Excerpt from minutes of the Board of Directors, Kansas Frontier
Historical Park, June 13, 1934

The Board instructed Mr. Rarick to confer with city and
county officials, and with them to communicate with the State
Board of Health, regarding the disposal of sewage as it relates
to the State Park. The Board also instructed Mr. Rarick to in-
form the public through the press that the Board will not
authorize swimming in the Park.

Memorandum

State Park, and Public Health

June 25, 1934

This is a memorandum of a meeting between the city commissioners of Hays, the county and city health officer, and the acting chairman of the Park Board of Managers, on the subject of sewage disposal. Present, City Manager, F. J. Haffmier; Health officer, Dr. G. C. Unrein; J. E. Rouse and C. E. Rarick. The question of sewage disposal was brought up and discussed rather thoroughly. It was agreed:

1. That better sewage disposal was imperative for
 - a. City of Hays
 - b. The State College and girl's dormitory
 - c. The Fort Hays Experiment Station

2. That we were to work forward toward the correcting of these situations as rapidly as possible. That Mr. Rarick would take up the matter of a request for a Government loan when he is in Washington next week. That he will take with him data for such request, and present it as forcibly as possible to the Federal government.

3. Dr. Unrein will have the water in the wells on government property along Big Creek tested.

4. Mr. Rarick will cause to be put up signs along the creek, not later than Friday morning of this week, warning against swimming in the waters of Big Creek on state property.
