Fountain dedication
set for June 14

Dedication ceremonies for a 15-foot tall, reflective-pool fountain in honor of former FHSU registrars, Standlee V. Dalton and James V. Kellermen are set for 9:30 a.m., Saturday, June 14 near Tomanek Hall on the FHSU campus. The public is invited.

The two men spent 64 years of their lives as member of the FHSU faculty, including 57 years as registrar.

Area middle school children helped create the sculpture, under the director of Dr. Placido Arturo Hoernicke '91. Hoernicke, director of professional services in the College of Education, conceptualized the project. Hoernicke, members of the department of art and campus construction crews will assemble the fountain.

Dalton joined the faculty as an instructor of biology in 1935. He was registrar from 1938 until his retirement 1971. Kellerman joined the faculty in 1967 as an instructor of business administration and served as registrar from 1971 until his retirement in 1995. It is estimated that together, the men signed 35,650 diplomas.

The fountain projected is being funded through a grant from the Jean Stouffer Estate at FHSU. The late Ms. Stouffer was associate dean of students for more than 20 years. She suggested the funds from her estate be used to improve the beauty of the campus.
