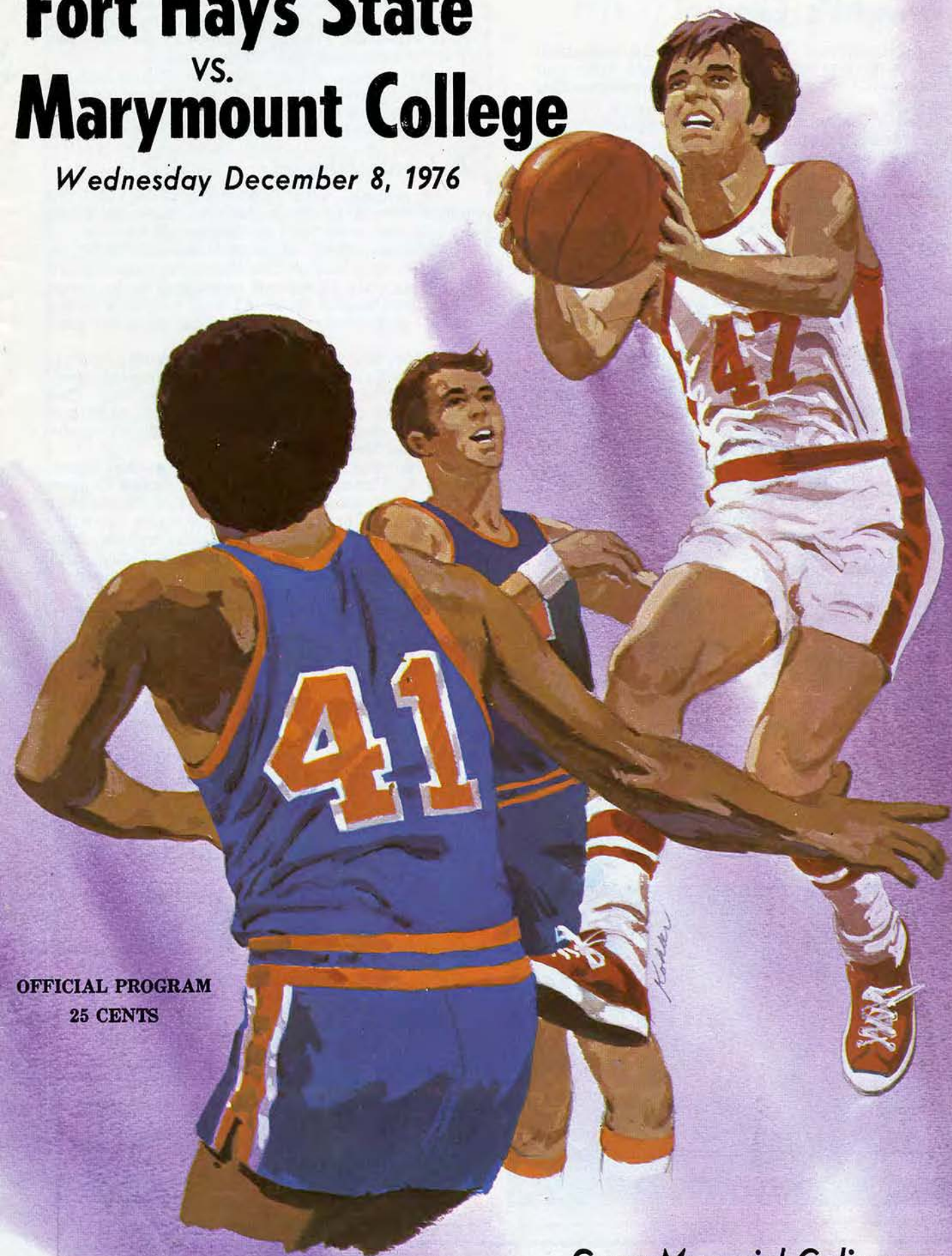

Tonight's Game

An important NAIA District 10 basketball game is on tap tonight as Fort Hays State and Marymount College meet for the second time this season.

Earlier, Marymount won a 94-82 decision in Salina and the Spartans currently hold an unblemished 8-0 record. FHS enters tonight's contest with a 4-2 mark after edging Benedictine College Monday night in Atchison.

