# Gross Memorial Coliseum



Gross Memorial Coliseum is the home of the Fort Hays State "Fighting Tigers" and is celebrating its 27th season this year. The 6,814-seat arena was finished in August of 1973 at a cost of seven million dollars. The Tigers made the move across campus from Sheridan Coliseum which seated 2,000. Paul "Busch" Gross is the namesake of the Coliseum. Gross coached basketball at FHSU from 1930 to 1946 and totaled 150 wins and 88 losses in 14 seasons. Prior to the start of the 1996-97 season several changes were made to GMC. The major renovation was the installation of a new permanent wood floor. Other additions include the construction of new locker rooms and the remodeling of two existing locker rooms. The sound system was upgraded with the addition of 16 speakers and a new sound board which allows for programming of music, messages and sound effects. Prior to the 1997-98 season two new message boards were installed that provide game replays.

In the first game ever played at Gross Memorial Coliseum on November 30, 1973, FHSU defeated East Central State (OK) University, 74-68. Chuck Brehm coached the first team to play at GMC and his squad won 11 of 14 home contests that year. Also in that historical first game, Greg Standish scored a game high 20 points and pulled down nine rebounds.

M.C. Cunningham Hall is part of the total Health, Physical Education and Recreation/Athletic complex at Fort Hays State. Cunningham Hall houses HPER offices, classrooms, a swimming pool, four full-sized gymnasiums, eight handball/racquetball courts, a weight room, two dance studios, and a wrestling room.

Gross Memorial Coliseum is a multi-purpose facility that hosts concerts (seating for 10,000), the

KSHSAA State 1A Basketball Tournament, the KSHSAA State 3-2-1A Wrestling Championships, and the KSHSAA 2A-1A State Volleyball Championships. The Coliseum houses the FHSU athletic offices, a large athletic training room, locker rooms, concession stands, a press box and the Field Weight Room which features full nautilus equipment, free weights, and mirrors.

# 2000-2001 Lady Tiger Outlook

The pieces to the jig saw puzzle remain the same but the person in charge of putting the puzzle together will be new for the Fort Hays State University women's basketball team this year. All five starters and 12 letterwinners return this season but will be under the direction of first year head coach Annette Wiles. Wiles returns to FHSU after winning 21 or more games each of her seven seasons at Bethany College where she posted a 164-52 record during her tenure. Playing for FHSU she helped the 1990-91 Lady Tiger basketball team to a 34-2 record and NAIA National Championship her senior year. She ended her career as the Lady Tigers all-time leading scorer with 2,407 points.

She will be in charge of a veteran group that returns five starters, four being seniors from a team that was 17-11, 13-6 in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference a year ago.



Gold. Terry had her best season at FHSU a year ago when she averaged 5.2 points per game to rank sixth on the squad. A defensive stopper she is usually assigned to slow down the opponents top offensive guard or small forward.

Twins Maggie and Missi Eck return for their second season in the Lady Tiger basketball program after having solid seasons as freshmen a year ago.

Maggie was used primarily at point guard playing in 27 games earning starts in two contests. She averaged 3.4 points and 1.8 assists per game.

Missi, a shooting guard, averaged 3.6 points per game and shot 40.8 percent from behind the 3-point arc. They will both be counted on to provide solid guard play off the bench.

Freshman Kyra Pokorny, the teams lone newcomer, comes to FHSU after a successful prep career at Baileyville B&B High School where she averaged 14 points and five assists as a senior. Pokorny will be reunited with high school teammate Jamie Heiman who together helped guide B&B High School to the 1999 state title.

## ◆ The Backcourt ◆



Three senior starters return in the backcourt led by two-time All-RMAC and All-RMAC East Division selection Shauna Porter. Porter averaged a team high 15.8 points per game a year ago playing shooting guard. Her 1,306 career points ranks fifth all-time on the Lady Tiger scoring list and she should end her career as the number two all-time scorer behind only Head Coach Annette Wiles.

