaching mark at all levels is an impressive 174-49-4 in 21 seasons.

Cortese is married. His wife's name is Toni. Bob has two sons, Jim and Jeff, and Toni has two daughters, Michelle and Andrea.

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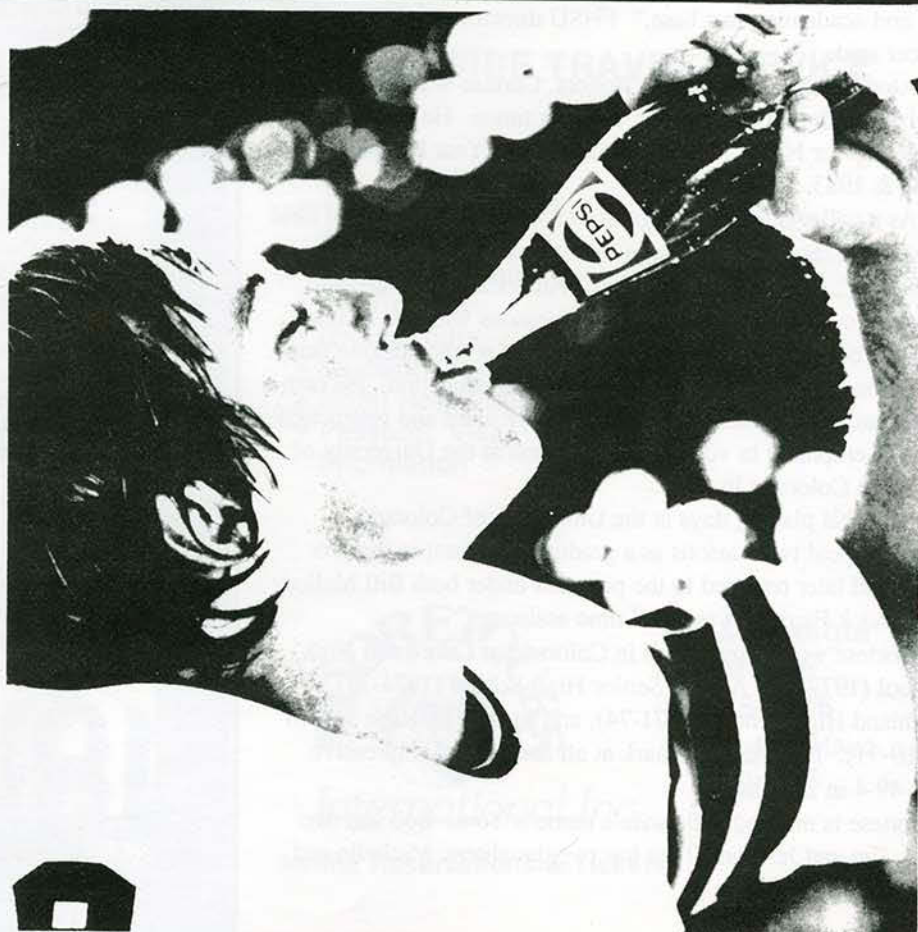

Defensive Coordinator

Jay Hood begins his first season at Fort Hays State with responsibilities as defensive coordinator, secondary coach and recruiting coordinator. Hood brings vitality and enthusiasm to the Tiger defense.

Hood held similar position at Mesa State College as an assistant to Bob Cortese in a successful program since 1988. He was instrumental in the defensive performance of Maverick squads that put together 9-2 and 9-1 seasons, respectively.

Hood got his coaching start as a graduate assistant at Bowling Green State University from 1986-88. His duties with the Falcons included special teams, defensive secondary, film breakdown, special teams scouting report, production of off-season training films, on-campus recruiting and physical conditioning program.

A 1986 graduate of Ohio Wesleyan University with a bachelor of arts degree, Hood was a four-year starter at quarterback as a collegiate athlete. He earned all-conference honors all four seasons and was a team captain three years. Hood completed a master of education with an emphasis in athletic administration from Bowling Green in 1987.

A native of Ada, Ohio, Hood, 27 (born September 5, 1963), married the former Lisa Burnham in June of this year.



Wayne Petterson
Linebackers

Wayne Petterson begins his ninth year as a member of the Fort Hays State athletic staff, but his initial year under first-year head coach Bob Cortese. Petterson is also the head wrestling coach for the Tigers.

With responsibilities on the defensive side with the linebackers, Petterson coaches football with the same intensity as he does his wrestlers. He has produced a good group of NAIA All-America wrestlers while heading the program.

