# ◆ Gross Memorial Coliseum ◆



Gross Memorial Coliseum is the home of the Fort Hays State "Fighting Tigers" and is celebrating its 24th season this year. The 6,814-seat arena was finished in August of 1973 at a cost of seven million dollars. The Tigers made the move across campus from Sheridan Coliseum which seated 2,000. Paul "Busch" Gross is the namesake of the Coliseum. Gross coached basketball at FHSU from 1930 to 1946 and totaled 150 wins and 88 losses in 14 seasons. Several renovations occurred in GMC this past summer. The major renovation was the installation of a new permanent wood floor. Other additions included the construction of a new women's basketball locker room and the remodeling of two existing locker rooms. The sound system was upgraded with the addition of 16 speakers and a new soundboard which allows for programming of music, messages and sound effects.

In the first game ever played at Gross Memorial Coliseum on November 30, 1973, FHSU defeated East Central State (OK) University, 74-68. Chuck Brehm coached the first team to play at GMC and his squad won 11 of 14 home contests that year. Also in that historical first game, Greg Standish scored a game high 20 points and pulled down nine rebounds.

M.C. Cunningham Hall is part of the total Health, Physical Education and Recreation/Athletic complex at Fort Hays State. Cunningham Hall houses HPER offices, classrooms, a swimming pool, four full-sized gymnasiums, eight handball/racquetball courts, a weight room, two dance studios, a wrestling room.

Gross Memorial Coliseum is a multi-purpose facility that hosts concerts (seating for 10,000), the KSHSAA State 1A Basketball Tournament, the KSHSAA State 3-2-1A Wrestling Champi-

onships, KSHSAA 2A-1A State Volleyball Championships. The Coliseum houses the FHSU athletic offices, a large athletic training room, locker rooms, concession stands, a press box and the Field Weight Room which features full nautilus equipment, free weights, mirrors and a full-time supervisor.

# ◆1996-97 Lady Tiger Basketball Outlook◆

The 1995-96 Lady Tiger basketball team posted a 16-12 overall record, 11-5 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference to place second. The second place finish ended a three year strangle hold the FHSU women's basketball team had on the RMAC title they had won in 1993, 1994 and 1995. Last year's squad was a young inexperienced team which returned only one starter from the 1995 RMAC Championship team.

A year ago the team established three new FHSU three-point records. The Lady Tigers made a school record 115 three-pointers, attempted a team record 329 three-point shots and shot an FHSU record 35 percent from behind the arc.

Academically the team posted a combined grade point average of 3.339 which ranked the team seventh in NCAA II.

With the expansion of the conference it, will be more difficult to capture the RMAC crown this season. The 1996-97 team returns five starters and eight letter winners from last year's team. A good recruiting class has added size and depth to the roster. Several newcomers are challenging for starting spots in just their first year in the program.

## ◆The Backcourt◆

Last year's starting backcourt returns point guard Shelby Hayden and shooting guard Mardy Robinson who will both be playing their junior year. Hayden has started 56-of-57 games at point guard since coming to FHSU as a freshman. Her scoring average improved to 7.8 points per game and her field goal percentage also increased to

47.5 percent. She led the squad with 2.8 steals per game, which ranked sixth in the RMAC. A solid defender Hayden is usually assigned the opponents top offensive guard.

Robinson started all 28 games at shooting guard as a sophomore. She was an honorable mention RMAC selection last season. Robinson averaged 12.3 points per game which was third on the squad and 12th in conference. The Reedsport, Ore., product led the team and was third in the RMAC dishing out 4.6 assists per game. From behind the three-point line, she was successful on 36.8 percent of her shots ranking second on the team and third in the conference. Robinson can also play point guard as she did at times last season.

Sophomore point guard Karlowba Adams returns from anterior cruciate ligament surgery that forced her to miss last season. When healthy her speed and quickness cause problems for opponents. Freshman Michelle Watton and junior Melissa Vahling will play backup roles in the backcourt this season. Watton was a second team all-state 6A selection last season playing for Derby High School. Her senior season she averaged 17.5 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 3.4 steals per game. Vahling had been attending FHSU the past two years but did not play basketball. She has been impressive defensively in early season practices. As a senior at Lenora High School she averaged 10.6 points, 4 rebounds, 3.8 assists and 4.2 steals per game.

## ◆The Frontcourt◆

FHSU's two senior co-captains are frontcourt players Mindy Lyne and Melissa Nulty who were second team RMAC selections a year ago. Both have a chance to finish their FHSU careers on the Lady Tiger top 10 scoring list. Nulty could also crack the top 10 rebounding chart.

