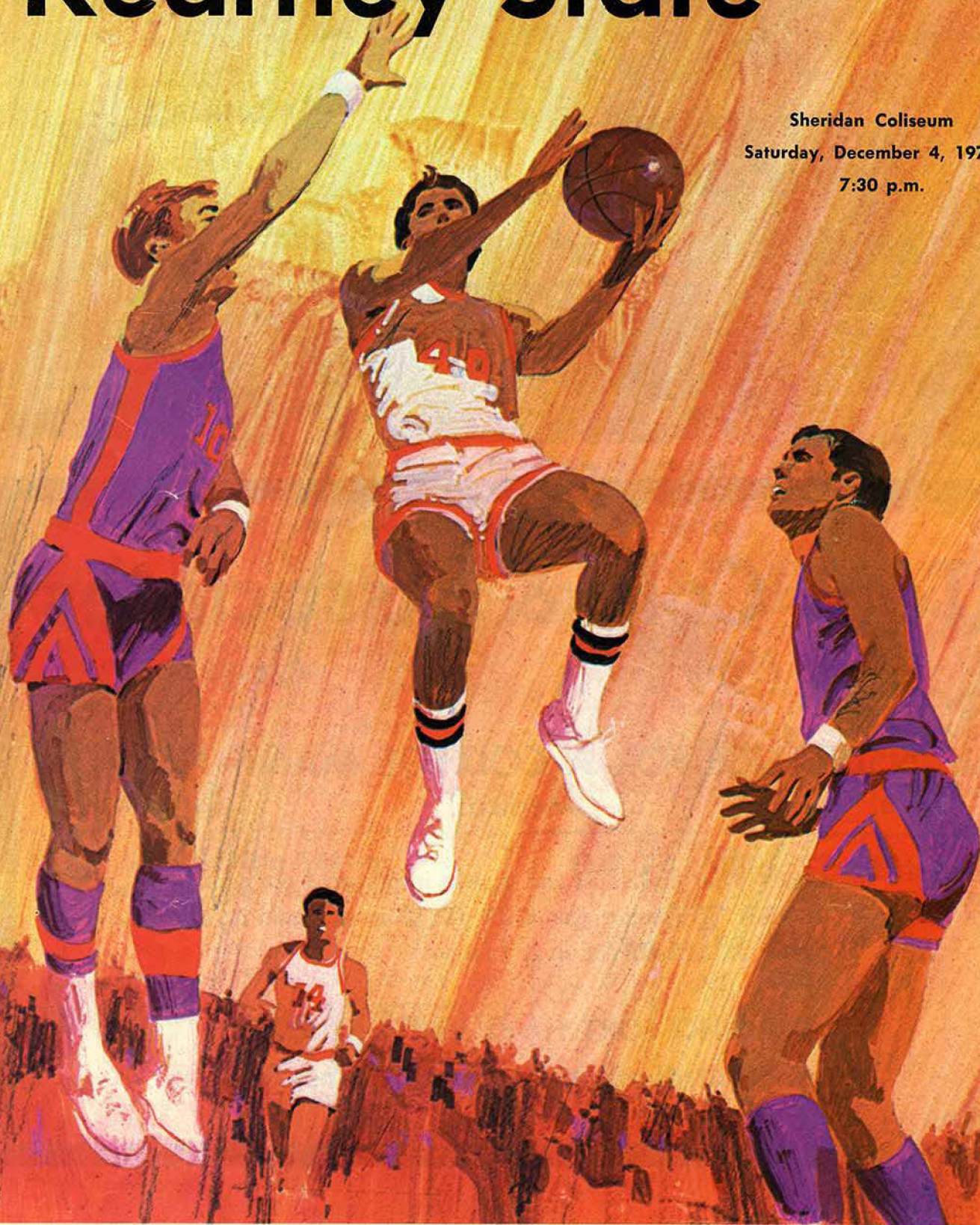

## Tonight's Game

Kearney State's basketball team invades Sheridan Coliseum tonight for the Tigers' second game of the 1971-72 season.

Tonight marks the opening of the new season for the Antelopes who compiled a 17-8 overall record last year. The Kearney squad's only game action to date was its annual varsity-alumni clash during Thanksgiving vacation.

Although the Antelopes lost three starters from last year's squad, the Nebraskans have high hopes for the new campaign. The high hopes are based on the fact that seven lettermen and "the best freshman crop ever" accounts for the nucleus of the team.

Head coach Jerry Hueser expects team leadership to come from 6-11 senior center Roger Ahrens, 6-2 senior guard John Kropp, 6-0 junior guard Jerry Willis and 6-4 freshman forward Tom Kropp.

This year's squad is the tallest in Antelope history and "if injuries don't strike" the coaches believe "the team could out-do last year's record which was the best ever at Kearney."

Last season the Tigers downed Kearney in the opening contest, 101-72, but the Antelopes captured the return game, 102-71. FHS holds a 27-6 lead in the series between the two schools.

