# Posters mar Homecoming campaigns

Collegiate Republicans targeted in parody

The organizational campaigns for Fort Hays State's '93 Homecoming king and queen were marred Friday morning by the discovery of obscene posters parodying the candidates sponsored by Collegiate Republicans (CR).

Many of the posters were torn down and delivered to the office for Student Development.

One poster featured a naked female in a masturbatory pose, holding a replica of an erect penis. She implored the FHSU student body to "Vote for Censorship" by voting for the CR candidate for queen.

The other showed two bald males in "Whites Only" T-shirts asking FHSU students to vote for the CR candidate for king. Penned on the shirts were the phrases, "I am a supremacist—Nazi power" and "I hate you because you are not me."

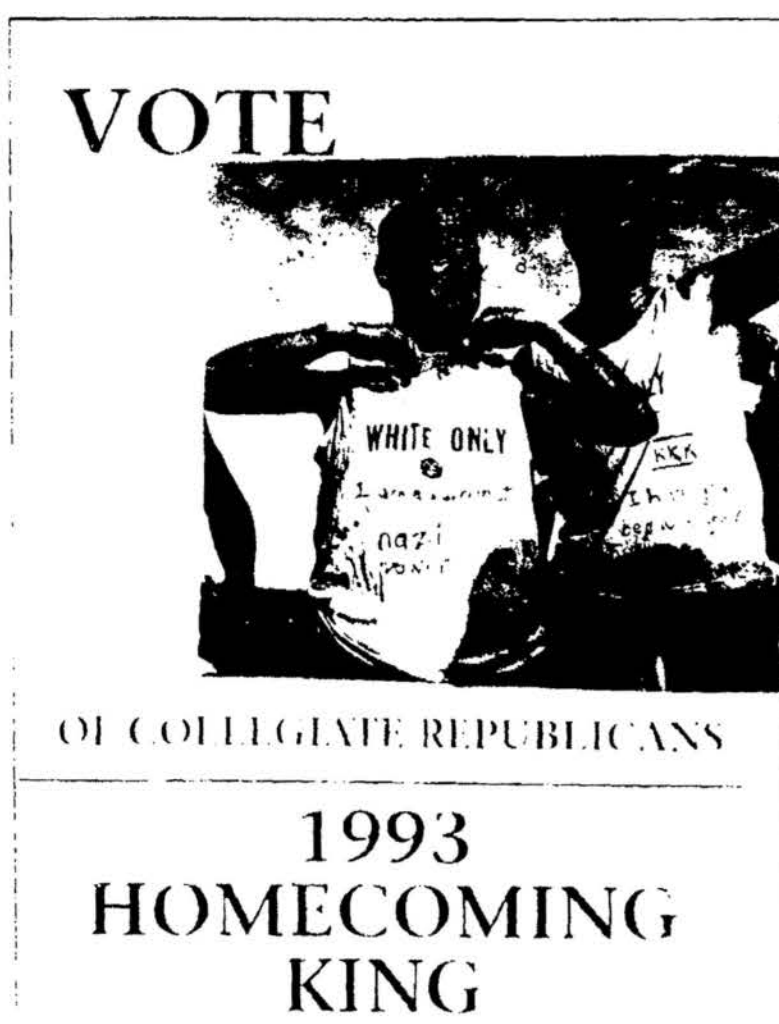
The posters were put up after 11 p.m. Thursday and discovered approximately at 8 a.m. Friday around the quad and residence hall areas of campus, according to Herb Songer, vice president for student development.

Songer said this was the first incident of this nature [obscene Homecoming posters] to be brought to his attention during his 15 years at FHSU.

"I've seen posters that have been torn down and posters with moustaches and beards drawn on the candidates, but never anything like this," he said.

Bethanie Poppey, Johnson senior and president of the FHSU Collegiate Republicans, called the posters "infamously offensive."

