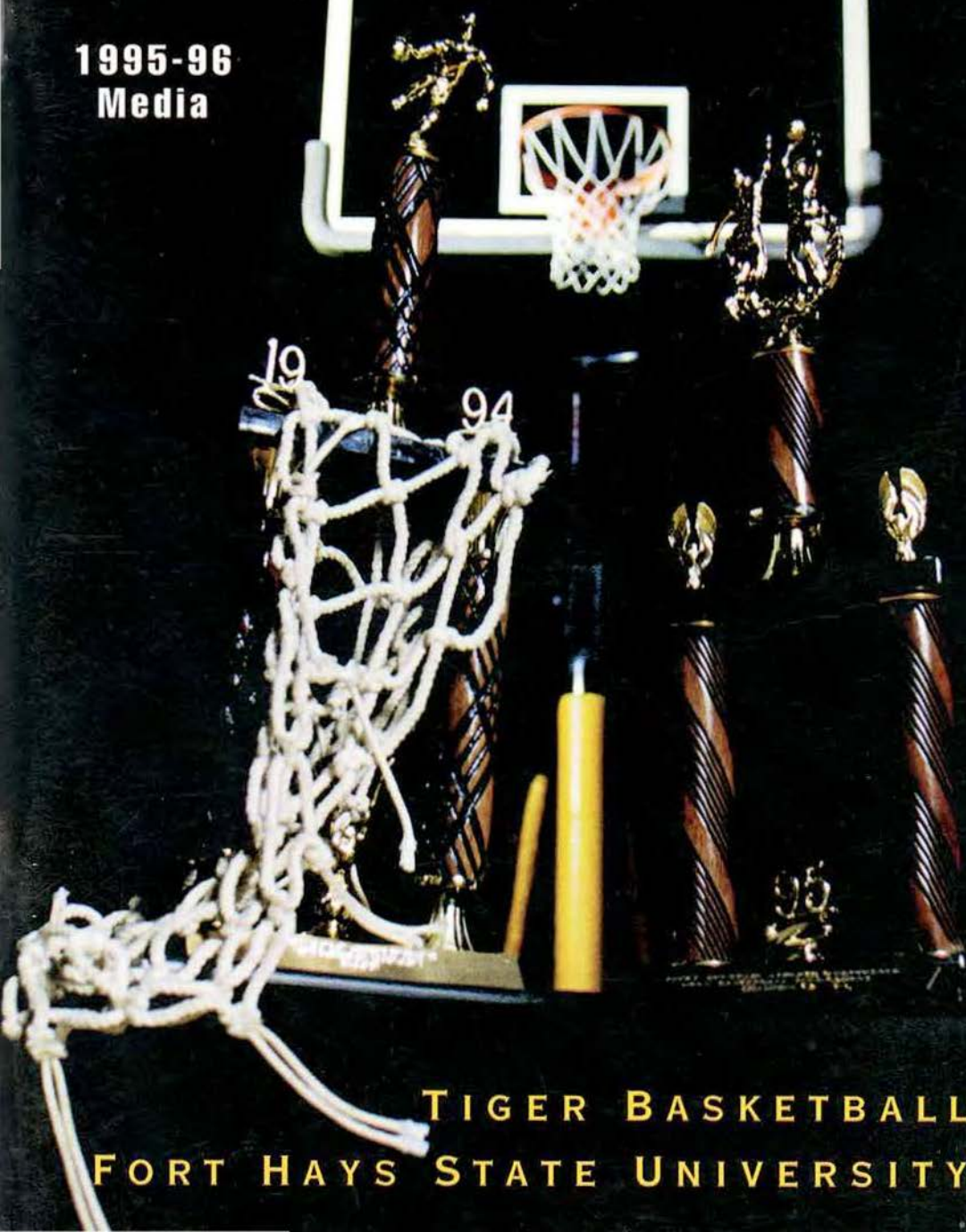

# ◆ Gross Memorial Coliseum ◆



Gross Memorial Coliseum is the home of the Fort Hays State "Fighting Tigers" and is celebrating its 23rd season this year. The 7,000-seat arena was finished in August of 1973 at a cost of seven million dollars. The Tigers made the move across campus from Sheridan Coliseum which seated 2,000. Paul "Busch" Gross is the namesake of the Coliseum. Gross coached basketball at FHSU from 1930 to 1946 and totaled 150 wins and 88 losses in 14 seasons. GMC received a new 1/8 inch layer of Proturf in October of 1988 to replenish the cracked and discolored surface after 15 years.

