SPRING 2018 Mid-Term Grade Entry – Due March 12

All mid-term grades for **full-semester (16 week) on-campus classes** must be entered through the online TigerCentral grade entry system.

REMINDER: MID-TERM GRADES ARE DUE FOR FULL-SEMESTER ON-CAMPUS COURSES ONLY. THERE ARE NO MID-TERM GRADES FOR VIRTUAL COLLEGE CLASSES.

Faculty can access the grade entry system by clicking on the TigerCentral link under “Faculty/Staff” at the top of the FHSU home page. The system will then ask for TigerNet ID Username and Password. After logging in, hover over the “Teaching” tab, and click on “Grade Entry.” On the “Mid-Term” tab, click on “Enter Spring 2018 Hays Mid-Term Grades.”

Everyone (full-time, part-time, adjunct, etc.) must use their TigerNet ID Username and Password to enter this secure site. If you have problems or technical difficulties with your Username and Password, please call Tiger Tech at 785-628-3478.

Mid-Term grades are **not** saved until the following steps are **all** completed:

- Enter a mid-term grade for each name on the class roster
- Click the Submit button
- A red checkmark appears next to the course title
- Mid-term grades **cannot** be changed or entered after the mid-term grade entry deadline day

All mid-term grades must be submitted by Monday, March 12, at Noon.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to the ease of accessing class rosters through the TigerCentral, the Registrar's Office will no longer print the mid-term class rosters. Faculty may view and/or print class rosters from TigerCentral.

The Learning Quest office would like your help in promoting Learning Quest as a way for employees to save for education expenses through payroll deduction. As a parent with two students in college next year and a state employee, I know the challenges of paying for your children or grandchildren's education. Learning Quest is the state's 529 education savings program with tax advantages to help you save and be prepared to this expense.

- Contributions are with "post tax" dollars.
- You can deduct the amount of your contributions on your Kansas return up to \$3,000 for single filers and \$6,000 for joint filers per beneficiary.
- Payroll deduction is a great way to make your contributions automatic.
- Earnings grow tax free and can be withdrawn tax free for qualified expenses.

- Beginning in 2018 up to \$10,000 per student can be withdrawn as a qualified expense for tuition at a K-12 school.
- The state will match your contributions up to \$600 each year that you are eligible through K.I.D.S. Matching Grant Program if your federal adjusted gross income is less than 200% of the federal poverty level based on the number of family members in your household (currently \$50,200 for a family of four, plus or minus \$8,640 for each family member.)

- Veteran suicide rate is currently at 22 veterans a day taking their own life.

Oral presentations will be 20 minutes in length, including 15 minutes for presenting and 5 minutes for answering questions. Sessions will be booked from 8 am to 1 pm on Wednesday April 25.

Undergraduate students, graduate students, staff, and faculty interested in presenting during the oral presentation session should submit their application by Wednesday, March 14. Submissions should include a 250 word abstract of the proposed presentation adhering to the SACAD guidelines for empirical or non-empirical work. Individuals are free to submit for both an oral presentation and a poster session, if desired.

Committee members from the Oral Presentation Subcommittee of SACAD will conduct a blind review of all entries, using the SACAD criteria for empirical or non-empirical work, and rank each entry. All submitters will receive a notice of appreciation or acceptance to orally present based on available slots.