She said she is not sure if everyone has his or her own political

agenda and ideology, but she does not think the Collegiate Republicans have done anything to instigate this kind of attack.

"The people responsible obviously do not understand what CR stands for. This makes me furious," Poppey said.

Poppey said she has not encountered anything like this before, and does not think CR has offended anyone.

Not has she noticed an increase in popular Republican-bashing, even after the election of Democratic President Bill Clinton and the television

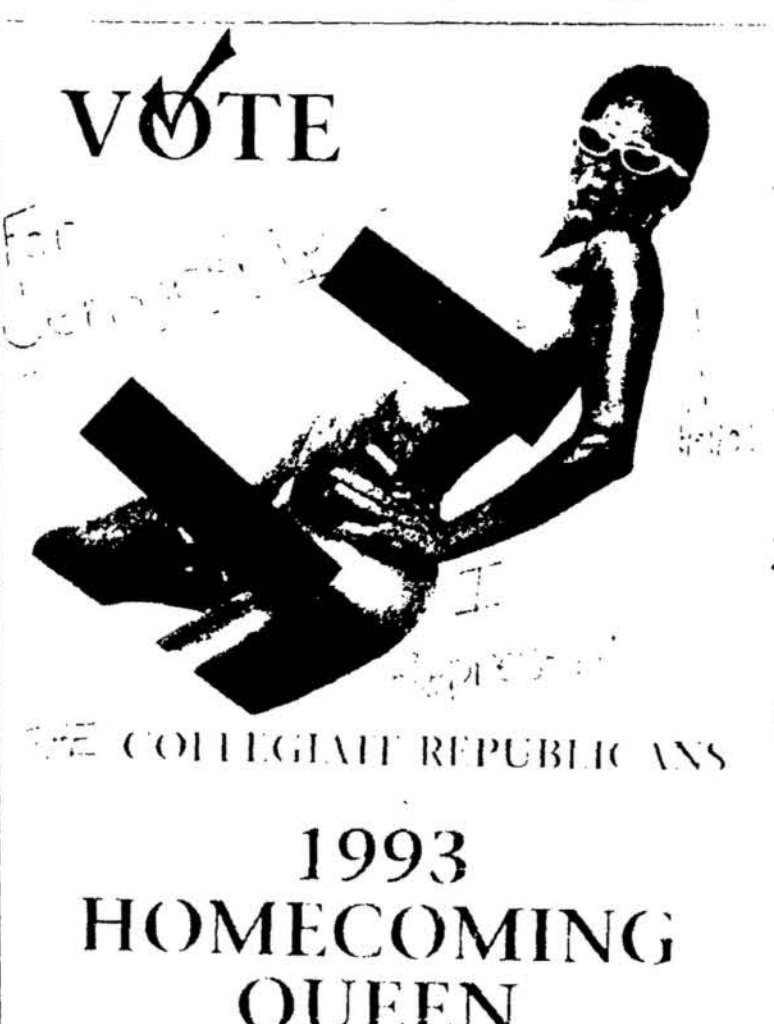
presence of Rush Limbaugh.

"I'm still marvelling at the cowardice displayed by attacking us in this manner," she said.

When some of the offensive posters were presented at the Student Government Association office, Nate Halverson, SGA president, went around campus looking for more.

Halverson said he was unable to find any.

"Nobody wins in these situations," he said. "It is too bad some people had to step behind the bounds of good taste in order to express their opinions. This is a disgrace."

Songer said his office has investigated the incident, but had not been able to come up with any leads.

One of the problems in dealing with this kind of situation, Songer said, is trying to determine who was responsible for the posters because a lot of "legitimate posters" were also hung that night.

"The only thing we can do is notify security and try to find out what happened," he said.

Songer said the person or group responsible could face prosecution from the state and the university, if discovered.

Songer said he does not want to discourage the hanging of posters on campus. It is one of the most useful methods of "letting students know what is going on."