In the first game ever played at Gross Memorial Coliseum on November 30, 1973, FHSU defeated East Central State (OK) University, 74-68. Chuck Brehm coached the first team to play at GMC and his squad won 11 of 14 home contests that year. Also in that historical first game, Greg Standish scored a game high 20 points and pulled down nine rebounds.

M.C. Cunningham Hall is part of the total Health, Physical Education and Recreation/Athletic complex at Fort Hays State. Cunningham Hall houses HPER offices, classrooms, a swimming pool, four full-sized gymnasiums, eight handball/racquetball courts, a weight room, two dance studios, a wrestling room and the Ed McNeil Gymnastics Room.

Gross Memorial Coliseum is a multi-purpose facility that hosts concerts (seating for 10,000), the KSHSAA State 1A Basketball Tournament, the KSHSAA State 3-2-1A Wrestling Championships, KSHSAA 2A-1A State Volleyball Championships and indoor track meets including the Alex Francis Invitational. The Coliseum houses the FHSU athletic offices, a large athletic training room, locker rooms, concession stands, a press box and the newest addition is the Fields Weight Room which features full nautical equipment, free weights, mirrors and a full-time supervisor.

# ◆1995-96 Tiger Basketball Outlook◆

The 1994-95 Fort Hays State basketball team captured the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Tournament for the second consecutive season to qualify for the NCAA II playoffs. The Tigers came within one win of a trip to the NCAA II Elite Eight when they reached the finals of the North Central Regional which was held in FHSU's Gross Memorial Coliseum. Morningside College edged the Tigers 85-82 before the home crowd.

Six veterans return from last year's squad that finished 24-7 and posted FHSU's second consecutive 20 win season. FHSU was 21-9 in 1993-94 and now has recorded back to back 20 plus win seasons for the first time since 1989. Head coach Gary Garner became only the second coach in school history to win 20 games in two consecutive seasons. Three starters are gone from a year ago, one being CoSIDA NCAA II Player of the Year and two-time Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference MVP Dennis Edwards. Edwards finished third on the school's scoring list and established 10 new school records during his two-year career. Also gone is the team's number four scorer in small forward Steven McKelvey who was a two-year starter and was twice named to the RMAC All-Tournament squad.

FHSU finished the RMAC season at 10-4, one game back in the league race. As a team the Tigers set four school records: points in a game with 123 versus Sterling College, average points per game, 93.3, three-point shots made in season, 238 and most points scored in two consecutive games, 238, 123 versus Sterling College and 115 against Emporia State. The 93.3 points per game eclipsed the old mark of 90.2 points per game set the year before by the 1993-94 team.

## GUARDS

The Tiger backcourt returns two seniors who bring a wealth of experience to this year's squad in point guard Chad Creamer and shooting guard Geoff Eck. The Hays product Creamer started 16-

of-31 games last season averaging 4.9 points and 3.1 assists per game. His 3.1 assists per game was third on the team and a FHSU career high. Creamer has started 42-of-87 games in his first three seasons in the Black & Gold. Despite starting only two games a year ago, Eck was second on the team in minutes played at 25.5 per game. Look for Eck to take his 12.4 points per game, third on the team, into the starting lineup this year. Eck led not only FHSU but the RMAC in three-point shooting percentage, 42.7. His 2.8 three-point shots made per game was second in the conference.

Sophomore newcomer Earl Tyson is expected to see considerable playing time and even challenge for a starting spot in his first season. Tyson last played during the 1993-94 season for Midland Community College, Midland, TX where he averaged 8.4 points and 3.2 assists per game playing behind Andre Owens. Owens was the starting point guard for an Oklahoma State team that reached the NCAA I Final Four last year. Last year Tyson attended Indian Hills Community College but did not play basketball after transferring from Midland CC. As a prep athlete he played for national high school power Dunbar High School, Washington, D.C., where he was named MVP of the conference and Washington, D.C. City Championship game. He averaged 18 points, seven assists and seven steals his senior year for a 40-1 squad that won the mythical national high school championship.

Veterans Lance Hammond and Matt Garner round out the backcourt. Hammond a 6'1", 180-pound two guard is a senior from Hays, KS who played in 15 games a year ago. He is a two-year FHSU letter winner who is beginning his third season as a member of the basketball squad. Garner, a junior, saw action in 22 games last season following a redshirt year in 1993-94. Garner will play a backup role at the point guard spot.