Maisha Prewitt also returns for her final year after a junior campaign that saw her lead the team and rank third in the conference averaging 5.1 assists per game playing point guard. Prewitt's 346 assists is just 67 behind FHSU's all-time leader Kristi Leeper-Meis' 413. The five-time track & field All-American finished fourth on the team last season averaging 7.5 points per game.

The backcourt's defensive leader LaTania Terry is the third senior starter who will be playing her final season in the Black &

## ◆ The Frontcourt ◆



The starting frontcourt returns a pair of six-foot players in senior Kelly Priest and sophomore Jamie Heiman. Priest, a second team RMAC East Division selection a year ago, had her most productive season as a Lady Tiger when she averaged a career high 13.1 points per game. She was second on the team grabbing 5.8 rebounds per contest.

Heiman started all 28 games as a true freshman last season. She led the squad averaging 6.3 rebounds per game and was third in scoring tossing in 10.3 points per night. Along with Porter and Priest she was one of three players who started all 28 games and averaged double-figure scoring.

Juniors Kirsten Barrett and Heather Wendell are two third-year players who pro

vide the Lady Tigers with quality frontcourt depth. Both stand 5'11" and played in all 28 games last season. Barrett started the first six games of last season and ended the year averaging 4 points and 2.9 rebounds per game.

Wendell, who made one start as a sophomore, led all regulars shooting 56 percent from the field. Her 3.5 rebounds per game ranked fourth on the team and her 5.6 points per game was fifth best on the squad.

Junior small forward Haley Baldwin looks to be healthy after missing all but the final 13 games of her sophomore year with a broken bone in her right foot. Baldwin hopes to return to the shooting form she showed as a freshman when she shot 42.9 percent from behind the 3-point arc and averaged 4.6 points per game. In addition to playing small forward she could see action at shooting guard.

Three sophomores who will be looking for increased playing time in their second year in the program are Katie Stoltz, Allison Schader and Lacie Robinson.

Stoltz is the tallest member of the team at 6'2". She played in 26 games last year when she averaged 2.3 points and 2.3 rebounds per game. Her size makes her an inside defensive presence.

The 5'10" Schrader saw action in 18 games as a freshman. She averaged 1.1 points per game. A swing player she could also see time at shooting guard.

Robinson's playing time was limited as a freshman playing in just seven games a year ago. The 5'10" forward will again be used in

a reserve role this season.

## The Schedule

The schedule will be one of the most difficult in recent years as the Lady Tigers open the season against some of the best teams in NCAA II at the Disney Tip-Off Classic in Orlando, Fla. November 3-5. FHSU opens the tournament against a Philadelphia University team that returns three starters from a squad that was 22-9 a year ago. Four of the eight teams in the Disney Classic finished last year ranked in the top 14 including National Runner-Up North Dakota State.

The non-conference schedule includes a matchup with Emporia State University who has reached the NCAA II Elite 8 each of the past three seasons.

The RMAC schedule will again be tough as six of the eight Mile High Shootout teams come from the conference's East Division where the Lady Tigers compete. FHSU will play two games each with Nebraska-Kearney and Chadron State who were the only RMAC teams that won 20 games a year ago. East Division foes Nebraska-Kearney and Regis University played for the 2000 RMAC Tournament title with UNK getting the win 86-74. FHSU also travels to Mesa State College to take on the RMAC West Division Champion Mavericks.

## Dr. Edward H. Hammond - President



**D**r. Edward H. Hammond is the eighth President of Fort Hays State University. A man of boundless enthusiasm and energy, whose style is upbeat and progressive, Dr. Hammond was born in McAllen, Texas, but reared in the Kansas City area.

Prior to his current post, President Hammond gained educational experiences and shared his expertise at the universities of Louisville, Seton Hall, Southern Illinois, Purdue, and Missouri-Colum-

bia. The President holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Emporia State University and a Ph.D. from the University of Missouri-Columbia.