Petterson is a 1982 graduate of Fort Hays State with a bachelor of science degree in physical education. He completed work on his master's degree, also in physical education at FHSU, in 1984.

The Beloit native, excelled as a wrestler with three NAIA All-America performances to his credit. He attended Graceland College in Lamoni, IA, as a freshman in college and earned All-America honors before transferring to Fort Hays State. Petterson was honored with the prestigious Busch Gross Award in 1982 which recognizes the top senior from the previous year at FHSU. He has wrestled and coached on the international level with trips that include the Orient.

Petterson, is married to the former Tammy Dewey.



Hal Rogers
Offensive Backfield

Hal Rogers enters the Fort Hays State program with a wealth of football experience as a head and assistant coach at the collegiate level. Rogers has primary duties as offensive backfield coach and academic coordinator.

Rogers was a part-time assistant at the University of Colorado in 1988. That season marked the debut of the I-bone in college football with the Buffaloes implementation of that offensive system.

The Colorado native was the head coach at Western State in Gunnison, CO, from 1985-87. Rogers started as a graduate assistant at WSC in 1981.

As a collegiate athlete, Rogers was named an outstanding freshman as a linebacker in 1972 while at Colorado School of Mines. Rogers transferred to the University of Utah for 1973-74 where he was a squad member, but later returned to his home state to play for Western State. While a Mountaineer, Rogers was a captain, all-RMAC pick, and a key member in leading the school to a third place national finish in 1976.

Rogers earned a bachelor's degree (1977) and a master's in physical education (1982) from Western State.

Rogers, 36 (born March 5, 1954), and his wife, Jane, have two children. Their son, Nathan, is 10, and daughter, Angela, is six.

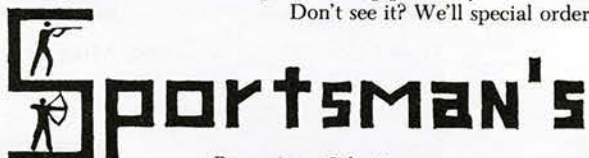


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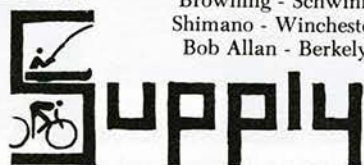
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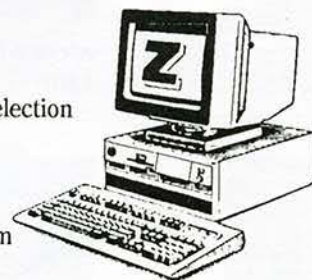


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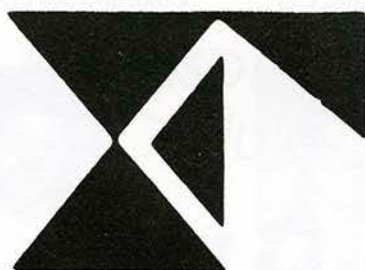


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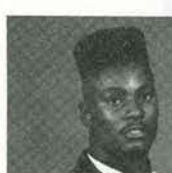
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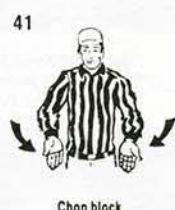
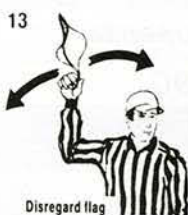
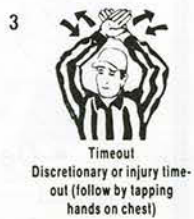
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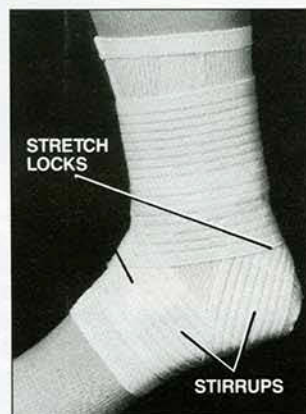
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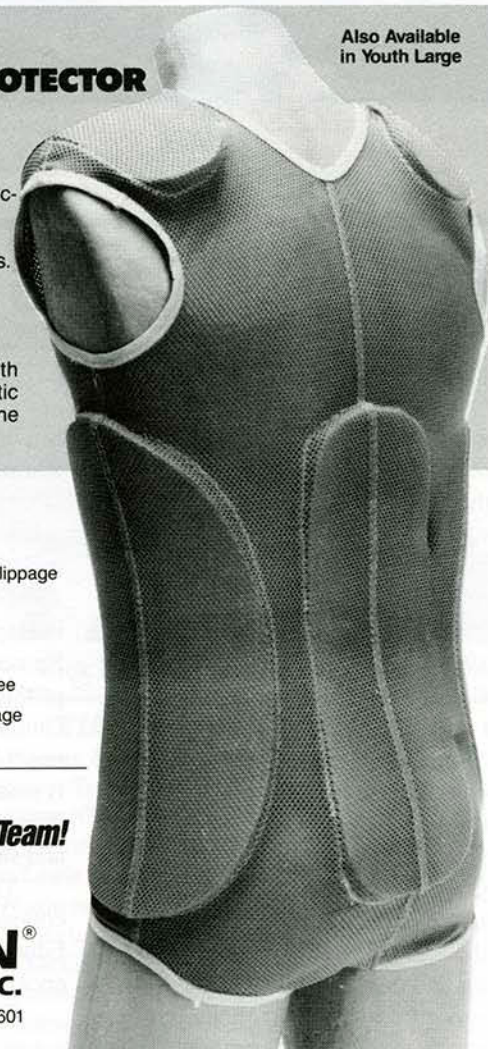
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From an exciting beginning, when 34 students were greeted by two faculty members and a 19-course curriculum, our University has grown to a student body of 5,200, a faculty of nearly 300, a support staff of 250 and a curriculum comprised of 1,500 courses.

