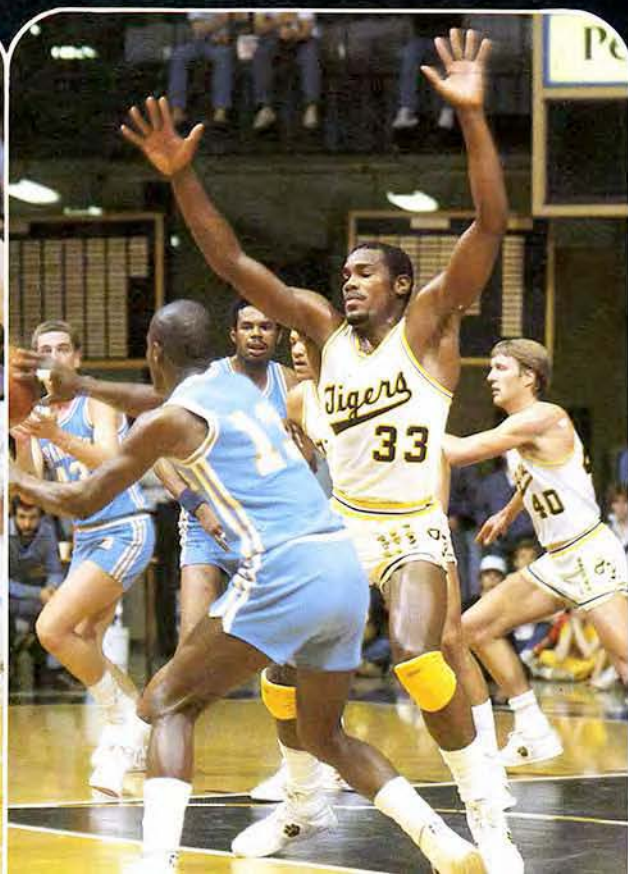
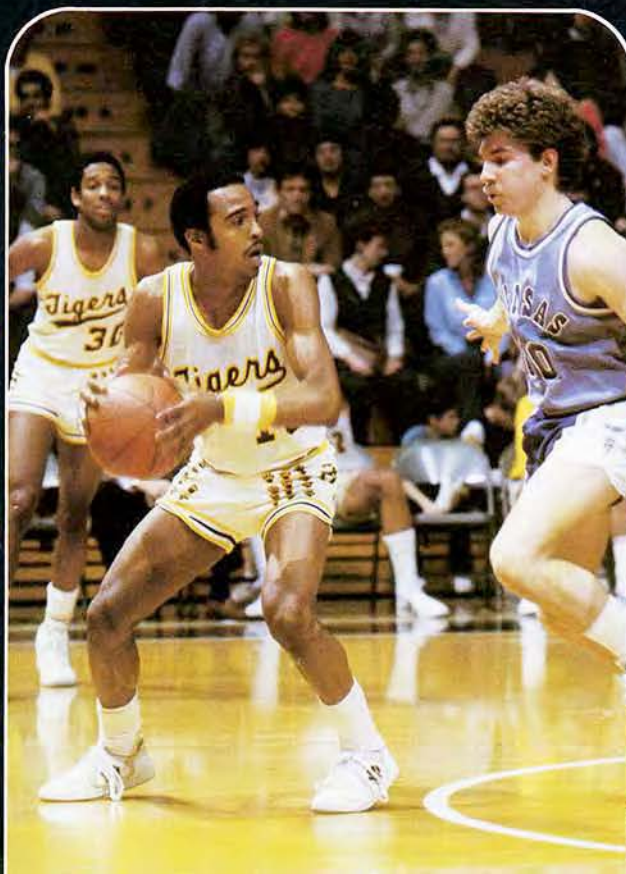
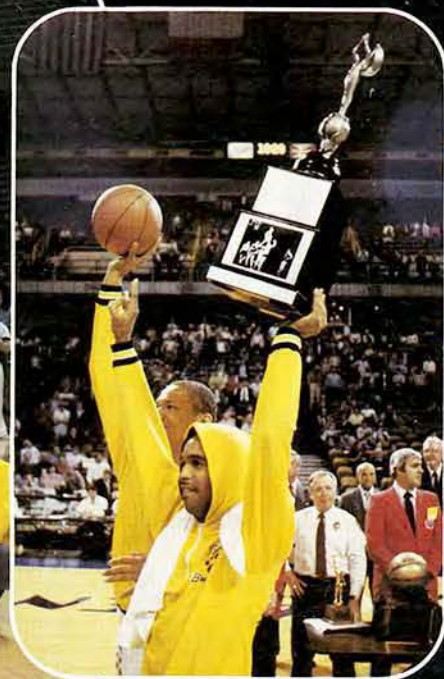