## FRONT COURT

Alonzo Goldston and Jeremie Kester are the only two frontcourt players who return from last season. Goldston, 6'9 1/2", took over as the team's starting center in game seven at Emporia State and responded with 30 points and 12 rebounds. He went on to capture North Central Regional MVP honors following a 24 point, 16 rebound performance versus North Dakota State and a 28 point, 15 rebound outing the next night versus Morningside College. Additional honors included being named to the RMAC All-Tournament team and RMAC second team. Goldston led the team in rebounding (8.6rpg) and was second in

scoring (17.2ppg). He was ranked in five RMAC categories at the end of last season: blocks (1st, 2.4bpg), rebounds (3rd, 8.6rpg), steals (4th, 1.8spg), field goal percentage (5th, 57.5%) and scoring (11th, 17.2ppg). A nine block performance against Western State was a RMAC record.

Kester, 6'8", started eight games a year ago mostly at center. In 15.7 minutes of play he averaged 3.3 points and 2.4 rebounds per game. He will again play both forward and center primarily in a reserve role this season.

Transfers Mark Eck, Anthony Pope and Sherick Simpson are expected to be key contributors in their first season in the Black & Gold. Eck, 6'3", is the younger brother of Geoff and comes to FHSU after one season at NCAA I Lamar University. At LU he played in 23 games earning starts in eight averaging 4.4 points per game. Prior to attending LU he played one season at Butler County Community College (KS) where he led Kansas Junior Colleges in three-point shooting and finished second in the nation at 51.5 percent.

Pope is another outstanding outside shooter who connected on 88-of-261 three-pointers (33.7%) starring for San Jacinto Junior College (TX). At, 6'4", 218-pounds, the left-hander can also take the ball inside and score. Last season he averaged 13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds per game.

Simpson is the tallest of the newcomers at 6'6" and 200-pounds. In two years at Elgin Community College (IL) he averaged 16 points and 10 rebounds per outing. His freshman year he averaged 20.3 points, 12.3 rebounds and shot 57.7 percent from the floor in 10 conference games in being named Skyway Conference MVP. According to his junior college coach he played all five positions while at ECC.

Look for these three transfers to be a key to the Tigers success this season. All three will be counted on to play multiple positions with Eck and Pope seeing time at shooting guard.

Haviland, KS native Brooke Thompson sat out last season as a redshirt after transferring to FHSU from Garden City Community College. Thompson learned the system practicing with the team a year ago and will play small forward and shooting guard this season. He has great range with his shot



and should see action off the bench for the Tigers.

Kansas junior college transfer Matt Starkey adds height to the frontcourt. Starkey, a native of Colby, KS, averaged 6.7 points and 4.2 rebounds starting all 31 games for Dodge City Community College a year ago. Look for Starkey to play a key reserve role in his first season in the Black & Gold.

## THE SCHEDULE

The Tiger basketball schedule includes two NCAA II teams that qualified for post season play a year ago in Washburn University and Mesa State College. The RMAC schedule will again be challenging for a young team which includes six new faces. Nebraska-Kearney begins conference play this season which should make winning the conference a tougher task in 1995-96. FHSU last won the RMAC in 1992 in coach Garner's first season. Also dotting the Tiger schedule are tough nonconference games with Emporia State and Pittsburg State.

## ◆ Dr. Edward H. Hammond - President ◆



Dr. Edward H. Hammond, is the eighth President of Fort Hays State University. President Hammond, a man of boundless enthusiasm and energy, whose style is upbeat and progressive, was born in McAllen, Texas, but reared in the Kansas City, Kansas area.

Prior to his current post, President Hammond gained educational experiences and shared his expertise at the universities of Louisville, Seton Hall, Southern Illinois, Purdue, and Missouri-Colum-

bia. The President holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Emporia State University and the Ph.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

President Hammond has been extremely active since assuming the leadership of the University in the summer of 1987. He laid the groundwork for a cooperative educational initiative between FHSU and the community colleges in Western Kansas; has watched his dream to totally computerize the campus become a reality; created an organization comprised of business and community leaders from 54 Western Kansas counties and helped to establish scholarship programs for potential minority school teachers at Garden City and Liberal.

He has played a major role in furthering economic development in Hays and Western Kansas and introduced a voice mail system that vaulted the

foreign language efforts of FHSU into an elite class. He prompted the completion of the Beach/Schmidt Performing Arts Center for the cultural development of the area and launched the expansion of Sternberg Museum to a new location soon on Interstate 70. He obtained federal and state funding for the university's new \$12 million science building and completed a \$20 million Capital Campaign to raise private monies for the enhancement of many university programs.

President Hammond has published widely and is in demand nationally as an educational consultant because of his expertise in risk management, staff and institutional liability, sexual harassment, and alcohol education issues.