Lyne started all 28 games at small forward last year but her athletic ability allows her to swing to the shooting guard spot. She led the team in scoring (16.6 ppg), free throw percentage (76%) and three-point percentage (40.9%). Lyne ranked in six RMAC categories: 3-point percentage (1st, 41.9%), free throw percentage (2nd, 76%), scoring (4th, 16.6ppg), field goal percentage (6th, 44.9%), assists (6th, 4.1apg) and 3-point field goals made (7th, 1.7mpg) following last season. A member of the FHSU Track & Field team she is a two-time NCAA II Javelin All-America selection. Last spring she won the NCAA II javelin title and qualified for the 1996 Olympic Trials held in Atlanta, Ga.

Nulty started all 28 games at center last season and was selected to the RMAC tournament team as the season ended. With the addition of several quality newcomers Nulty could be moved to forward this season allowing her to take advantage of her outside shooting ability. She was the teams top rebounder at 6.7 rebounds per game and finished second to Lyne in scoring at 13.6 points per contest. Nulty finished the year

ranked in three RMAC categories: field goal percentage(7th, 44.3%), scoring(13.6ppg, 9th) and rebounding(6.7rpg, 11th).

Sophomore forward Jody Kennedy started the final eight games of last season after a knee injury forced Crecia Reeves to miss the remainder of the season. She made the most of her opportunity averaging 9.5 points and 5.6 rebounds while shooting 55 percent from the field in those eight games. Kennedy proved to be one of the teams top defenders and rebounders. Despite starting at the end of last season she may return to the bench as the teams sixth man.

Sophomore's Brooke Beckley and Trisha Shandy will be looking for more playing time in their second season in the Black & Gold. Beckley worked hard in the offseason and has been impressive in preseason practices. A year ago she played in 22 games. Shandy saw action in 27 games her freshman year. She adds size and depth to the Lady Tiger frontcourt. Both will be pressed by newcomers for playing time.

Frontcourt newcomers Jesica Farmer, Jesica Farr, Marty Frazier and Megan Ryan are four quality players that should make solid contributions in their first season in the Lady Tiger Basketball program.

A freshman, Farmer should see action primarily at center but can also play forward. Her senior year at Holton High School she averaged 16.9 points and 9.6 rebounds per game. She was named to the Topeka Capital 4A first team and *Kansas Sports Magazine* 4A second team following her senior year.

Farr will also see time at both center and forward. The 6'0" freshman was a Topeka Capital and *Kansas Sports Magazine* first team 2A selection playing for Valley Falls High School last season. She averaged 24.5 points and 13 rebounds per game which both ranked second in 2A last year.

At 5'8", Frazier is a small forward who could also play some shooting guard for the Lady Tigers this season. The 1996 3A all-state selection averaged 17.5 points and 11 rebounds per game for Leon Bluestem High School last season.

Ryan a transfer from Hutchinson Junior College brings experience and size to the frontcourt. The 6'0" center averaged 7.5 points and 4.9 rebounds for HJC last season. A native of Hays she played her prep basketball at TMP-Marian High School.

## ◆The Schedule◆

The schedule will again be a challenging one for the team with the addition of five new teams to the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference. Nebraska-Kearney went unbeaten in conference play winning both the RMAC regular season and tournament titles a year ago.

The expanded RMAC will have two seven team divisions this year. Each team plays a 19 game conference schedule, a two game series within the division and one game against the other division. The Lady Tigers compete in the RMAC East along with two NCAA II tournament teams from a year ago Nebraska-Kearney and Metro State.

The top team on the FHSU's schedule is Abilene Christian University(Texas). The Lady Tigers face ACU at the Central Missouri Tournament November 23. ACU finished third at the NCAA II Elite 8 a year ago.

## ♦Dr. Edward H. Hammond - President♦



Dr. Edward H. Hammond, is the eighth President of Fort Hays State University. A man of boundless enthusiasm and energy, whose style is upbeat and progressive, Dr. Hammond was born in McAllen, Texas, but reared in the Kansas City, Kansas area.

Prior to his current post, President Hammond gained educational experiences and shared his expertise at the universities of Louisville, Seton Hall, Southern Illinois, Purdue, and Missouri-Colum-

bia. The President holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Emporia State University and the Ph.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

President Hammond has been extremely active since assuming the leadership of the University in the summer of 1987. He laid the groundwork for a cooperative educational initiative between FHSU and the community colleges in Western Kansas; has watched his dream to totally computerize the campus become a reality; created an organization comprised of business and community leaders from 54 Western Kansas counties and helped to establish scholarship programs for potential minority school teachers at Garden City and Liberal.

He has played a major role in furthering economic development in Hays and Western Kansas and introduced a voice mail system that vaulted the

foreign language efforts of FHSU into an elite class. He prompted the completion of the Beach/Schmidt Performing Arts Center for the cultural development of the area and launched the expansion of Sternberg Museum to a new location soon on Interstate 70. He obtained federal and state funding for the university's new \$12 million science building and completed a \$20 million Capital Campaign to raise private monies for the enhancement of many university programs.

President Hammond has published widely and is in demand nationally as an educational consultant because of his expertise in risk management, staff and institutional liability, sexual harassment, and alcohol education issues.