The Tigers will travel to Kearney Jan. 18 for the second game this year.

## A Look Ahead

The Tigers' third home basketball game is set for 7:30 p.m. Tuesday against Northwestern Oklahoma State College from Alva.

At press time the Rangers had compiled a 1-3 record for the young 1971-72 season with the lone win coming at the expense of Arkansas Tech during the Southwestern All-Sports Classic (Lawton, Okla.) Nov. 26-27.

One of the three losses was to Midwestern University during the Lawton tournament while the Rangers were downed in regular season play by Bethany Nazarene College and Sterling College.

Brightening the outlook for this season are four returning lettermen. The letter winners are 6-4 senior forward Bill Deeds, 6-0 sophomore guard John Griffin, 6-4 senior forward Dennis McNeil and 6-5 senior center Ben Painter.

These four players, which form a strong nucleus for the Ranger team, are joined by three junior college transfers and seven promising freshmen.

Alva's biggest loss was Hank Commodore, who was a Ranger starter for four years. Commodore holds the all-time Northwestern scoring total with 1,865 points.

The Tigers only played Northwestern once last year as bad weather forced cancellation of the second game. The Rangers outclassed FHS, 92-69, but the Tigers hold a 12-3 lead in the series between the two schools.

Fort Hays State's wrestling squad saw its first action of the 1971-72 campaign today at the Air Force Academy in Colorado.

Besides FHS and the hosting Falcons, the competition included Colorado School of Mines, Colorado State University, Weber (Utah) State College, Metropolitan (Colo.) State, University of South Dakota and Colorado Western.

This season first-year head coach Jack Ramey will count heavily on returnees Bob Brown, Oberlin senior; Rick Doran, Harlan, Ia. junior; and Ron Walker, Ulysses junior.

Goodland senior Mike Burk has been lost to the squad for the season because of a wrist injury. The 134-pound letterman had a 10-9 record last year and was expected to see considerable action this season.

A newcomer to the team, who should improve the outlook, is McCook, (Neb.) Juco transfer Gale Epp. The junior from Kearney, Neb. was a national junior college wrestling champ last year. Another promising juco transfer is Stan Faulkender, St. Francis junior, who attended Colby Junior College.

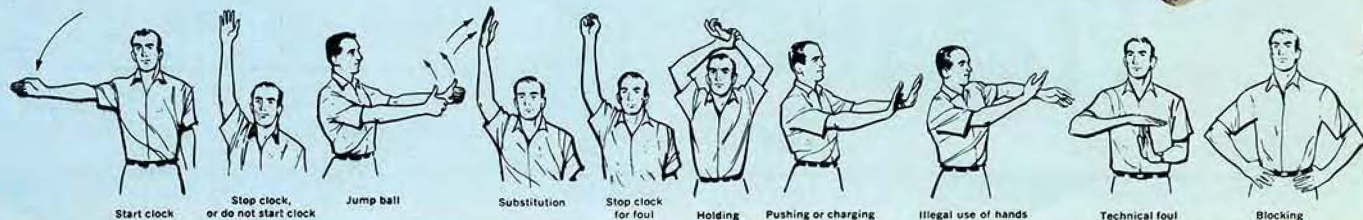

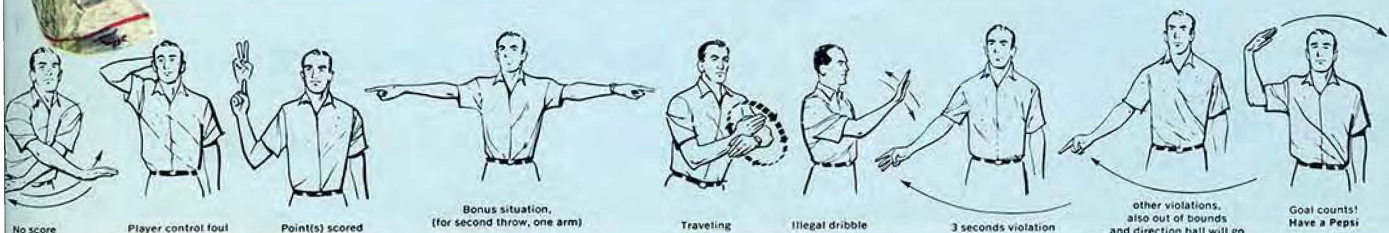

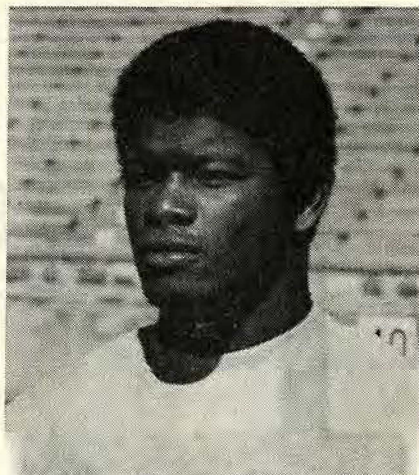