THIS IS FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY

Fort Hays State University's beautiful tree-lined campus provides students with an attractive educational setting.

The University is located in Hays, a city of more than 17,000 persons, situated about halfway between Kansas City and Denver on Interstate 70 Highway.

Faculty at FHSU numbers more than 300. An additional 280 staff members contribute to the friendly, clean atmosphere found on the campus.

Students at FHSU have the opportunity to pursue a career by selecting from 24 departmental offerings, our school of nursing, or from our pre-professional programs. The University offers degrees including, one-, two-, four-, five- and six-year study programs, and we offer the associate, bachelor's, master's and specialist in education degrees.

Annual enrollment at FHSU is more than 5,000 students. Two-thirds of the student body are graduates of rural Kansas high schools.

The University offers students a variety of extracurricular activities in which to participate. Departmental and profes-

sional clubs, intramurals, varsity athletics, and other groups and activities beckon those with the talent and time to participate.

Four national sororities and five national fraternities maintain chapters here and add to the social, academic and philanthropic activities of student life.

Several concerts are brought to campus each year by the Memorial Union Activities Board. Other entertainment forms come as speakers, dancers or touring groups and individuals.

Fees at FHSU are comparable to other state-assisted institutions in Kansas and considerably less than the private colleges. Persons enrolling in 15 hours of work should be prepared to pay about \$500 each semester at FHSU. Fees do not include the cost of books.

For housing, the University offers two women's residence halls, two men's residence halls, one co-ed hall, and married student housing, all within easy walking distance of classes.

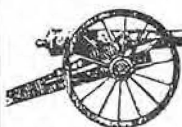

1985-86 Season Outlook

Is it luck or something else which has given the Fort Hays State basketball program two consecutive NAIA national championships. A good share of followers have come to the conclusion that luck is one of the main ingredients to Bill Morse's teams sporting rings from each of the last two seasons.

The basis of these conclusions stem from Joe Anderson's shot at the buzzer against Chicago State in the semi-finals of the 1983-84 championships, Fred Campbell's off balance bank shot at the gun versus Central Washington in last year's semi-final contest and last but not least Ron Morse's shot, in overtime with the score knotted at 80-80, that bounced around the rim five times before falling through for the 1984-85 national championship.

Morse would like to look these people straight in the eye and say, "No, I do not think it is luck. We've been the kind of team that has put ourselves in position to get lucky," says Morse. "In other words, we are winning 35 games a year and when you do that you are not lucky." The Tiger head mentor explains his reasoning further, "I think our team has shown we win a high percentage of close games. That is certainly a knack if nothing else. Our team believes in themselves and if we take a team down to a last second shot or into overtime, we believe we are going to win and that's a big psychological edge."

Teams that have won 102 games in three seasons have had some kind of edge over their opponents. The edge in 1985-86 may lie in the hands and feet of senior guard Raymond Lee. Lee, at 5-11, 165, has been around for all 102 wins and, justifiably so, is probably solely responsible for several. The native of Detroit, Michigan, garnered first team all-American honors in 1985 to top his many accolades. Lee

averaged 10.8 points a game and at his best game dished out 218 assists, an average of 5.7 per game. He already holds the FHSU career mark (683) for assists.