The Hammond family includes wife Viv (Hammeke), formerly of Ellinwood, daughters Kelly and Julie, and son Lance.

## ♦Tom Spicer - Director of Athletics♦



Tom Spicer was named director of athletics at Fort Hays State University on July 27, 1989. Spicer begins his eighth year as Director of Athletics and has emphasized a return to athletic and academic excellence.

A native of Beaver, Oklahoma, Spicer attended secondary schools in Hays. He is a graduate of Hays High School and earned a bachelor

of science degree from Fort Hays State in 1972. He played varsity football for the Tigers during his collegiate days. Spicer received his master of science degree from FHSU in 1977.

Spicer is largely responsible for the improvements that were made to Lewis Field Stadium and Gross Memorial Coliseum. Through his continued efforts Lewis Field Stadium was renovated with new synthetic surfaces on both the football field and track. The native limestone structure was sandblasted to its original color. A new two story pressbox on the west side of the stadium is currently under construction. GMC received a new wood floor, locker room renovations and a new sound system. His fund-raising efforts have led to improved funding of the Tiger athletic programs, allowing student athletes the opportunity to

attend FHSU.

Prior to making the move back to FHSU Spicer was the director of athletics and dean of student affairs at Butler County Community College. He also has experience as director of athletics, physical education instructor, head football coach and track coach for the Durant, Oklahoma, School District.

Previous to his work in Oklahoma, he taught and coached at Salina South High School, at Bishop Miege High School in Shawnee Mission and at Schlagle High School in Kansas City, Kansas.

Spicer is married to the former Kathy McGovern of Denver, Colorado. She received a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Fort Hays State in 1972. The Spicers have four children: Matt, Amber, Kristen and Allison.

# ♦Tom Mahon - Head Coach♦



Tom Mahon begins his fourth year as head coach of the Fort Hays State University Women's Basketball program. He was named the fourth head coach in the history of the FHSU Women's Basketball program in August of

he was the head women's basketball coach at Eastern Montana College, Billings, Mont. In two seasons as head coach at EMC, the Lady Yellowjackets were 26-30. His first season the team was 16-12 followed by a 10-18 campaign. Prior to heading the Lady Yellowjackets basketball program he served as the EMC assistant women's basketball coach from 1984-87. In 1987 the Lady Yellowjackets won the Continental Divide Championship and qualified for the NCAA II Playoffs.

While at EMC he coached the tennis team and worked as the men's basketball graduate assistant. He also has high school coaching experience having taught and coached at Shepherd High School, Shepherd, Mont.

Mahon received his bachelor's degree in physical education and master's degree in school counseling from Eastern Montana College.

Tom is married to the former Pat Garber of Big Horn, Wyo. Pat received her Ph.D., from Kansas State University and is FHSU's Associate Vice President for Student Affairs/Registrar.

1993. In three seasons his teams have captured two Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference titles and finished second a year ago. The 1994-95 squad posted the second best record in school history at 23-6. Following the 1993 conference season he was named RMAC Coach-of-the-Year. In the 1994 and 1995 RMAC postseason tournaments the Lady Tigers lost the championship game and just missed qualifying for the NCAA II playoffs. Mahon stresses the importance academics to his team and the 1995-96 team had a grade point average of 3.339 which was seventh in NCAA II.

Mahon has been associated with FHSU athletics since 1989. In July of 1991 he was named FHSU's Associate Athletic Director, a position he still holds. He continues to function as Associate Athletic Director in charge of internal operations, NCAA compliance and transportation management along with his duties as head of the women's basketball program.

Prior to the 1993-94 season, Mahon last coached collegiate basketball during the 1988-89 basketball season when

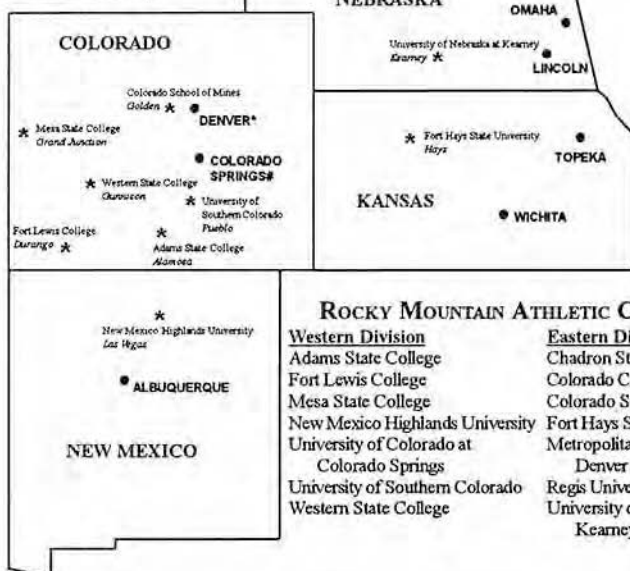