Leading players for the Spartans this season include: 6-1 junior guard Jeff Kline, 6-6 junior forward Wes Ramseur and 6-3 junior guard-forward Herb Dawson.

In the first meeting this season, Kline led Marymount in scoring with 20 points while Ramseur and Dawson added 18 and 17 tallies, respectively.

Sophomore forward Mike Pauls had his best scoring night against the Spartans last month as he poured in 28 points. He was aided by junior forward Dave Stoppel with 13 and junior forward Doug Rohr with 10 points.

After six games, Pauls has emerged as the Tigers leading scorer and rebounder. The Buhler product is averaging 14.2 points per game and is grabbing 7.7 rebounds per contest.

Senior guard Ben Gray is second in scoring with a 13.8-per game average while Stoppel trails with a 12.7 average. Sophomore guard Doug Finch rounds out the double figure scorers with an average of 10.5.

Stoppel follows Pauls in rebounding with 7.2 caroms per outing. Junior forward Mark Watts is next with a 5.0 average while junior forward Stan Wagler is credited with 4.0 per game.

As a team, FHS is scoring 73.2 points per game while giving up 72.8. In the rebounding category, the Tigers are credited with 43.5 per contest and their opponents are averaging 48.8 per outing.

A Look Ahead

A rematch with Benedictine College at 7:30 p.m. Saturday in Gross Memorial Coliseum wraps up this busy week for Tiger basketball.

Monday, FHS edged the Ravens, 58-57, in Atchison on a pair of free throws by senior guard Ben Gray with 15 seconds remaining in the game. The Tigers trailed by as much as 13 points in the contest and never led until the final one-point margin.

Thus, the stage is set for an exciting basketball game Saturday, which is in conjunction with the fourth annual Media Appreciation Day. This year's event features a seminar for both print and electronic media at 1:30 p.m. in addition to the traditional free throw contest.

Following Saturday's activities, the Tigers travel to Phoenix, Ariz., for the Grand Canyon College Tournament Dec. 17-18. The tournament will end pre-Christmas basketball action for FHS.

Other teams entered in the event include: host Grand Canyon, Southern Utah State College and Occidental College of California. FHS is slated to meet Grand Canyon in first round action.

Eight Returnees On FHS Gymnastics Team

Much of Fort Hays State's national recognition in the 1970's has come from a long line of strong men's gymnastics teams. This year's squad will try and join that elite group as it faces a tough schedule of opponents and with several spots in the lineup still up for grabs.

Eight members of last year's team, which compiled a 5-2 dual meet record and placed fifth at the NAIA National Championships, are back this season, but the team has been hit hard by the loss of some outstanding veterans. Their places will be occupied by a big group of freshmen who will have to prove themselves under meet conditions if the team is to match last year's achievements.

FHS Head Coach Ed McNeil sees this season as a rebuilding season for his Tiger gymnastics team and is concerned about the lack of all-around performers on the squad.

"This year should be another rebuilding year for us," McNeil says. "We need to find two all-around men who can score well for us. We have plenty of special events men, but the big question mark will be the situation of the all-around men."

"With the lack of all-around performers, the scoring may fall on the shoulders of five or six of our people," he added. "Our main objective will be to improve on last year's performance and place in the nationals again."

Heading the list of returning lettermen are seniors Courtney Eslick and Chuck Kisse. Eslick was the Tigers' leading side horse man last year

and Kisse was a consistent performer on the parallel bars.

Other top performers are all-around men James Bobo and Chuck Lundblad, side horse specialist John Gray and vaulter and floor exercise man Tim Herrera.

A promising group of freshmen will highlight this year's team. McNeil sees the additions of newcomers Dave Ross, Phil Burhenn and Louis Winn as big boosts to the squad. Both Ross and Burhenn will strengthen the all-around contingent while Winn is a side horse performer.

Other top freshmen include Roy Dodson in the floor exercise and vaulting; Denver Howard also in vaulting and Carlton Collins on the parallel bars.

