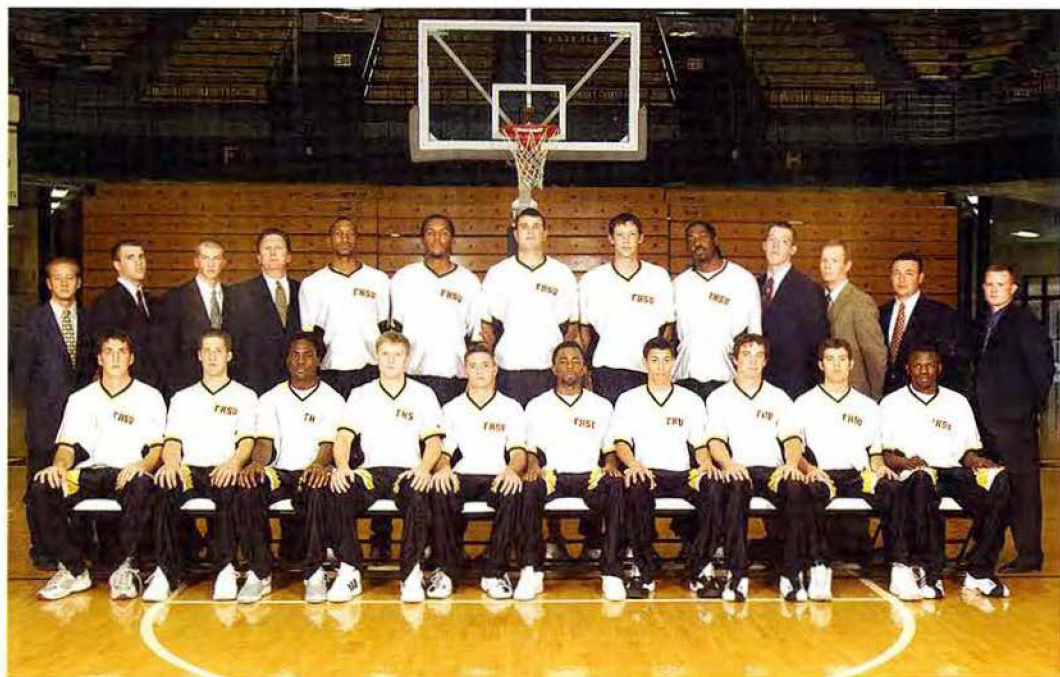

Fort Hays State University GROSS MEMORIAL COLISEUM



Gross Memorial Coliseum is the home of the Fort Hays State "Fighting Tigers" and is celebrating its 27th season this year. The 6,814-seat arena was finished in August of 1973 at a cost of seven million dollars. The Tigers made the move across campus from Sheridan Coliseum which seated 2,000. Paul "Busch" Gross is the namesake of the Coliseum. Gross coached basketball at FHSU from 1930 to 1946 and totaled 150 wins and 88 losses in 14 seasons. Prior to the start of the 1996-97 season several changes were made to GMC. The major renovation was the installation of a new permanent wood floor. Other additions include the construction of new locker rooms and the remodelling of two existing locker rooms. The sound system was upgraded with the addition of 16 speakers and a new sound board which allows for programming of music, messages and sound effects. Prior to the 1997-98 season two new message boards were installed that provide game replays.

In the first game ever played at Gross Memorial Coliseum on November 30, 1973, FHSU defeated East Central State (OK) University, 74-68. Chuck Brehm coached the first team to play at GMC and his squad won 11 of 14 home contests that year. Also in that historical first game, Greg Standish scored a game high 20 points and pulled down nine rebounds.

M.C. Cunningham Hall is part of the total Health, Physical Education and Recreation/Athletic complex at Fort Hays State. Cunningham Hall houses HPER offices, classrooms, a swimming pool, four full-sized gymnasiums, eight handball/racquetball courts, a weight room, two dance studios, a wrestling room.