Fort Hays State University is one of seven state-assisted universities governed by a Board of Regents appointed by the Governor of the State of Kansas.

The main campus of FHSU sits on 200 of the 4,160 acres owned by the state of Kansas and deeded to the University. Winding Big Creek, with its shady, grassy banks, traverses the campus and

provides not only a tranquil, conducive learning atmosphere, but also a natural laboratory for students in the biological sciences. Our campus has often been called the prettiest in Kansas.

Fort Hays State University is located in Hays, the largest city in northwest Kansas. A progressive city of 17,500 people, Hays is an old cow town on the Union Pacific railroad. The old and the new blend beautifully to form a city that is small enough you can feel comfortable in, yet is large enough to provide culture and shopping facilities second to none.

The University is comprised of four colleges: Arts and Sciences, Business, Education, and Health and Life Sciences, and a Graduate School.

FHSU is academically superior to many comparable universities and is

richly endowed by heritage and tradition. A recent survey of our students showed that while there are a multitude of reasons why students come to our University, their overwhelming response was "because of the University's reputation for academic excellence."

Fort Hays State University supports one of the most extensive intercollegiate sports programs of any comparable size college or university in America. More than 350 athletes annually compete in seven men's and five women's sports. Fort Hays State University recently joined the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, but will not compete for the football championship in the conference in 1990. The RMAC is comprised of schools from the states of Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska and New Mexico.

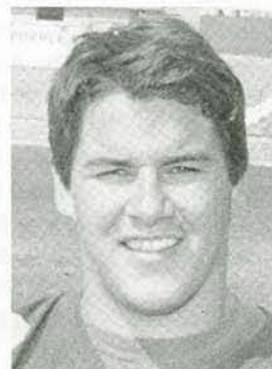

LEWIS FIELD STADIUM

Lewis Field Stadium, the 7,000-seat home of the Tigers was constructed in 1936 on what was formerly the Golden Belt Fairgrounds, and was named in honor of William Alexander Lewis, president of Fort Hays State University from 1913 to 1933.

The native limestone structure is located beside a spacious tree-lined drive and is just a short walk from the campus residence halls and the downtown business district.

The stadium turf is Bermuda grass, the same strong-rooted plant used in many golf course greens. Dressing rooms, concession areas, athletic training facilities, and equipment storage rooms are located under the grandstands. New restroom facilities were completed before the 1986 season replacing older outdated ones. The newest remodeling was recently finished on the home lockerroom. An overhaul of the former lockerroom was completed just before fall practices with a synthetic floor, a false ceiling and new paint providing a entirely different atmosphere. A state-of-the-art stereo system was also installed.

Admittance to the stadium is allowed through two main gates, one on the east side and one on the west side. Four ticket win-



dows are in service for each game.

Atop both grandstands are press box facilities which provide seating for writers, statisticians, radio stations, scouts, and film/video crews. The home coaches box and all film/video crews are located on the west side.

The east side is made available for all press,

radio, Fort Hays State sports information, visiting information personnel, public address, scoreboard operations and a private box for the president of the university and guests. An eight-lane, cinder track surrounds the playing field and adjacent to the stadium are regulation size practice facilities.

