FURNISHINGS—

Each boy must furnish his own bed clothes and pillow. It is recommended that each boy bring at least three sheets, two pillow cases, and quilts or blankets. The college will have the sheets and pillow cases laundered. A steamer trunk or small chest which can be locked and put under the bed is recommended.

SOCIAL LIFE—

Mrs. W. A. Lewis, our housemother, has charge of the social functions provided. She works through committees of students and the regular parties, open houses, etc., are always well planned and supervised.

MEDICAL CARE—

The college has a well equipped health office. A doctor and registered nurse are available for office calls during the day. The housemother acts as a nurse for sick boys unless in emergency cases. A small infirmary, located in the same building as the housemother's apartment, guarantees twenty-four hour service to sick boys.

SCHOLASTIC STANDING—

A tradition has been built up that no Lewis Field student should have a grade average of less than three point. It is the hope of Lewis Field boys that this standard will always be maintained.

GENERAL INFORMATION

OPENING—

The dormitories will be ready for occupancy on Friday, September 5th.

COST—

The room rent is \$1.25 per week.

APARTMENTS—

There will be six boys in the majority of the apartments. Each apartment has a large sleeping room and living room with modern toilet facilities and large clothes closets. Many of the apartments are furnished with chromium, leather upholstered furniture. New inner spring mattresses are being purchased for some of the apartments.

STADIUM—

The stadium houses approximately seventy boys. Adequate closet facilities are available. A large study hall equipped with small desks and study lamps is on the second floor. Supervised study hours are held from 7:00 to 10:00 o'clock on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings. The first floor contains the recreation room, lounge room, and shower baths. The recreation and lounge rooms contain pool table, ping-pong table, piano, radio, and many easy chairs and settees.

Dr. W. D. Moreland is faculty supervisor. A general supervisor, in active charge, lives at Lewis Field. Upper classmen will act as assistant supervisors.

MEALS—

The college cafeteria serves twenty meals per week for ~~three~~ ^{\$ 3.35} dollars.

SOME LEWIS FIELD RULES—

Room and board is due and must be paid each month in advance at the business office of the college. Reservations are made preferably for the year with the semester being the minimum term anyone will be accepted. Boys on the college work program are not allowed to have or operate cars. Drinking and gambling ^{is} strictly forbidden.
