Tonight's Game

Tonight's opponent is a familiar one for FHS as the Tigers and Hornets have met on the basketball court 97 times. Emporia holds a 49-48 game edge in the cage series.

Earlier this season in Emporia, the Hornets gained an 84-76 Great Plains Athletic Conference victory behind the 20-point output by Rusty Smiley. Davy Babb scored 18, A. J. Willis tallied 17 and Ron Boline dumped in 10 points for Emporia.

In the first meeting, Ed Schumacher led the Tiger scoring attack with 23 points while Ron Crowell followed closely with 22. Greg Standish was the only other Tiger in double figures with 10 tallies.

So far this season Emporia has compiled a 10-11 overall record and a 3-3 mark in GPAC action. The Hornets' most recent win came Wednesday night at Topeka when they downed Washburn University, 56-52.

FHS supports an 8-11 season mark and a 3-4 league record coming into tonight's game. Wednesday the Tigers won a non-conference affair with Benedictine College, 92-63.

Heading the Hornets scoring is Willis with a 17.7 average while Babb is adding 15.4 points per game and Smiley is averaging 14.4. In the rebounding department, Smiley is the leader with a 7.8 average. Willis is grabbing 7.5 per contest and Boline holds a 6.2 rebounding mark.

Schumacher is still the Tigers' top scorer after 19 games with an average of 16.4. He is followed by Barton Snow with 11.8, Standish with 11.6, Crowell with 9.1 and Frack with 7.8. Schumacher and Snow each have a 9.1 rebounding average. Standish is grabbing 5.6 per game while Crowell and Frack are averaging 5.3 and 5.1 rebounds, respectively.

In addition to his 9.1 rebounding average, Snow also holds the GPAC single game record. Against Southern Colorado last weekend he grabbed 22 caroms to break the old mark of 20 set by FHS's Doug Thurman last year.

A special attraction tonight is the second annual basketball Parents Night. All parents of Tiger basketball players were invited for tonight's activities. The parents in attendance will be honored at halftime and also during a reception following the varsity game.

Another feature tonight is the high school game prior to the FHS-Emporia varsity contest. Officials at Hays High and the FHS Athletic Department have worked together to provide local and area fans with fine high school and college basketball on the same night. The Hays High-Junction City varsity clash should provide good basketball entertainment.

FHS Grapplers Meet K-State Tuesday

Fort Hays State wrestling fans will have their first opportunity to see the Tiger varsity in action as they tangle with the Kansas State University Wildcats at 7 p.m. Tuesday in Gross Memorial Coliseum.

The meet is the first of two home meets for the varsity grapplers this season. FHS's junior varsity defeated Pratt Juco 18-12 in the season opener for the only other collegiate home meet.

In the earlier clash in Manhattan, the Wildcats mauled the Tigers 32-9, but the second time around K-State will face a vastly improved FHS squad.

Winning three of their last four duals, including a convincing 33-10 triumph over nationally-ranked Peru State, the Bengals have the momentum as they

entered the Wayne State tournament today.

The victory over Peru, previously ranked 7th in the NAIA, came at the Northwestern Missouri State Triangular at Maryville, Mo. last week. NWMS defeated FHS 21-18 in the other match-up.

FHS swept two more wins in the Kearney State Quadrangular last Saturday, whipping Northern State College of South Dakota 21-14 and coming from behind to edge KSC 19-18 to bring the season record to 3-5.

Saturday's action at Kearney was the first time in recent duals that FHS competed with a full squad. The Bengals had been without a 126 pounder, and were having to forfeit that weight. With the addition of Larry Atwood, Kinsley junior to the squad, and Greg Lohofener moving down from 134, Coach Barry Allen hopes to have solved the matter. Both Atwood and Lohofener wrestled at Kearney, and both won their matches, indicating a greater depth in the lower weights.

Rich Settle, with an 11-5-1 win-loss-draw record, still leads the Tigers at 134 pounds while heavyweight Stu McGowne is 8-5-1. Other records are: Bill Havice, 150, 5-5-1; John Ganser, 167, 5-6; Durand Dickerson, 142, 5-8, and Gary Delmez, 118, 4-8.