Gross Memorial Coliseum is a multi-purpose facility that hosts concerts (seating for 10,000), the KSHSAA State 1A Basketball Tournament, the KSHSAA State 3-2-1A Wrestling Championships, and the KSHSAA 2A-1A State Volleyball Championships. The Coliseum houses the FHSU athletic offices, a large athletic training room, locker rooms, conces-

sion stands, a press box and the Field Weight Room which features full nautilus equipment, free weights, and mirrors.

THE ADMINISTRATION

Edward H. Hammond - President



Dr. Edward H. Hammond is the eighth President of Fort Hays State University. A man of boundless enthusiasm and energy, whose style is upbeat and progressive, Dr. Hammond was born in McAllen, Texas, but reared in the Kansas City area.

Prior to his current post, President Hammond gained educational experiences and shared his expertise at the universities of Louisville, Seton Hall, Southern Illinois, Purdue, and Missouri-Columbia. The President holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Emporia State University and the Ph.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

President Hammond has been extremely active since assuming the leadership of the university in the summer of 1987. He laid the groundwork for a cooperative educational initiative between FHSU and the community colleges in western Kansas; has watched his dream to totally computerize the campus become a reality; created an organization comprised of business and community leaders from 54 western Kansas counties and helped to establish scholarship programs for potential minority school teachers at Garden City and Liberal.

Dr. Hammond has played a major role in furthering economic development in Hays and western Kansas and introduced a voice mail system that vaulted the foreign language efforts of FHSU into an elite class. He prompted the completion of the Beach/Schmidt Performing Arts Center for the cultural development of the area and launched the expansion of Sternberg Museum to its new location on Interstate 70. He obtained federal and state funding for the university's new \$12 million science building and completed a \$20 million Capital Campaign to raise private monies for the enhancement of many university programs.

President Hammond has published widely and is in demand nationally as an educational consultant because of his expertise in risk management, staff and institutional liability, sexual harassment, and alcohol education issues.

The Hammond family includes wife Viv (Hammeke), formerly of Ellinwood, daughters Kelly and Julie, and son Lance.

Tom Spicer - Athletic Director



Tom Spicer was named director of athletics at Fort Hays State University on July 27, 1989. Spicer begins his thirteenth year as director of athletics and has emphasized a return to athletic and academic excellence.

A native of Beaver, Oklahoma, Spicer attended secondary schools in Hays. He is a graduate of Hays High School and earned a bachelor of science degree from Fort Hays State University in 1972. He played varsity football for the Tigers during his collegiate days. Spicer also received his master of science degree from FHSU in 1977.

Spicer is largely responsible for the improvements that were made to Lewis Field Stadium. Through his continued efforts the 1936 stadium was renovated with new synthetic surfaces on both the football field and track. The native limestone structure was sandblasted to its original color. A new two-story press box on the west side of the stadium is a welcome addition to stadium. Spicer's fund-raising efforts have led to improved financial support of the Tiger athletic programs, allowing student athletes the opportunity to attend FHSU.

Prior to making the move back to FHSU Spicer was the director of athletics and dean of student affairs at Butler County Community College. He also has experience as director of athletics, physical education instructor, head football coach and track coach for the Durant, Oklahoma, School District.

Previous to his work in Oklahoma, he taught and coached at Salina South High School, at Bishop Miege High School in Shawnee Mission and at Schlagle High School in Kansas City, Kansas.

Spicer is married to the former Kathy McGovern of Denver, Colorado. She received a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Fort Hays State in 1972. The Spicers have four children: Matt, Amber, Kristen and Allison.

HEAD COACH - MARK JOHNSON



Mark Johnson enters his first season of directing the Fort Hays State University men's basketball program after being named head

coach on July 13, 2001. Johnson is the 14th men's basketball coach in the school's 83 years of collegiate basketball.

Johnson served as the Tigers' interim coach following Gary Garner's departure to Southeast Missouri State University prior to the start of the 1997-98 season. Prior to coming to FHSU Johnson was the assistant coach at Phillips University, Enid, Okla.

He coached the 1994-95 season at Labette Community College under Rand Chappell and then moved along with Chappell to Phillips University. Following his playing career at Pittsburg State University he spent two seasons as the Gorillas graduate assistant.