Another of the top returnees for the Tigers is Fred Campbell, a stellar performer in the NAIA championships last March. The 6-6, 220-pound forward will be relied on for his tenacious defense and overall aggressive style of play. Campbell, a senior from Macon, Georgia, averaged 14.5 ppg and 7.0 rpg in 1984-85.

"I feel that our two seasoned veterans, Ray Lee and Fred Campbell, are certainly going to be our strengths. Ray gives us a fast break threat, a press breaker and a seasoned veteran out there running our show," states Morse. "Secondly, Fred Campbell is improved and playing really well and may be the best player to ever play for me, but that remains to be seen."

Lee and Campbell are the nucleus of a squad which returns seven lettermen. Joe Anderson (6-6, SR, G-F) and Ron Morse (6-0, SR, G) each have three seasons under their belts as Tigers. Both were keys in the before mentioned close games and their value cannot be evaluated in mere numbers. Anderson played in 36 of 38 games last season, including 23 starts, while averaging 4.7 ppg and 3.1 rpg. Morse had similar numbers in that he saw action in all 38 games and averaged 3.2 ppg, 0.8 rpg and started seven games.

The remaining letterwinners are seniors, Tyree Allen and Kevin Benford, and freshman, Reggie Smith. These three players all participated in 20 or more games and will likely see more action this season. Allen, at 6-7, 200-pounds, and Benford, at 6-6, 210 pounds, will battle for time at the forward position. Smith will serve as a backup to Lee and Morse at the point guard position.



A look at the new recruiting class is enough to make Morse optimistic about the upcoming schedule of games. "If you include Mike Miller, Archie Johnson, Cedric Williams and Thomas Hardnett, that foursome of newcomers is very good. I don't rate it excellent because we really should get a dominant center," stresses Morse. "That foursome of players is on and off the court very strong mentally. They are gifted basketball players and I think they will fit our style of play in that they can play our defense and play with intensity."

Miller, a 6-6, 220-pound redshirt freshman, back from a knee injury incurred in the Black & Gold game last fall, is expected to vie for a starting position during the fall semester before a couple of transfers become eligible. Johnson (6-5, JR, G-F) is a transfer from Texas State Technical Institute that will give the Tigers an outside shooting threat as well as speed and quickness. Williams comes to FHSU from Sam Houston HS in Arlington, Texas. Williams, 6-6, 190, is touted as one of the best freshmen to enter the program in the Morse era. The fourth of the standout newcomers, Hardnett, will not become eligible until second semester because of a transfer from NW Alabama Junior College. He is a sophomore and at 6-9, 220, is the biggest of all the Tigers.

A host of other newcomers dot the 1985-86 roster. Bruce Brawner (6-6, JR, G-F) transfers in from Central Wyoming Junior College. Kevin Williams (6-6, JR, F) comes to FHSU by way of Louisiana Tech and Bellhaven (TX) Junior College. He is another of the transfers that will not see playing time until after the first of the year. Kale Barton (6-4, JR, G) is another juco transfer from Hutchinson CC. Dave Lackey (6-4, G), the younger brother of assistant coach Greg Lackey, joins the Tiger squad after a sterling career at St. John's of Beloit (KS) High School.

One person that will be sorely missed on the floor this season is Edgar Eason. Eason was the NAIA Championship's Most Valuable Player, a first team NAIA All-American, first team all-Central States Intercollegiate Conference and first team all-District 10. His long range bombs and hard-driving layups, which sparked the Tigers, will likely not be replaced with the same flair that Eason had. His 19.6 scoring average, 5.7 rebound average and many other team leading statistics most likely will be spread between several players.

Eason was not the only casualty from the 1984-85 championship team, Rod Nealy (14.5 ppg) and Dan Lier (5.6 ppg)

were valuable on the front line. Mike Decker, a reserve guard, also was lost to graduation.

"Normally if you lose players like that you would expect to have a lot of trouble replacing them because all three were big factors," says Morse of Eason, Nealy and Lier. "You say, next year we will only win half of the games and hope to rebuild, but because we have the winning tradition going, we had a good recruiting class and we have two real good veterans returning, I think that we will pick up the slack and be tough again."