Standish Wraps Up Four-Year Career

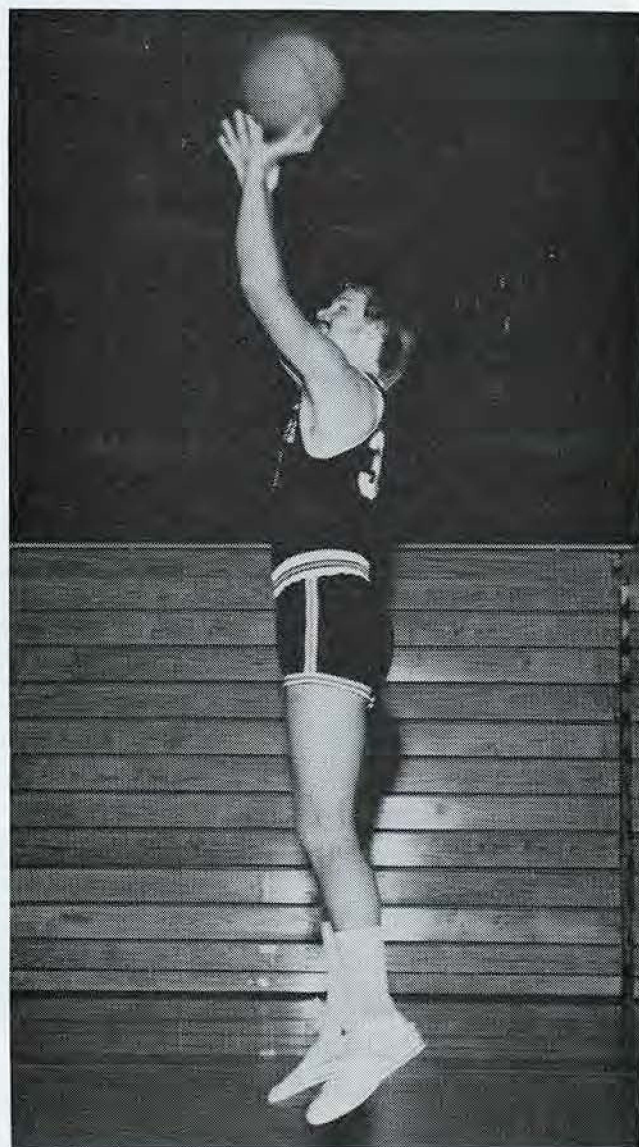
One of four seniors who have played for the Fort Hays State basketball team the past four seasons is Greg Standish, a 6-5 forward from Goodland.

A three-year letterman for the Tigers, Standish will leave an impressive list of statistics behind when he hangs up his uniform. In his 90 games, he pumped in 848 points, good enough for 11th on the all-time FHS scoring list. He needs seven more field goals to top Herb Stange's all-time FHS mark of 394.

Standish has led the Tigers on two occasions this season in scoring, his best effort coming with the 15 points and 12 rebounds in FHS's 93-65 triumph over Sterling College in the season opener. For the season, Standish is averaging 11.1 points per outing, and 5.6 rebounds. He's hitting 46 per cent of his field goals, and 75 per cent of his free throws.

A leader off the court as well as on, he is the senior class president at FHS.

An all-round athlete at Goodland High School, Standish lettered three years in basketball, and two years in track and cross country. He was selected honorable mention all-state his junior and senior year.

The **State College Leader**, student newspaper of Fort Hays State College has been awarded a First Class rating in the 1974 Critical Service of the Associated Collegiate Press.

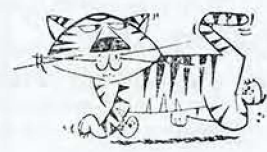
Competing against publications from schools throughout the nation, the **Leader** was cited in particular for Marks of Distinction in coverage and content and writing and editing.

The First Class rating is indicative of an excellent publication with sound journalism practices. The Marks of Distinction are awarded to those newspapers rating the extra recognition. A paper must be awarded four Marks to achieve All-American status.

The Associated Collegiate Press assists college publications in ways of improving newspapers, year-books and magazines.

Judges are professional journalists and persons with college journalism degrees.

Editor during the rating period of the spring semester was Larry Walker, Penalosa senior. Mike Walker, instructor of journalism and FHS News Director is adviser for the paper.



Origin of the Tiger Nickname

Both the black and gold colors of Fort Hays State and its mascot, the Tiger, are now in their sixth decade of identifying the Kansas school.

A symbol of FHS athletic events, the Tiger is a transplanted Missourian, chosen by William A. Lewis during his presidency from 1913 to 1933. Lewis taught in Missouri schools and colleges and urged adoption of the Tiger, also mascot of the University of Missouri, for FHS.

Lewis is also credited with adding the color black to the original college color, gold, to identify FHS as independent of the Emporia Normal School. At that time (1913) FHS was a branch of the normal school.

Broad Selection of Degree Fields Here

As a student at Fort Hays State, you have a broad list of possible degrees to consider before making a decision as to which area you wish to pursue. Some departments give you the choice of working towards an advanced degree after completing all the undergraduate work required.

A four year program in the Liberal Arts area at Fort Hays State College, guides you to the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science degrees. In the field of Applied Arts, a four year program guides you to the Bachelor of Science degree in applied fields. Four-year curricula lead to the Bachelor of Music degree and Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing.

Many students have the desire to enter professions that require more extensive training than can be offered at FHS. A student wishing to enter into one of these fields may complete the necessary preprofessional sequence at Fort Hays State, then transfer to the institution he chooses and complete any additional requirements. Students in the preprofessional programs can be assured that the preparation they receive in their field of specialization will be more than adequate to prepare them for graduate school.

Preprofessional curricula at Fort Hays State include pre dental, pre-engineering, preforestry, prelaw, premedicine, premedical technology, prepharmacy, prephysical therapy, pretheological and preveterinary medicine.

Fort Hays State also offers preprofessional training in other medically related fields such as optometry, x-ray technology, inhalation therapy, osteopathy, medical records and several other fields.

Students seeking to complete graduate work at FHS can obtain a Master of Arts, Master of Science or the Specialist in Education degree. The Graduate Division at Fort Hays State offers advanced degrees in more than twenty different fields.

Some students earn the "certificate of work accomplished" award. This award is presented to those students who complete four years of college work but do not fulfill all the requirements for a degree.