President Hammond has been extremely active since assuming the leadership of the university in the summer of 1987. He laid the groundwork for a cooperative educational initiative between FHSU and the community colleges in western Kansas; has watched his dream to totally computerize the campus become a reality; created an organization comprised of business and community leaders from 54 western Kansas counties and helped to establish scholarship programs for potential minority school teachers at Garden City and Liberal.

Dr. Hammond has played a major role in furthering economic development in Hays and western Kansas and introduced a voice mail system

that vaulted the foreign language efforts of FHSU into an elite class. He prompted the completion of the Beach/Schmidt Performing Arts Center for the cultural development of the area and launched the expansion of Sternberg Museum to its new location on Interstate 70. He obtained federal and state funding for the university's new \$12 million science building and completed a \$20 million Capital Campaign to raise private monies for the enhancement of many university programs.

President Hammond has published widely and is in demand nationally as an educational consultant because of his expertise in risk management, staff and institutional liability, sexual harassment, and alcohol education issues.

The Hammond family includes wife Viv (Hammeke), formerly of Ellinwood, daughters Kelly and Julie, and son Lance.

## Tom Spicer - Director of Athletics



**T**om Spicer was named director of athletics at Fort Hays State University on July 27, 1989. Spicer begins his twelfth year as director of athletics and has emphasized a return to athletic and academic excellence.

A native of Beaver, Oklahoma, Spicer attended secondary schools in Hays. He is a graduate of Hays High

School and earned a bachelor of science degree from Fort Hays State University in 1972. He played varsity football for the Tigers during his collegiate days. Spicer also received his master of science degree from FHSU in 1977.

Spicer is largely responsible for the improvements that were made to Lewis Field Stadium. Through his continued efforts the 1936 stadium was renovated with new synthetic surfaces on both the football field and track. The native limestone structure was sandblasted to its original color. A new two-story press box on the west side of the stadium is a welcome addition to the stadium. Spicer's fund-raising efforts have led to improved financial support of the Tiger athletic programs, allowing student athletes the opportunity to at-

tend FHSU.

Prior to making the move back to FHSU Spicer was the director of athletics and dean of student affairs at Butler County Community College. He also has experience as director of athletics, physical education instructor, head football coach and track coach for the Durant, Oklahoma, School District.

Previous to his work in Oklahoma, he taught and coached at Salina South High School, at Bishop Miege High School in Shawnee Mission and at Schlagle High School in Kansas City, Kansas.

Spicer is married to the former Kathy McGovern of Denver, Colorado. She received a bachelor of arts degree in sociology from Fort Hays State in 1972. The Spicers have four children: Matt, Amber, Kristen and Allison.



# Annette Wiles - Head Coach



**A**nnette Wiles begins her first season of directing the Fort Hays State University women's basketball program. Wiles was named the fifth coach in the 31-year history of the program on

April 7, 2000.

She returns to her alma mater after coaching the past seven seasons at Bethany College, Lindsborg, Kan. She led BC to seven consecutive seasons of 21 or more wins and a school record 28 victories during the 1999-00 season. Her career coaching record is 164-52, a winning percentage of 75.9. The Swedes made four National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics National Tournament appearances under her direction finishing in the Elite 8 once and Sweet 16 twice. BC captured the 1998 and 2000 Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference regular season titles and the 1995, 1999 and 2000 post-season KCAC tournament titles during her tenure. All seven of her teams at BC were nationally ranked with the 1996 team being ranked as high as sixth.

She was twice named KCAC Coach of the Year in 1998 and 2000. The Kansas Basketball Coaches Association honored her as their coach of the year in 1995 and 1999 and she was named Sears Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year in 1998. The Bethany College women's basketball team was the number one academic NAIA team in 1996 and 1998 with grade point averages of 3.62 and 3.709 respectively. The Swedes produced five All-Americans, 27 all-conference performers and 25 academic All-Americans in her seven seasons at Bethany College.

Playing center Wiles guided the 1991 FHSU women's basketball team to a 34-2 record and NAIA National Championship.

