### **IMPORTANT: Student Time Entry in Workday Information and Videos**

Managers – Please pass the below information on to student workers in your department.

Students will be logging in to Workday, using their TigerNetID and Password, starting **April 9<sup>th</sup>**. Below are links to PDF procedures, employees and students will need to log in with your TigerNetID and password to view the PDF. There are also short videos to assist with student time entry.

**Hourly Students:** Hourly students will be checking in/out for each of their work shifts. If a student has multiple positions, they will need to select the position for the correct job when they are checking in. Hourly Students will need to submit

their timesheet and certify their effort at the end of the pay period and the manager must approve the time sheet by the end of the day Tuesday, following the pay period end date.

**Salary Students:** Salary students will need to log in to Workday, at the end of the pay period, and submit their timesheet. An Exempt Certification block will auto-populate on the Salary student's timesheet each Monday. This will allow salary students to submit their timesheet and certify their effort. Once the timesheet is submitted and effort is certified, the student's timesheet will go to the manager for approval. These must be submitted and approved by the end of the day Tuesday, following the pay period end date.

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## Faculty Funding Opportunities

Two separate funding opportunities have been made available through the Provost's office to promote experiential-learning at Fort Hays State University. Experiential-learning incorporates high impact educational practices that take many forms, both curricular and co-curricular, including but not limited to internships, practicums, service-learning projects, and undergraduate research.

The first funding opportunity is the Experiential-Learning Innovation Grant. This grant will provide funding to implement a new experiential-learning component into an existing course that has not previously included such activity; or enhance a class project into an existing course with an experiential-learning component already in place. This grant is awarded as a reimbursement grant in the amounts of either \$500.00 for implementation of a new project or \$250.00 for enhancement of an existing project. Applications will be accepted for the summer and/or fall 2017 semesters.

The second funding opportunity is the Provost's Service-Learning Faculty Fellow Program. This program will provide an opportunity for selected faculty to gain an understanding and appreciation of service-learning with the intent of integrating and applying this knowledge to the institution's curricular, research and service functions. This program is funded as a \$1500.00 stipend to those awarded the fellowship. Applications will be accepted for the 2017 – 18 academic year.

The deadline to apply for each award is **April 14, 2017**. Recipients of each award will be notified of their selection in writing by **May 5, 2017**.