Following a senior season that garnered him All-America, All-State, All-Metro and All-Conference honors at Omaha Millard South High School he played basketball at Kilgore Junior College, Kilgore, Texas. His sophomore year he was selected to the Texas Eastern Athletic Conference Academic Team.

Johnson played two seasons at Pittsburg State University where he earned Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association honors twice and All-South Region honors as a senior.

Johnson received his associate degree from Kilgore Junior College in 1991, bachelor's degree from PSU in 1993 and a master's degree from PSU in 1994.

Dave Shepherd - Assistant Coach



Dave Shepherd enters his first season as the Tigers assistant coach. He was hired by new head coach Mark Johnson during the summer prior to this season.

Prior to coming to Fort Hays State University, Shepherd was coordinator of basketball operations at the University of New Mexico during the 2000-01 season.

Shepherd served as an assistant coach at Trinity Valley Community College in Athens, Texas, from 1995-2000. While at TVCC, he was part of three 20-win seasons including a seventh-place showing in the 1999 National Tournament. He helped place a total of 16 players in Division I and II basketball programs.

From 1993-95, Shepherd was an assistant at West Texas A&M University in Canyon, Texas, where he helped the team to a Lone Star Championship and NCAA II first-round appearance in 1994. He coached in the Texas high school ranks for eight seasons prior to his position at WTAMU.

The Wilmington, Del., native is a 1979 graduate of the University of Dayton with a bachelor's degree in Physical Education. He earned a master's of education degree in 1980 from the College of New Jersey, where he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant.

Shepherd and wife Jena have two children, ages 18 and 23.

Jeremy Brown - Graduate Assistant



Jeremy Brown begins his first season as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff. As the Tigers' graduate assistant his duties include recruiting, conditioning, scouting and video exchange.

Brown served as a student assistant for the FHSU men's basketball program from 1998-2000.

As a player, the Mulvane, Kan., native played two years of collegiate basketball at Friends University from 1996-98. Brown played basketball and football at Mulvane High School where he was a first-team all-league selection in both. He was a first team All-Class 4A football selection at defensive back as a senior.

Brown completed a bachelor's degree in Elementary Education from FHSU last spring. He began work on a master's degree in Sports Administration this fall.

Shawn Terry - Student Assistant



Shawn Terry will serve as a student assistant with the basketball team this season after attending Kansas State University the last four years.

Terry previously served as the basketball and track & field coach at Manhattan Junior High School from 2000-01. He spent the 1998 football season as an athletic trainer for Bill Snyder's Wildcats at KSU.

A native of Great Bend, Kan., Terry graduated from Great Bend High School in 1996. He attended Barton County Community College where he participated on the practice squad with Cougar basketball team.

Q & A WITH MARK JOHNSON

He's been an assistant coach at Fort Hays State since 1996 under two different head coaches. He has also watched as three Tiger teams qualified for the NCAA Tournament. Now, Mark Johnson gets his chance to continue the tradition of basketball excellence after being named the new head coach at FHSU this past summer.

Before beginning his first season as the Tigers new coach, Johnson sat down with FHSU Sports Information Director and "Voice of the Tigers" Steve Webster to talk about his new challenge.

How do you feel heading into this season knowing you are now the head coach at Fort Hays State University?

"It's a great honor to be associated with Fort Hays. After five years as an assistant, I know and understand the tradition and expectations that go with being the head coach here. I'm excited to get the season started and excited about this opportunity."

Describe your coaching philosophy and coaching style.

"Obviously I want us to play hard and have a great work ethic with our team. I want my players to show character and have discipline. That includes doing the right thing, whether it's getting to class or practice on time or doing the necessary things to prepare for an opponent. I want our fans to be proud of our team both on and off the court."

You've worked with some very good head coaches. How much will that affect the type of coach you are?

"I've been fortunate to work with coaches like Gary Garner, Chad Wintz and Rand Chappell. I think you take a little something from all of them. You certainly want to be your own person, but you try to take the things that you really liked when you worked with them and the things that were successful and implement them into your own program. Just being around those guys has given me an advantage."

What are your concerns heading into the 2001-2002 season?

