The Kansas Undergraduate Research Day at the Capitol event is an opportunity for students to present their research experiences with state lawmakers in Topeka tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, February 14, 2018.

This event will showcase the work of up to 40 Kansas undergraduate students representing each of the state's eight public 4-year institutions. The purpose of this event is to demonstrate the unique opportunities undergraduate students have to participate with faculty members in research at all state institutions. This event will also emphasize higher education's role in developing educated citizens and preparing a workforce with the necessary skills to further the economic growth of the state.

Undergraduate students who have been significantly involved in the research enterprise of the university either with their own project or through meaningful involvement with a faculty project are desired as participants.

To qualify for this event, participants must:

- be undergraduates during the 2017-2018 academic year
- have completed research under the guidance of a Kansas 4-year public institution faculty mentor
- follow the methodology of the appropriate academic discipline
- be of sufficient quality to be presented at a professional academic meeting
- have the skills, resources, and capacity to produce a professional academic poster
- agree to undergo presentation training and rehearse their presentations prior to the Capitol event

Participants should be able to convey their experience and enthusiasm to state representatives, senators, and other state officials in a poster session. Projects from a broad range of disciplines are encouraged - especially posters that relate to the state of Kansas and issues important to the state legislature (e.g. education, health, agriculture, aviation, biotechnology, energy, transportation, manufacturing, environment, and social services). Up to 5 projects will be selected from each institution.

Lunch and transportation will be provided. The event will take place on the first floor of the Capitol Rotunda from 10 am to 1 pm. The public is invited to attend. Selected participants will receive additional information regarding the event.

Submissions are accepted from student teams, however only two students from the team will be able to go to the Capitol. One designated student should be listed as the Principal Investigator. The entire research team will be recognized in the program booklet and related materials.

These groups are partnering with Teaming Up for Tots to support the Angel Tree project. Each angel on the tree represents either a clothing or gift item requested by an underprivileged child in Ellis County.

An angel tree will be stationed in the Memorial Union Monday, November 20, through Friday, December 15. To participate, simply select an angel, purchase the item indicated, and return the angel and gift to one of the drop-off locations listed on the back of the angel. The CSI office (located in the basement of the memorial union) will serve as the campus drop off location. Drop off deadline is December 15.

Every year, many angels are selected from angel trees, but gifts are not donated, leaving those children without presents. 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### 2018 FHSU Alumni Awards Program - Nominate a worthy candidate(s) today!

Each year, the Fort Hays State University Alumni Association presents accomplished alumni, friends, students, and faculty with awards in honor of their achievements and/or service. At Homecoming, four categories of awards are given: Alumni Achievement, Distinguished Service, Nita M. Landrum, and the Young Alumni.

The *Alumni Achievement Award*, established in 1959, honors graduates of the university for outstanding achievement based upon meritorious service to society or the community. The award is based upon career and professional achievements, service involving community betterment and philanthropic activities, and educational achievements. It is the university's highest recognition of its graduates.

The *Distinguished Service Award*, established in 1974, recognizes individuals who have demonstrated a continuing concern for humanity on a universal, national, state or community level; who support spiritual, cultural and educational objectives; and who endorse and exemplify the highest standards of character and personal attributes. It is reserved for alumni or friends of the university.

The *Nita M. Landrum Award*, established in 1994, recognizes alumni or friends who have provided sustained volunteer service for the betterment of the Alumni Association and/or FHSU, especially in their home communities or at any local level.

The *Young Alumni Award*, established in 1977, is designed to recognize those early in their careers who have had outstanding achievements and recent accomplishments. The award is based upon professional and educational achievements, community activities, honors and awards received and other noteworthy items of merit since graduation. Candidates must hold a bachelor's degree from FHSU, be members of the 10-15 reunion classes, and be under age 40 as of Jan. 1 of the year the awards are presented.