Mike earned preseason All-America recognition this year and has lived up to that billing with a team high 81 tackles in seven games. He is the career interception leader at FHSU with 13. Mike was an All-CSIC, All-District 10 and honorable mention NAIA All-America

pick last season in addition to his preseason selection by *College Football Preview* magazine.

#30 Kenny Crandall, SE, Longmont, CO
Kenny has worked hard to earn a starting berth his senior season and does all of the little things well. He made a spectacular catch against Kearney State a year ago which proved to be the winning touchdown. Kenny has eight catches for 121 yards this year and has started all seven contests.

#51 Brian Stindt, LB/NG, Belleville, KS
Brian has proven to be one of the Tigers most versatile players this season. He had played all of his career at the linebacker spot until this season when he has seen the majority of his playing time at nose guard. Brian has 25 total tackles to his credit this season.

#55 Andy Adkins, DE, Bonner Springs, KS
Andy is quite a force on the defensive front and has contributed with many timely quarterback sacks in his two-year career at FHSU. He has six sacks this season and had 10 a year ago. Andy transferred to the Tiger program after a stint at Butler County CC. He was an honorable mention All-CSIC selection in 1989.

#58 Matt Raasch, OG, Galveston, TX
Matt has started all seven games this year and has proven valuable at protecting the quarterback and providing blocking for the Tiger running backs. Sat out most of last season with an injury after transferring from Blinn CC in Texas.

#61 Alan Banks, OG, Torrance, CA
Alan plays opposite of Raasch and has performed well also in the same role on the offensive line. He has 17 straight games going into today's contest. Alan came to FHSU after

a two-year stay at El Camino CC in California.

#68 Kevin Weber, NG, Ellis, KS
Kevin is an over-achiever and has proven his worth to the Tiger squad with hard work and determination. He earned considerable playing time last year with appearances in all 10 games. Kevin has been hampered by a knee injury this year, but still has 34 tackles. He earned a football scholarship after trying out for the squad as a walk-on in 1987.

#72 Greg Yost, DT, Gorham, KS
Greg is another outstanding player who will be missed when his career comes to a close. He is the Tigers' quarterback sack leader in '90 with eight and has 14 tackles for 67 yards in losses. Greg has started every game he has played in at FHSU and sat out much of his sophomore year with a knee injury. He was a first team All-CSIC pick last season and also was a walk-on when he entered the program.

#97 Doug Holthaus, LB, Beattie, KS
Doug has also made a switch during his career from defensive end to linebacker and the Tigers have benefitted from that move. As a middle linebacker this year, he calls the defensive signals and ranks third on the team in tackles with 69. Doug also gives the squad an emotional lift with his enthusiasm for the game.

#99 Frank Brown, DT, Cape May, NJ
Frank sat out last year, but his play didn't drop off a bit as he has been a standout performer for the Tigers this year. He loves to sack quarterbacks and his 20 career sacks are proof of that. Frank played one season of junior college ball in his home state before transferring to FHSU. He was an honorable mention All-CSIC pick in 1987.

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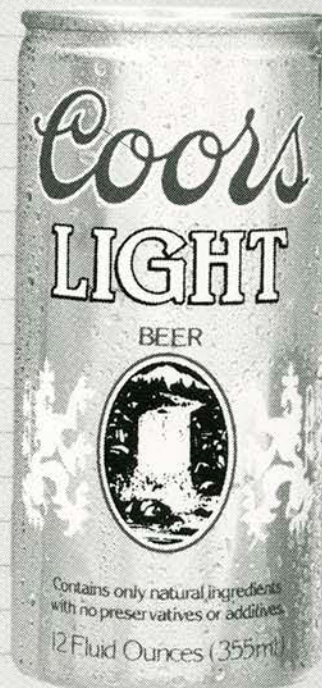
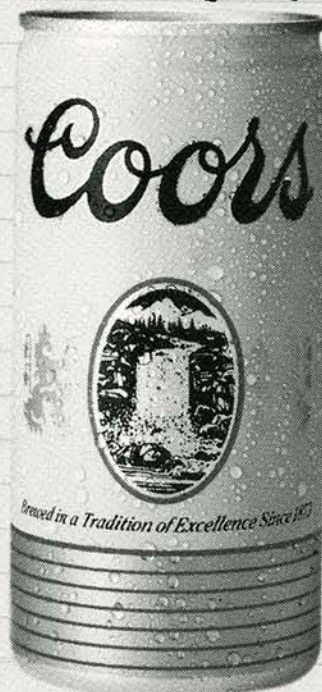
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