The new edition of Tiger Basketball has some esthetic differences. One of those is the number of bodies occupying the court during a practice session. With 15 names on the preseason roster, Morse has added to the depth of his team. In recent years, he has carried about 12 athletes in the early months of the season and has seen this number shrink to an uncomfortable amount of first rate players.

Another of the reasons Morse might have more players on the floor this season is the quality of recruits available that he was able to attain. "We are really deep this year. When we practice I see at least ten players that are potential starters," Morse said. "Through twelve men, we are better than we've ever been. I don't know if our first five is as good and that remains to be seen."

Fort Hays State will tip off the season on Nov. 11 against TJ Brataslava-Czechoslovakia in an exhibition contest. This game will be one of the toughest for the Tigers of the entire season.

The remainder of the schedule is much improved featuring the likes of Drury College, Briar Cliff College, the University of Missouri-Kansas City, Carson-Newman College, Central State (OK) University and West Virginia Tech.

CSIC action for the Tigers will open with rival Kearney State on December 7. Other conference action will not take place until after the first of the year when FHSU hosts Missouri Western (Jan. 17) and Wayne State (Jan. 18).

Morse and Company realize what lies ahead and what has to be done. "Having won the (NAIA) nationals two times in a row we feel a certain amount of pressure to have a good year — to attempt to win the district and return to nationals," Morse said. "I think we have the kind of talent to do that, the question is whether the first year players will be able to mature in time to make us a threat in the district."

Gerald Tomanek - President

Dr. Gerald W. (Jerry) Tomanek has been president at Fort Hays State University since 1976. He is the University's seventh president and number one sports fan. He and his lovely wife, Ardis, are virtually permanent fixtures at Tiger home athletic events and attend many road contests as well.

An environmentalist and grasslands consultant, Tomanek has served the University in many capacities since joining the faculty in 1947. His teaching skills and magnetism in the classroom are legend with alumni and faculty. The President holds bachelor's and master's degrees from FHSU and the Ph.D. degree from the University of Nebraska.

Tomanek's accolades are many. He was twice called to the Argentine to lend his grassland expertise, was a consultant for a CBS-TV prairie grasslands special, is the recipient of numerous awards for his conservation practices and knowledge, and was named "Kansan of the Year" in 1978 by the Native Sons and Daughters of Kansas. He is a popular speaker and the author of many articles for professional journals. He is active in community and professional groups and is a dedicated church worker.

The man who put FHSU grassland study on the international map realizes that a strong administration is necessary for an outstanding institution of higher education and he attacks that philosophy with the same degree of enthusiasm he used while teaching.

President Tomanek recognizes the importance that a strong athletic program plays in the total overall offerings of a well-rounded university and is committed to the belief that Fort Hays State University will be a leader both in the classroom and on the athletic fields.

Bob Van Poppel - Athletic Director

Bob Van Poppel, who brings with him strong and successful experience in the educational and private sectors, was named to the post of director of athletics at Fort Hays State University on April 22, 1985.

With a guideline in life of "strive for excellence, no excuses and no compromises," Van Poppel looks to make changes in the FHSU athletic only when needed. "I would like to take this first year to evaluate positions and personnel, get a specific idea of where we are going with athletics and have that developed in approximately 9-12 months," he says. Another goal of Van Poppel's is to make the quickest changes that will help the department in the way of revenue.

A native of Ohio, Van Poppel was highly successful in the insurance business in Richmond, IN, before coming to FHSU. His administrative background in athletics dates back to Earlham College in Richmond where he was athletic director from 1977 to 1982. He coordinated the entire athletic program for a small liberal arts college with an enrollment of 1,300. He was responsible for a total of 16 varsity sports which is similar to the eight men's and seven women's he will direct and manage for the Tigers.

Van Poppel has also held posts as a coach and instructor at Chadron (NE) State College (1973-77), Wittenburg (OH) University (1970-73) and Wisconsin-Whitewater (1969-70). He also held positions in athletics at the high school level in Ohio.

