TRANSPORTATION ALLOWANCES, DISCHARGED MEMBERS
OF THE CIVILIAN CONSERVATION CORPS

Paragraph 36a and b, War Department Regulations (Provisional), Civilian Conservation Corps, April 5, 1933, as amended by C.C.C. Circular No. 2, War Department, May 9, 1933, and C.C.C. Circular No. 9, War Department, June 20, 1933, is rescinded, and the following substituted therefor:

36. Transportation and travel allowances.--a. Transportation in kind.--Transportation in kind for members of the Civilian Conservation Corps is authorized as follows:

(1) From points of acceptance for enrollment to reconditioning or work camps designated by the corps area commander.

(2) From reconditioning camps to work camps.

(3) From places of discharge --

(a) Juniors.--To places of selection by the Labor Department or to their homes, if a shorter distance than to the places of selection, irrespective of the factors which caused discharge or to points nearer to places of selection or their homes, provided the discharged member agrees to accept such transportation as a full and complete settlement of the Government's obligation to furnish transportation to places of selection or to their homes.

(b) Veterans.--To their places of permanent address, regardless of the relative distances described in (a) above and irrespective of the factors which caused discharge. Transportation to places nearer than their places of permanent address may be furnished under the proviso set forth in (a) above.

b. Party movements of 25 men or more.--(1) Where the journey requires less than two nights, transportation in coaches only (by rail) is authorized. If travel is by boat and only one night's travel is involved, no berth or stateroom will be furnished.

(2) Where the journey requires spending two or more nights on the train, transportation and tourist sleeping-car accommodations (on the basis of three men to a section) will be furnished.

c. Individual movements.--(1) Except as shown in (2) and (3) below, members of the Civilian Conservation Corps traveling individually will be furnished transportation on the following basis: Where the journey requires only one night on the train, transportation only will be furnished and transportation requests will be indorsed "Good in coaches only". If the journey requires spending two or more nights on the train, tourist sleeping-car accommodations will be furnished on the basis shown in paragraph 1b, AR 30-925.

(2) Members of the Civilian Conservation Corps who are discharged by way of punishment will be furnished transportation as prescribed in a(3) above. Transportation requests will be indorsed "Good in coaches only" and sleeping-car accommodations will not be furnished.

(3) Members of the Civilian Conservation Corps who become physically disabled will be given transportation to hospital where facilities for treatment at duty station are not available. Sleeping-car accommodations will be furnished in accordance with paragraphs 2 and 3, AR 30-925.

d. Allowances.--(1) Parties of ten or more individuals will be furnished suitable travel rations in kind. Parties of less than ten will be paid monetary allowances in lieu of rations at the rates prescribed in paragraph 2, AR 35-4520 for enlisted men of the Regular Army.

(2) Members of the Civilian Conservation Corps will upon discharge, except by reason of desertion, be paid, in advance, monetary allowances in lieu of rations as prescribed in paragraph 2, AR 35-4520 for enlisted men of the Regular Army, for the number of days required to perform the travel from places of discharge to the places to which they are entitled transportation in kind under a(3) above.