The Hammond family includes wife Viv (Hammeke), formerly of Ellinwood, daughters Kelly and Julie, and son Lance.

## ◆ Tom Spicer - Director of Athletics ◆



Tom Spicer was named director of athletics at Fort Hays State University on July 27, 1989. Spicer is starting his sixth year as director of athletics and has emphasized a return to athletic and academic excellence.

A native of Beaver, OK, Spicer attended secondary schools in Hays. He is a graduate of Hays High School and earned a bachelor of sci-

ence degree from Fort Hays State in 1972. He played varsity football for the Tigers during his collegiate days. Spicer received his master of science degree from FHSU in 1977. He is completing a specialist in education degree with work at both Southeastern Oklahoma State University and The Wichita State University.

Spicer is largely responsible for the improvements that were made to Lewis Field Stadium. Through his continued efforts the 1936 stadium was renovated with new synthetic surfaces on both the football field and track. The native limestone structure was sandblasted to its original color. His fund-raising efforts have led to improved funding of the Tiger athletic programs, allowing student athletes the opportunity to attend FHSU.

Prior to making the move back to FHSU, Spicer was the director of athletics and dean of student affairs at Butler County Community College. He also has experience as director of athletics, physical education instructor, head football coach and track coach for the Durant, OK, School District.

Previous to his work in Oklahoma, he taught and coached at Salina South High School, at Bishop Miege High School in Shawnee Mission and at Schlagle High School in Kansas City, KS.

Spicer is married to the former Kathy McGovern of Colorado Springs, CO. She received a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Fort Hays State in 1972. The Spicers have four children: Matt, Amber, Kristen and Allison.



# ◆ Gary Garner Head Coach ◆



Head coach Gary Garner begins his fifth season as head of the FHSU basketball program. Garner, 75-42 in four years at FHSU, is fifth on the FHSU victories list and needs 15 victories to reach the coveted 200 career win mark. He became only the second coach in school history to record back-to-back 20 win seasons when the Tigers

7 in 1973-74.

He left the junior college ranks for a one year stint at Missouri Southern State College where he coached against FHSU in the now defunct Central States Intercollegiate Conference. The Lions posted a 15-15 record at Missouri Southern under Garner.

He then returned to Missouri to serve as an assistant with Norm Stewart. While Garner was on the staff at Mizzou, the Tigers won two Big Eight titles and three times advanced to the NCAA post-season tournament. Garner is credited with recruiting such standout players as Steve Stipanovich and Jon Sunvold who led the Tigers to four straight conference titles, two of which followed his departure for Drake.

Highlights of Garner's career at Drake include the NIT berth in 1986, DU's first post-season berth since 1981 and only third in 20 years. He was named the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 1981-82 and runner-up for the same honor in 1986. In his first season at Drake, Garner's squad led the MVC in scoring defense. The Bulldogs again led the league in scoring defense in 1985-86 while also posting the best numbers in points scored per game. Garner left DU as the school's third winningest coach all-time with 95 victories.

Garner and his wife Barbara are the parents of two boys, Matt and Jon. Matt is a junior on the FHSU basketball team.

posted a 21-9 mark in 1993-94 and followed that up with a 24-7 record a year ago. Not only did the Tigers attain 20 wins for the second consecutive season, they captured the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Tournament and qualified for the NCAA II Tournament for the second straight year. FHSU was within one win of the NCAA II Elite Eight reaching the North Central Regional final hosted in Gross Memorial Coliseum. The Tigers lost a hard fought battle 85-82 to Morningside College.

Garner had been out of coaching for two years prior to being named the 12th men's basketball coach at FHSU on April 16, 1991. He spent seven years at Drake University which competes on the NCAA II level. Garner took the Bulldogs to the National Invitational Tournament in 1986 in a season that Drake compiled a 19-11 record.

During his two years away from coaching, Garner remained active in basketball as a color analyst for Iowa State University television games. He also worked in the real estate business.

The West Plains, MO native earned a scholarship to the University of Missouri following a stellar prep career where he was named a first team all-state guard. Garner was a three-year varsity letter winner at Missouri. As a senior captain he averaged 15 points a game earning second team all-conference honors as the Tigers placed third in the Big Eight.

Following his playing days at Mizzou, Garner stayed on from 1965-67 as the teams graduate assistant. He coached at Kemper Military Academy in Boonville, MO (1967-71) and later was head coach and athletic director at Trenton Junior College in Trenton, MO. At Trenton, from 1971-76, Garner's team compiled a mark of 95-42, including a best mark of 22-