Returning to the squad this year as an assistant coach is Paul Bowerman from Olathe. A four-year letterman for FHS, Bowerman was a member of squads that placed no lower than fifth at the nationals the past four years. At last year's finals, he finished sixth individually in the still rings. He was also the Tigers' leading scorer and all-around performer last season.

FHS saw its first action of the season Sunday in the annual varsity-alumni meet. The Tigers open their regular season this Friday night by hosting South Dakota State University. FHS's women's gymnastics team will also be competing Friday. Also on the home schedule is a men's and women's meet with Central Missouri University Feb. 4 and the FHS Invitational Feb. 25. The NAIA Championships are March 4 and 5 at Billings, Mont.

High School Coaches From FHS

Not only has the Fort Hays State football staff produced winning squads; it has, in the past, produced good players, who in turn coached winning high school teams.

Fifteen of the 77 high schools which had good enough records to enter the Kansas State High School Activities Association's state play-offs this fall were coached by FHS alumni.

Two of these schools went on to be state champions. They were the 2A champion team, Beloit, coached by Clayton Williams, and the 1A champion team, Ashland, coached by Larry Rich. Both Williams and Rich graduated from FHS in 1964. Williams was also recently named Kansas High School Coach-of-the-Year by the Wichita Eagle.

Another team that was in the state championships was Montezuma in the eight-man division. Montezuma's coach is Steve Seirer, a 1971 FHS graduate. His team placed second behind the state champion team Bogue.

Other teams and coaches and how they advanced in the play-offs are:

Eight-man—Norwich, coached by Lanny Howler, a 1972 graduate, played in the regional qualifying round.

Lebanon, coached by Joe Arenson, a 1967 graduate, qualified for the regional championships.

Sharon, coached by Gerald Bowman, a 1968 graduate, qualified for the regional championships and played in the sub-state. His team was beaten by Montezuma.

Luray, coached by Greg Heinze, a 1970 graduate, qualified for the regional championships and played in the sub-state. His team was beaten by Bogue.

Class 1A—Brewster, coached by Bill Nondorf, a 1972 graduate, played in the district. His team was defeated by Ashland.

Hope coached by Joe Ross, a 1976 graduate, played in the district.

Quinter, coached by Ken Zeigler, a 1973 graduate, played in the district.

Class 2A—Valley Falls, coached by Galen Hisey, a 1959 graduate, qualified for the district. His team was beaten by Silver Lake.

Ellinwood, coached by Robert Shandy, a 1971 graduate, played in the district qualifying round, the district and the regional. They were beaten by Garden Plain.

Class 3A—Augusta, coached by Richard Poage, a 1961 graduate, played in the district. His team was beaten by Haven.

Haven, coached by Larry Markley, a 1967 graduate, played in the district and regional. His team was beaten by Wellington.

Abilene, coached by Paul Dennis, a 1958 graduate, played in the district, regional and sub-state. His team was beaten by Shawnee-St. Joseph.

All of the teams could have no more than one loss this season to qualify for the play-offs and they also had to win their league.

Tiger Wrestlers Open Season With Three Wins

Fort Hays State's wrestling team opened the 1976-77 season with three victories in the opening week of competition in matches at Gross Memorial Coliseum Dec. 2 and 3.

In the season opener, FHS whipped Fort Lewis College by the score of 45-4. Three forfeits and two pins helped to open up what had been a close match. Senior Stan Higley and sophomore Kirk Tangeman claimed pins for the Tigers.

On the following day, Fort Hays State hosted Oscar Rose Jr. College of Midwest City, Okla., and Fort Lewis College in a double-dual match.

For the second time in as many days, the Tigers defeated Fort Lewis College 33-9. Earlier, FHS edged Oscar Rose Jr. College 25-20. In the other match, Oscar Rose Jr. College defeated Fort Lewis College 28-12.

Individually following three matches, Fort Hays State has five undefeated wrestlers in the starting lineup. They are Bill Havice at 150, Randy Hill at 158, Stan Higley at 167, Kirk Tangeman at 177 and Scott Warner at 190.

Three other wrestlers have posted 2-1 records. These include Steve Minor at 118, Dave Rochholz at 134 and Rex Pedigo at 142. Higley leads the squad in pins with two.