The 1991 squad captured the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and NAIA District 10 titles on the way to the national title. She was named most valuable player at the 1991 national tournament in addition to earning All-RMAC honors the same season. The two-time All-American played four seasons at FHSU from 1987-91 and ended her career as the top scorer and rebounder in the history of the women's program with 2,407 points and 961 rebounds. The 2,407 career points is the most of any FHSU basketball player.

Following her playing days she was the Lady Tigers graduate assistant and head FHSU women's tennis coach for two years before accepting the women's head basketball coaching position at Bethany College. She received a bachelor of science degree in physical education from FHSU in 1991 and a master of science degree in physical education in 1993 from FHSU.



## Shane Larson - Graduate Assistant Coach



Shane Larson enters his first year as the Lady Tigers graduate assistant. Prior to coming to FHSU Larson was the assistant coach at Bethany College for two seasons under current FHSU Head Coach Annette Wiles. His coaching experience also includes serving as the assistant coach for the Concordia Junior High School boys basketball team.

He will assist with all facets of the Lady Tiger basketball program including recruiting, setting of practice schedules, conditioning and game plan preparation.

As a collegiate athlete the Waterville native competed in cross country and track & field two years at Bethany College and one season at Cloud County Community

College.

He completed work on a bachelor's degree in social science education at Bethany College in 2000 and began work on a master's degree in sports administration at FHSU in the fall. He is married to the former Jennie Williams of Waterville.

## Jennifer Poore - Team Manager



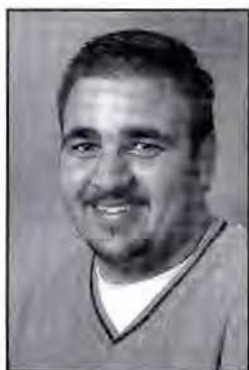

# Fort Hays State University



Founded in 1902 on the plains of western Kansas, Fort Hays State University is the second youngest of the state's six universities. An ongoing five-year series of Centennial activities will culminate in the year 2002.

From a humble but exciting beginning, when just two faculty members and a 19-course curriculum greeted 34 students, our university has grown to a faculty of nearly 300, a support staff of 250 and a student body of 5,600. The university now offers hundreds of courses in each of its four main colleges — Education, Arts and Sciences, Business, and Health and Life Sciences — and the Graduate School. The FHSU Virtual College provides many of the courses through various media to sites across Kansas and beyond.

FHSU is governed by a Board of Regents appointed by the governor of the state of Kansas.

FHSU is located in Hays, the largest city in northwest Kansas. Hays began as a wild frontier town and has grown into a progressive community of about 20,000 people. The old and new blend beautifully to form a city that is small enough to be comfortable yet large enough to provide abundant cultural, commercial and entertainment opportunities. In 1996, Hays was recognized as an All-America City.

The university sits on a campus of 4,160 acres of land that once was part of the historic Fort Hays frontier military post, and it recently expanded to include the relocated Sternberg

Museum of Natural History on a site adjacent to Interstate 70 in northeast Hays. Big Creek, with its shady, grassy banks, meanders through the main campus, providing a tranquil learning atmosphere and serving as a natural laboratory for students in the biological sciences. With its stately limestone buildings and profuse flowers, trees and shrubs, our campus has often been called the prettiest in Kansas.

FHSU is academically superior to many comparable universities, offers students an electronic learning and living environment, and is richly endowed by heritage and tradition. Students come to our university for a multitude of reasons, but surveys show that their overwhelming reason is "the university's reputation for academic excellence and its caring faculty."

The university supports one of the most extensive and successful intercollegiate sports programs of any comparably sized college or university in America, boasting numerous All-America athletes and national championships. More than 350 athletes compete annually in eight men's and seven women's sports. FHSU is a member of the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference, which comprises 14 schools from the states of Kansas, Colorado, Nebraska and New Mexico.

The university also serves as the cultural center of western Kansas, featuring fine arts exhibitions, performing arts presentations by faculty, students and traveling professional troupes, and a noted Presidential Lecture Series.