A four-year letter winner in basketball, Van Poppel received his B.S. degree in Education from Bowling Green State University in 1966. He earned a master's degree in Education from Ohio University in 1968. Indiana University was the site of advanced graduate work in administration for Van Poppel.

Bob and his wife, Lynne, have five children: Andra (14), Bret (16), Clete (10), Helen (24), and Tisha (14).

Bill Morse - Head Coach



When as a coach you direct your team to back-to-back national championships the honors start to roll in for you as well as your players. That is the scenario that Bill Morse has seen unfold.

The Tiger head man won NAIA National Coach-of-the-Year, NAIA Area 3 Coach-of-the-Year, Co-District 10 Coach-of-the-Year, CSIC Coach-of-the-Year and KABC (Kansas Association of Basketball Coaches) Coach-of-the-Year honors in 1985.

Morse has put together some of the best coaching credentials in the country, at any level. For example, Fort Hays State is 102-9 in three seasons with Morse at the helm and 23-1 in the NAIA National Championships. He has an .813 winning percentage in seven seasons at four-year collegiate institutions.

The native of Winona, Minnesota, played basketball at Winona State University. He earned degrees, a Bachelor of Arts and a Master's in Education, at Winona State. Morse coached at the high school level from 1964-71. He also held coaching positions at Dominican College (NY) and Alpena Community College (MI).

Morse came to Fort Hays State by way of Hillsdale College in Hillsdale, MI. He posted a 116-41 mark as the head coach at Hillsdale. The Chargers made one NAIA National Championship appearance under Morse's tutelage. They finished fourth in 1981. Morse's teams won over eighty percent of their games at Hillsdale in 1978-79 with a 24-6 record and 1980-81 with a 28-7 season total.

At 48 years old, Morse is the fourth winningest coach in FHSU basketball history with his 102 wins. He won his 100th victory when the Tigers defeated Athens State (AL)

in the third round of the 1985 NAIA Championships. His three-year won/loss percentage of .919 is by far the best by any Fort Hays State head coach.

With two consecutive national championships in 1984 and 1985, Morse's teams accomplished a feat that Kentucky State last did in 1971 and 1972 and no other team has done since. Only Kentucky State (1970, 1971 & 1972) and Tennessee State (1957, 1958 & 1959) have collected three straight championships.

The coaching accolades followed Morse from Hillsdale College to Fort Hays State. In his first season the Tiger mentor was selected as the CSIC and District 10 Coach-of-the-Year in 1982-83. Morse also garnered KBCA and NAIA Area 4 recognition that same year. He was also selected CSIC Coach-of-the-Year for the 1983-84 season.

Some of the more impressive numbers Morse has put together have to start with his CSIC road record. FHSU is 21-0 in away contests against CSIC opponents since Morse started his reign. The Tigers have been almost as good in the friendly confines of Gross Memorial Coliseum with a mark of 48-4 for a winning percentage of .923. In his eight-year tenure as a collegiate coach, Morse has had three consecutive seasons with over 30 wins, seven seasons of 20 or more victories and the most losses any of his teams have suffered was 13.

Morse Speaks Out

On his success with the Fort Hays State basketball program:

"I think we got some breaks and got off to a good start and had a good basketball team the first year. Having Nate Rollins, Rege Klitzke and Raymond Lee got us off to a great start and we immediately established a winning tradition. That tradition has kind of been carrying us, especially in close games over the last three years. The obvious things about Fort Hays State are the great program, great booster club, television and media coverage. I think we've recruited winners, guys who are quick, aggressive and fighters. The total picture has been one of being very gifted and highly motivated. All of those things go together to make a championship season."

On the Central State Intercollegiate Conference race:

"Obviously, our conference is an excellent league when you see several of them ranked nationally in a given year or several of them at the national tournament. Missouri Southern and Missouri Western are both traditionally tough basketball schools. Washburn, Emporia State, Fort Hays State and Pittsburg State are very good. Of course, Kearney State goes to nationals every year out of Nebraska. So, it makes it a tough, tough league. I think to make a prediction and rank teams in preseason is extremely difficult in basketball because everything depends on what they've got in new recruits. However, Emporia State returns the nucleus to be an immediate contender. Washburn returns one of the best players in the nation in Tom Meier. It is very difficult for me to judge the out-of-state school because we don't hear anything about them. I think it will be a tough race to predict, but we think we will be in the thick of it."