The Tigers will be in action on two occasions before Christmas break. FHS travels to Maryville, Mo., to participate in the Northwest Missouri State University Invitational Tournament on Dec. 10-11. Fort Hays State returns to dual action on Dec. 15 tangling with Colby Community College at Colby.

All-District 10 Football Team

Fort Hays State placed two players on the NAIA District 10 football offensive team and one on the defensive unit, according to an announcement last week.

FHS's senior quarterback Skip Numrich and junior place kicker Brian Shriwise were members of the offensive team while senior safety Kent Griffin received defensive recognition.

Numrich was the Tigers' leading passer and total offensive leader during the 1976 season and established six new individual school records. He completed 115 of 237 passes for 1,562 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Griffin topped the defensive charts with 98 total tackles, including 61 unassisted and 37 assisted. Shriwise was responsible for kicking 18 of 22 extra points during the nine games. He also booted two of 11 field goals, including a 46-yarder which gave the Tigers a 20-19 win over Kansas State College—Pittsburg.

Pittsburg received the most representation as four Gorillas were named to the District 10 team. Washburn University and Bethel College each had three while two players were named from McPherson College, Ottawa University and Benedictine College.

Coach-of-the-Year honors went to Ron Daerr of Friends University while the top punter was Brad Anderson of Bethany College.

A 5-9 freshman forward, Deb Robinson, is leading the Tigerettes in scoring, averaging 16.5 points per contest. She is also leading the Tigerettes in rebounding with 10.8 per contest.

Brenda Cahoj, a 5-7 forward, and Sheri Piersall, a 5-5 guard, are second leading scorers for the Tigerettes with 11.3 points per contest. Janna Choitz, a 5-4 guard, is also averaging in double figures with 11.0 points per contest.

Piersall holds the Tigerettes high-game record this season with 25 points in the game with Panhandle State College last Saturday. She is followed by Robinson and Cahoj each with 18 points for their high game with Wichita State University. Choitz's high game was with Northwestern State University of Alva, Okla., when she scored 17 points.

The Tigerettes opened the season by winning the FHS Invitational Tournament. In the invitational the Tigerettes defeated PSC, 63-51 and WSU, 70-61.

FHS's lone loss came at the hands of Northwestern, when the Tigerettes were defeated, 91-61. They defeated PSC a second time last week, 66-53.

The Tigerettes travel to Wichita tomorrow to meet the Shockers in a 5:30 p.m. contest. Their final competition before Christmas break will be an Invitational Tournament Dec. 17-18 in Fremont, Neb., with Westmar College of LeMars, Ia.; Grandview College of Des Moines, Ia.; and host Midland Lutheran College.

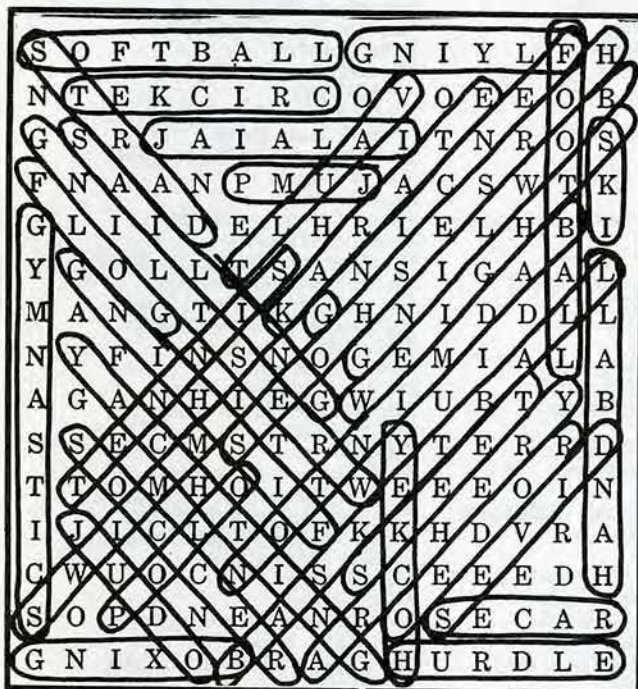
