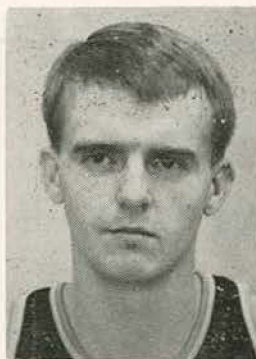


Cade Suran

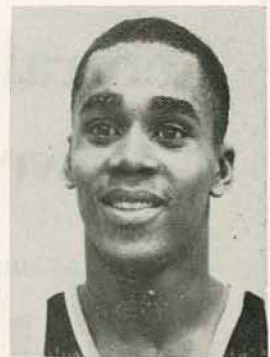

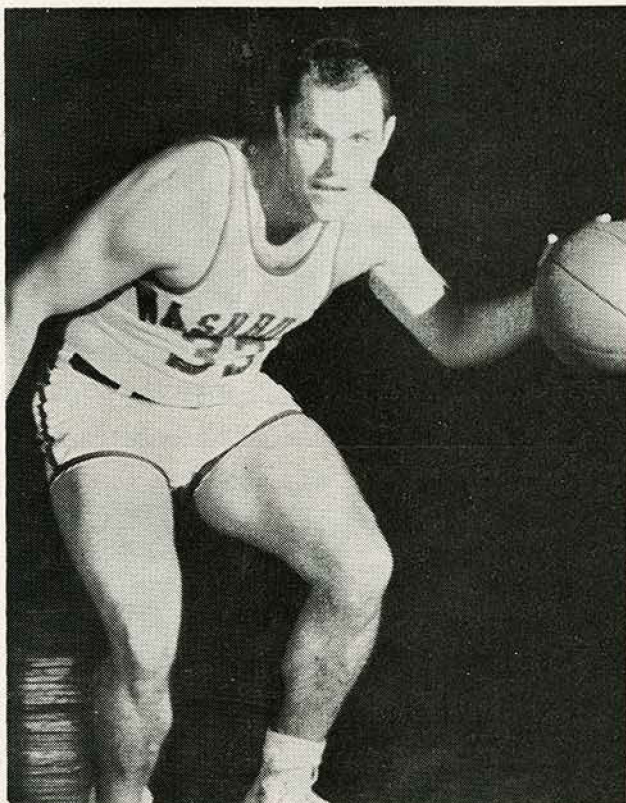

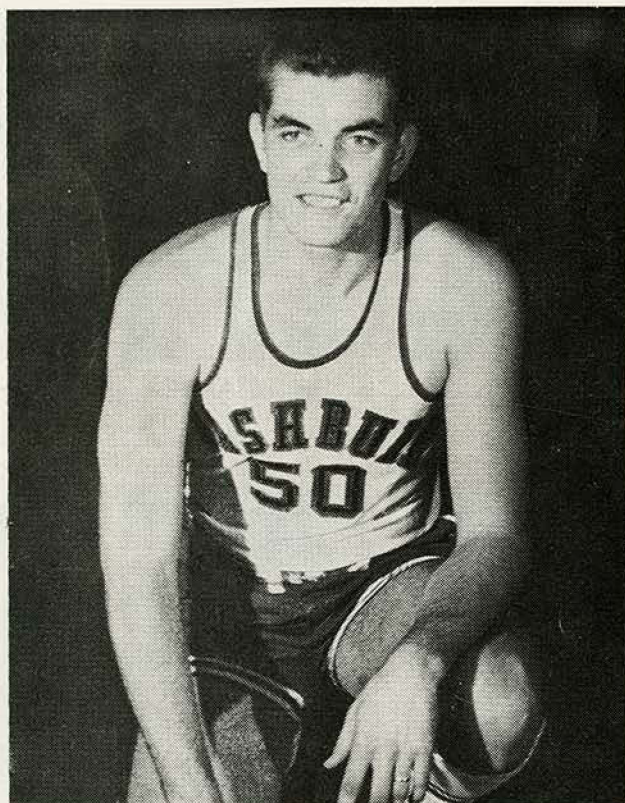