"Our defense. We have to be a very good defensive team and we have to rebound the basketball. If we don't do those two things, everything else doesn't really matter. I think we can be a good defensive and rebounding team but with so many new players, it may take some time to develop that chemistry. We are changing some things on the defensive end so even our returning players will have to learn our new defense."

What are some of those changes?

"One thing that won't change is the fact that we still want to play pressure man-to-man defense. There are a few minor changes in how we will set our defense up but I don't want to go into that right now. I think our fans will quickly notice those changes when they see us play for the first time."

What about changes to the offense?

"Again, you'll see some things that are different and some things that are the same. We'll probably run less motion than we have in the past and run more isolation for certain players in different situations and things like that. We also want to push the ball a little bit more but that depends on whether our team can take care of the ball in transition."

What excites you about this year's team?

The thing that has excited me the most during the pre-season is the fact that we really have a good group of guys. They're willing to learn, have been very coachable, they're doing the right things and they have been getting along as a family. That's definitely a good start."

Let's take a look at your backcourt. What do you think?

"Our point guard position is solid with the return of Aulston Martin and Geoff Riley. The year of D-II experience that they picked up last year is so valuable. I'm really looking for those guys to play well, be great leaders and understand their roles. You have to be solid at the point to win at this level. Riley will also see time at the two guard. Other players we are counting on in the backcourt include Jim Rhodes, Jared Eck, Ike Smith and Chaun Ballard. We've increased our athleticism in the backcourt this season and I think we have more playmakers than

we've had in the past."

What about the forward spot?

"I think the key to our forward position this season is the versatility our players have. Joe Ward can play both forward positions and may be the most exciting player on our team to watch this season. Adam Hawley is also versatile and we'll be looking for more production from him this season both on offense and on the glass. The new guys we've added like Melroy McKelvey and George Walker will add bulk which will help us against the more physical teams we face in the North Central Region. I think our versatility will allow us to play either big or small without losing anything."

What about the middle?

"Like a lot of other D-II programs, there isn't much difference between our four and our five position. Walker and Gunderson are the only two guys on our roster that are even listed as centers, but Hawley and McKelvey can also play the five. The only real difference in who plays the four or the five is who will be guarding our opponent's bigger guy on defense."

What are your keys to a successful season?

"We have a nice group of guys coming back, good players who have been through the wars and guys we can really count on. But to take it to the next level this season, we definitely need some of the newcomers to step up and be impact players. If they can do that,

I really feel good about our chances. If they don't step up, I am concerned. But with the group we have coming back and the new players we have added to the program, I think we have a chance to be pretty good."

What about the 2001-2002 schedule?"

"Our non-conference schedule is solid with a home and home with Rockhurst, a home game against Emporia State and the exhibition game at the University of Kansas. The KU game will be a great opportunity for us. First of all it's a great experience for our players to get a taste of that atmosphere in Allen Fieldhouse. But it's also a great way to measure where you are at very early in the season. They can and will exploit your weaknesses which sometimes is a more effective way of coaching. Just telling the players they are doing something wrong isn't as effective as them learning it for themselves in a game situation."

What about the RMAC this year?

"I think the teams that are always near the top will be there again.

Metro State and Kearney are going to be really good. They have a lot of players coming back and will once again be fighting for the conference championship. Mesa State and Southern Colorado will once again be the teams to beat in the West. But this year I do think some teams that have traditionally been lower tier programs are going to make some noise. Teams like Adams State and Fort Lewis have really improved and will be teams that will be difficult to beat, especially at their place. Unfortunately we have to play both those teams on the road this season."

What about Dave Shepherd, your new assistant coach?

"I'm fortunate to have coach Shepherd with me for my first season as a head coach. He has a wealth of basketball knowledge and knows the Division II level and the junior college level. He's a great recruiter who knows what kind of players we need to be successful here and also understands the type of kid who will be successful both on and off the court at Fort Hays State University."

