FOUNTAIN DEDICATION  
SET FOR JUNE 14 AT FHSU

HAYS, KS.---Fort Hays State University invites the public to dedication ceremonies for a 15-foot tall, reflective-pool fountain which honors former registrars Standlee V. Dalton and James V. Kellerman.

The program is set for 9:30 a.m., Saturday, June 14, in the courtyard of Tomanek Hall on the FHSU campus.

Together, the men spent 64 years as members of the FHSU faculty. Fifty-seven of those years, the men held the position of university registrar. It is estimated that the two men signed approximately 35,650 diplomas of FHSU graduates.

Area middle school children helped create the sculpture, under the direction of Dr. Placido Arturo Hoernicke, director of professional services, FHSU College of Education.

Hoernicke and members of the department of art are assembling the sculpture. Hoernicke and campus construction crews will build the reflective pool and erect the sculpture.

Dalton joined the faculty as an instructor of biology in 1935. He became registrar in 1938 and served until his retirement in 1971.

Kellerman joined the faculty in 1967 as an instructor of business administration. He became registrar in 1971 and served until his retirement in 1995.

The fountain project is being funded through a grant from the Stouffer Fund at the university. Prior to her death in 1976, Jean Stouffer, who was associate dean of students at FHSU for more than 20 years, left the university a sizable estate and suggested that funds be used to improve the beauty of the campus.
