Celebrate Undergraduate Research Week - Wednesday's Tip

Promote programs and retention

Developing a culture of undergraduate research within a department or academic discipline is also a great way to promote your programs and support retention. Success begets success. Therefore, departments can use the undergraduate research experience to recruit on-campus and transfer students as well as traditional, first-time freshmen. In addition, departments can recognize their student researchers by posting their accomplishments in their respective buildings, on departmental websites and other marketing materials.