"I really think it is healthy. You go to [any of the bigger campuses across the country] and the place is littered with flyers and posters. At the very least, it is a small sign of life," he said.

## STOP begins operations for school year

Student Teams Offering Protection began last night at 6 p.m. STOP is a service offering protection for students who are uncomfortable walking to or from on-campus facilities or the Greek houses. Approximately 40 students utilized this service last year.

STOP is under the direction of Steve Culver, director of residential life, and Rod Spangler, Topeka junior.

Spangler strongly encourages the student body to use the service. "It will help maintain a sense of security on campus," Spangler said.

He said he thinks if the service is used properly, it will help curb any "false premonitions" about campus security.

The staff also consists of three coordinators, 12 female and nine male volunteers. The coordinators are Carey Brouillette, Cleveland sophomore, Jason Eljah, Bird City sophomore, and Raphael Chong, Malaysia junior.

Brouillette said if there were 18 volunteers of each sex, each volunteer would be required to work one two-hour shift each week. She also said it looks good on a resume.

Eljah agrees with Brouillette. "Last year, and then this year, girls were being chased," he said. Eljah said he feels STOP will eliminate many of these incidents.

STOP is available to students 6 p.m. to 1 a.m. Monday through Friday. In order to obtain an escort, students should call 628-KARL. A call will be placed to STOP headquarters, located in McMindes Hall. A student team will be dispatched to the requested location.

Each team carries a flashlight and radio. They also wear fluorescent green jackets bearing the STOP emblem. The team will make sure escorts arrive safely at their location. Persons will also be asked to sign a statement indicating a safe arrival.

Sid Carlie, Fort Hays State university police chief, said between the hours of 6 and 8 a.m., there will not be any night security guards on duty, and the university police will not be available.

In order to obtain an escort during this time, students should contact the Hays City Police at 625-1011. The city police will contact the university police and dispatch an officer to the caller's location.

All volunteers for STOP are investigated for any criminal record. If a criminal record is present, they are unable to participate in the program.

Sunday evening, the volunteers were given safety tips by Ed Howell, university police sergeant.

In the Sept. 24 issue of the Leader, it was erroneously reported that a man had been a Homecoming king at Fort Hays State. FHSU's most recent Homecoming king was elected in 1992. After 1992, no more Homecoming kings were elected. In addition, the man's name was omitted from the list of kings and queens. The Leader regrets the error, and any man whose name was misstated.

The American Heart Walk, sponsored by the American Heart Association, will begin at the Gross Memorial Coliseum parking lot Saturday. Registration begins at 8:40 a.m.

The path of the walk goes through the Fort Hays State campus.

Community members are welcome to collect donations to participate in the walk.

All walkers will receive a Fort Hays State American Heart Walk pin, signifying participation.

By collecting donations, participants may earn prizes including a thermal mug, various items of cloth-

ing, a sports bag, entertainment electronics, or a stair climber.

Free blood pressure checks will be available at registration for walkers, said Becky Kaiser, Hays Medical Center media assistant.

According to a press release, the goal for the Hays walk is 200 walkers and \$3,000 in donations. Local groups including an insurance agency, a motel, an attorney and retired nurses will participate. Many people sign up for the walk just for the health of it.

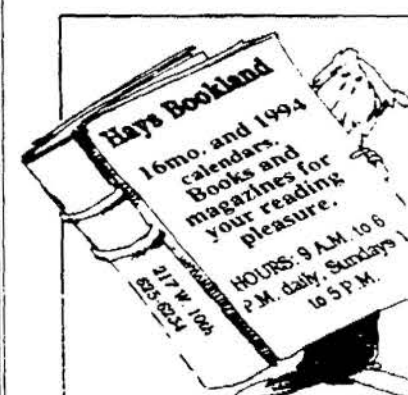

"Kickoff is the most important thing I need to work on, and I still need to work on accuracy on field goals. You can never practice that enough," Achilles said.