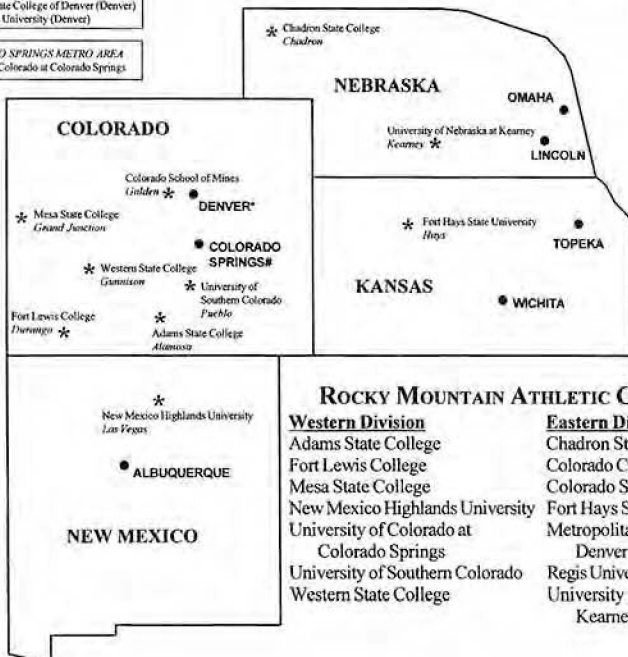

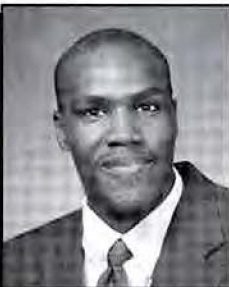

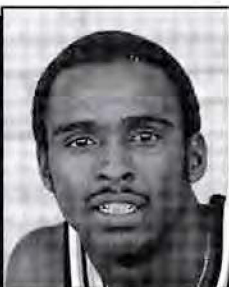

This award is the highest achievement for a student-athlete in the conference. The same guidelines follow as the scholar athletes, with the exception the athlete must have participated for at least two seasons.

FORT HAYS STATE UNIVERSITY



Founded in 1902 on the plains of western Kansas, Fort Hays State University is the second youngest of the state's six universities. An ongoing five-year series of Centennial activities will culminate in the year 2002.

From a humble but exciting beginning, when just two faculty members and a 19-course curriculum greeted 34 students, our university has grown to a faculty of nearly 300, a support staff of 250 and a student body of 5,600. The university now offers hundreds of courses in each of its four main colleges — Education, Arts and Sciences, Business, and Health and Life Sciences — and the Graduate School. The FHSU Virtual College provides many of the courses through various media to sites across Kansas and beyond.

FHSU is governed by a Board of Regents appointed by the governor of the state of Kansas.

FHSU is located in Hays, the largest city in northwest Kansas. Hays began as a wild frontier town and has grown into a progressive community of about 20,000 people. The old and new blend beautifully to form a city that is small enough to be comfortable yet large enough to provide abundant cultural, commercial and entertainment opportunities. In 1996, Hays was recognized as an All-America City.

The university sits on a campus of 4,160 acres of land that once was part of the historic Fort Hays frontier military post, and it recently expanded to include the relocated Sternberg Museum of Natural History on a site adjacent to

Interstate 70 in northeast Hays. Big Creek, with its shady, grassy banks, meanders through the main campus, providing a tranquil learning atmosphere and serving as a natural laboratory for students in the biological sciences. With its stately limestone buildings and profuse flowers, trees and shrubs, our campus has often been called the prettiest in Kansas.

FHSU is academically superior to many comparable universities, offers students an electronic learning and living environment, and is richly endowed by heritage and tradition. Students come to our university for a multitude of reasons, but surveys show that their overwhelming reason is "the university's reputation for academic excellence and its caring faculty."

The university supports one of the most extensive and successful intercollegiate sports programs of any comparably sized college or university in America, boasting numerous All-America athletes and national championships. More than 350 athletes compete annually in eight men's and seven women's sports. FHSU is a member of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, which comprises 14 schools from the states of Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska and New Mexico.

The university also serves as the cultural center of western Kansas, featuring fine arts exhibitions, performing arts presentations by faculty, students and traveling professional troupes, and a noted Presidential Lecture Series.
