Tonight's Game

Southern Colorado State College's Tribe of Indians attacks the Fort Hays State Tigers in Sheridan Coliseum tonight.

SCSC comes into the contest with a 6-1 mark with their only loss coming at the hands of Big Eight power Iowa State University.

Last season the Tribe took two decisions from the Bengals and lead in the series between the two schools 13-6.

The only common opponent between the two schools is Kearney State College to date. FHS has topped the Antelopes twice by the scores of 98-91 and 96-93. SCSC captured a 94-75 verdict from the Antelopes.

Leading the Indians into the contest is three-time all-conference guard Cal Tatum. For the year, Tatum has a 26.9 average and has hauled in 69 rebounds. Last season, Tatum scored 13 points against the Tigers in Pueblo and hit only five in Sheridan.

Against Kearney, Tatum connected for 34 points and established himself as the all-time scoring leader in the SCSC record books. He is also the fifth leading rebounder in Indian cage history.

Tom Peterson, a 6-7 forward, follows Tatum in the scoring and rebounding categories with 19.1 points per game and 9.0 rebounds. He also leads the Indians in field goal and free throw percentage.

Still another Indian to watch is Tatum's running mate, Charlie Cox. Carrying a 10.3 scoring average, the 6-1 junior leads the Tribe in assists with 31 and is the floor leader in the Indians' offense.

A Look Ahead

Three road games face the Fort Hays State Tigers after tonight's contest before they return home to face Benedictine College on Jan. 20 at 7:30 p.m.

Tuesday, the Black and Gold travel to Wichita for a rematch with the Sacred Heart Jets. The Tigers handed the Jets an 83-82 loss in Sheridan earlier this season. Greg Standish led the Tigers with 18 points, while Barton Snow and Brent Frack pulled down eight rebounds apiece. Mike Bayer led the Jets with 33 points.

On Jan. 13, Kansas State Teachers College furnishes the opposition for the Bengals. The Hornets carried a 3-5 record into their conference lid lifter against the University of Nebraska-Omaha Thursday night. Emporia State took two games from the Tigers last year.

After missing last season, Dennis Supple has returned to Hornet basketball fortunes and is pacing the Hornets in scoring and rebounding. He has scored 18.1 points per game and has grabbed 11.1 rebounds.

Ed Burton, a 6-9 senior center, adds to the Hornet attack with a per game norm of 16.7 points and 7.3 rebounds.

The University of Nebraska-Omaha hosts the Tigers on Jan. 19. The Mavericks sport a 5-3 mark before their meeting with the Hornets. In their last outing, the Mavericks won their own Holiday Invitational.

Junior forward Cal Forrest leads the Omaha squad with a 20.3 point per game average.

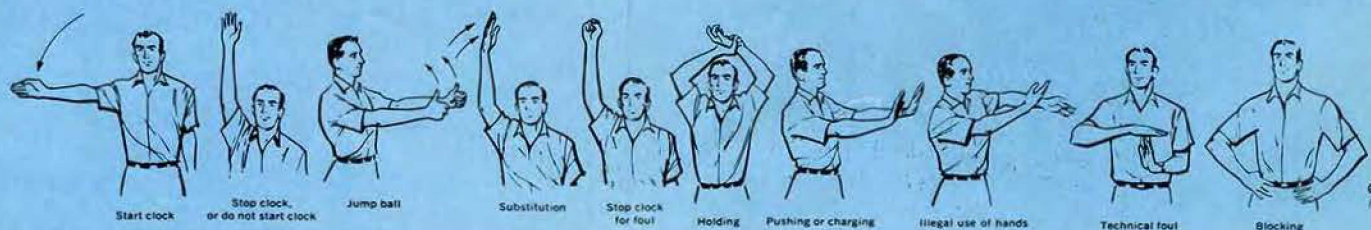

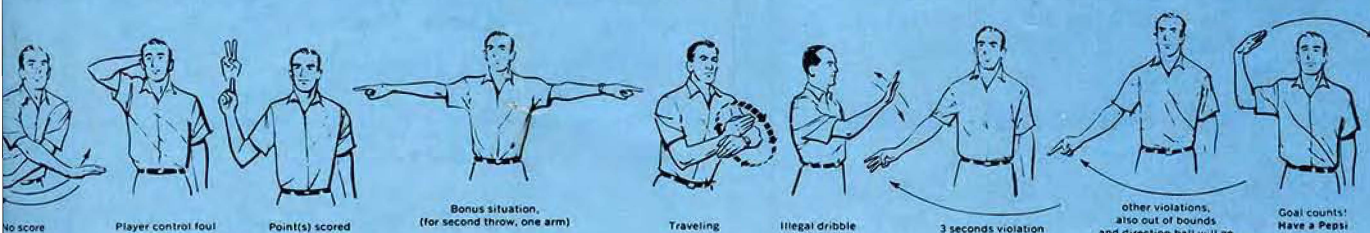

Head Tiger basketball Coach Chuck Brehm is in his eighth year as head mentor at Fort Hays State.

During his high school and college coaching career, Brehm has compiled a 225-136 record including a 81-78 mark at FHS.

As assistant professor in the division of health, physical education and recreation, Brehm came to FHS in 1965 after being named National Junior College Coach of the Year at Dodge City Juco.

He posted a 113-29 won-loss record at Dodge City through five years and led his team to the national junior college championship in 1965. Brehm also coached one year at Durham High School and two more years at Altamont High School where he posted a 31-29 record.

Coach Brehm graduated from Washburn University in 1954, receiving his B.A. in social science. While at Washburn, he was selected all-conference three times while playing on the Ichabod basketball squad.

In 1964, Brehm received his M.E. in administration from the University of Kansas.

Brehm and his wife Jane have four children, Rick, 18; Becky, 16; Randy, 14; and David, 11.

Coming into the new year with a 3-0 record, the Fort Hays State gymnastics team will play host to South Dakota State University and the powerful University of Northern Colorado Jan. 26 in Sheridan Coliseum at 7:30 p.m.

In their first outing of the season, the Tigers defeated South Dakota State University, 120-85.95 and the University of South Dakota, 120-30.95.

Central Missouri State supplied the opposition for the Bengals in their second meet. FHS defeated Central Missouri 125.45-103.20 to bring them to a 3-0 mark.

Leading point scorer this season for the Black and Gold is Topeka senior Frank Gray who has gained 62.65 points in two outings compared to New York sophomore Bobby Allen's 54.60 total.

Gray, along with Donovan Randolph and Danny Delgado have captured their special events in both contests. Gray has taken first in the high bar and long horse. Delgado won the still rings and Randolph placed first in the side horse.

The Tigers final home match will be Feb. 10 against North Texas State University.