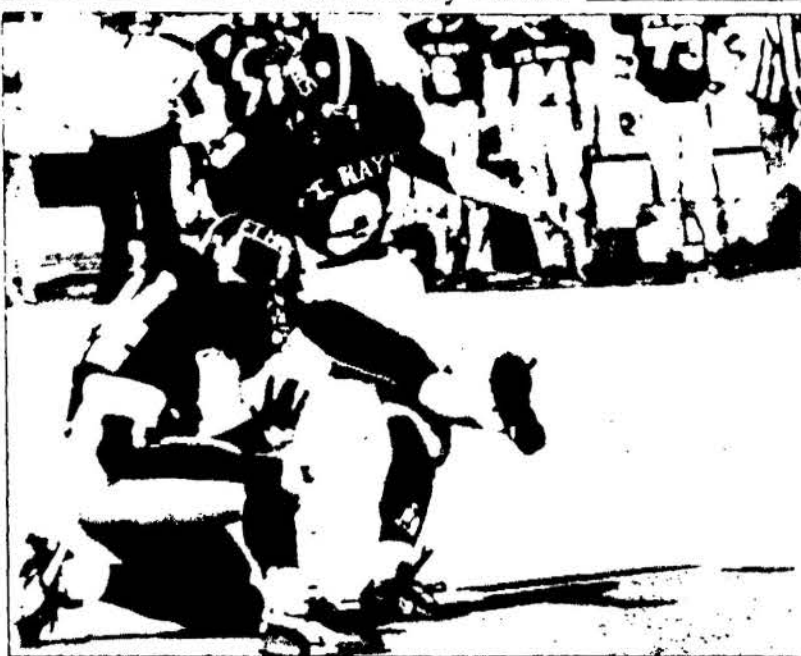
Junior quarterback Dustin McEwen

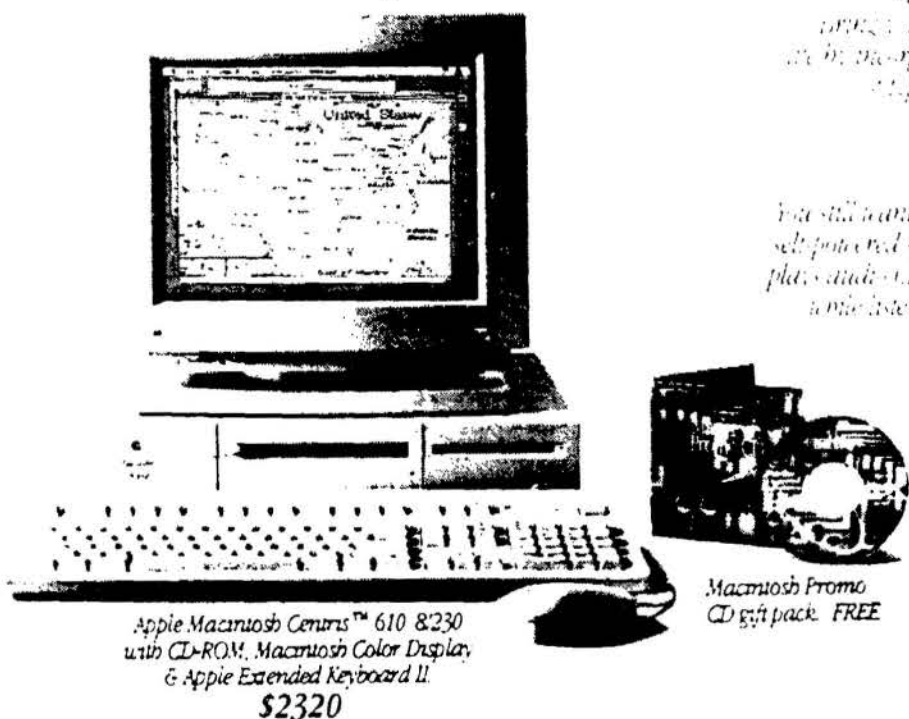