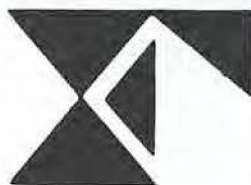
On the 1985-86 schedule:

"Even though we don't have a trip to Hawaii or a NCAA Division I school on it, it is the best schedule since I've been here because of the tremendous number of teams you can list [Briar Cliff (IA), Drury (MO), UMKC, Carson-Newman (TN), Central State (OK)] that are national powers. It really comes down to the fact that we're attempting to upgrade the schedule and get as many quality home games as we can. We're happy to be able to bring all of those teams in here. It's going to hurt our record. I don't think we will win the percentage of games we have in the past, but at the same time it may help us prepare for conference and the national playoffs."





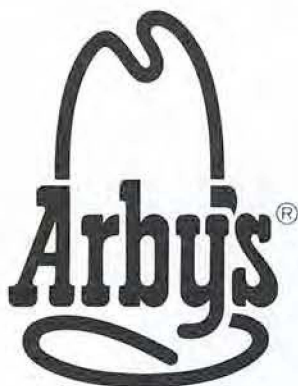

Nancy and her husband, Bob, live in Russell where she commutes to work. They are the parents of a daughter, Kelly, and a son, Mark.



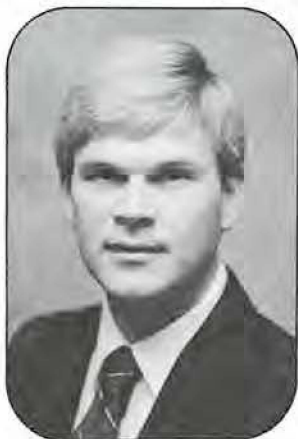
Ed McNeil

Gross Memorial Coliseum

Gross Memorial Coliseum is the home of the Fort Hays State "Fighting Tigers." The 7,000-seat arena was finished in August of 1973 at a cost of 7 million dollars. The Tigers made the move across campus from Sheridan Coliseum which seated 2,000. Paul "Busch" Gross is the namesake of the Coliseum. Gross coached basketball at FHSU from 1930 to 1946 and totaled 150 wins and 88 losses in 14 seasons.

The Coliseum has most recently been the sight of three District 10 Championship wins for Bill Morse's teams. In the Morse era, the Tigers have compiled a three-year record of 48-4 for a winning percentage of .923 at Gross Memorial Coliseum. Fort Hays State led the nation (non-NCAA institutions) in home attendance during the 1984-85 season with an average crowd of 4,757 per game and 66,595 total attendance in 17 games.

In the first game ever played at Gross Memorial Coliseum on November 30, 1973, Fort Hays State defeated East Central State (OK) University, 74-68. Chuck Brehm coached the first team to play at GMC and his team won 11 of 14 contests that first season. Also in that historical first game, Greg Standish scored a game high 20 points and nine rebounds.

M.C. Cunningham Hall is part of the total Health, Physical Education and Recreation/Athletic complex at Fort Hays State. Cunningham Hall houses HPER offices, classrooms, a swimming pool, four full-sized gymnasiums, eight handball/racquetball courts, a weight room, two dance studios, a wrestling room and a gymnastics room.

Gross Memorial Coliseum is a multi-purpose facility that hosts concerts (seating for 10,000), the KSHSAA

State 1A Basketball Tournament, the KSHSAA State 1A-2A-3A Wrestling Championships and indoor track meets. The Coliseum houses the FHSU athletic offices, a large athletic training room, locker rooms, concession stands, press box and the newest addition is the Fields Weight Room which features full nautilus equipment, mirrors and a full-time supervisor.

Fort Hays State University takes pride in its basketball facility and sees it as one of the most modern and comprehensive complexes in the country.
