FACULTY MEETING

December 18, 1934

Members absent: Mr. Albertson (out of town), Mr. Gross, Dr. Macgregor, Mr. Parker, Mr. Wiley, and Mr. Rouse

Dr. Rarick mentioned some matters of general interest affecting the group which had occurred since the last faculty meeting such as the death of Dr. Bartholomew, the winning of the Central Kansas Conference and the appointment of Dr. Morris on the Executive Council, South Central Group of American Health Association.

He mentioned the problem of the student employment under both state and federal funds and the need of cooperation of the faculty in carrying out this program.

He also made an announcement concerning graduate scholarships offered to this institution by the George Peabody College of Nashville, Tenn.

He discussed with the faculty the matter of student relations and the responsibility of the faculty to the program of the Dean's and Students Welfare Committee.

Committee assignments and functions were read and approved.

The matter of conservation of heat, light, and water and the economy of the entire program was discussed.

President Rarick mentioned the fact that he wished to hold regular faculty meetings following the holiday for the purpose of discussing reports and standards which are being required by the North Central Association.

Mr. Lee made an announcement regarding the credit and personality ratings reports which the faculty will be asked to prepare for students.
