Sales Tax Rate Change

The Ellis County sales tax rate will change effective October 1, 2018. As a result, the City of Hays sales tax rate will decrease to 8.25%.

Since the last day of September is Sunday, we request that Cash Sales be submitted in Workday for <u>September receipts</u> by **noon**, **Tuesday**, **October 2**, in order that they are accurately recorded with the current tax rate. Also please bring the funds to our office by the noon deadline.

Do not initiate Cash Sales in Workday for October receipts until Wednesday, October 3, 2018, as the new tax rate will be updated in Workday the morning of October 3rd.

We will also update the extended amount worksheet incorporating the new sales tax rate. It will replace the existing worksheet within the Workday Worklet and on our website on October 3. If you saved a copy of the extended amount worksheet on your computer, you will need to save a new copy Wednesday morning.

The new City of Hays tax rate change affects all sales within the City of Hays, as defined by the Kansas Department of Revenue. Please continue to use the Kansas Department of Revenue Address Tax Rate lookup site to obtain the sales tax rates for destination sales.

If you are an advisor to a student organization, please forward this information on to the appropriate person(s) in charge of preparing deposits.

- Add additional devices
- Designate your "default" device and preferred authentication method
- Reactivate Duo Mobile if you got a new phone but kept your number
- Change the name of your device (ex. "Personal Cell" or "Work Phone")
- Remove a device

Do you only have 1 device (or phone number) enrolled in Duo?

We highly recommend you register a second device in case your primary method is unavailable. For example, if you've only registered your smartphone, what will you do if you leave it at home or it's broken? If you've only registered your desk phone, what will you do if you need to login from your house? The new Duo Portal makes it easy to add an additional device. Who is included in Duo Security?

Currently employed faculty, virtual college faculty, adjunct faculty, staff, student employees, and graduate assistants WILL be required to use two-factor authentication with Duo Security.

The following users will NOT enroll in Duo Security: students, retired employees, volunteers, and employees who do not use a computer in their job functions.

All active employees, spouses, dependents 18-65 years of age who are covered under Plans A, C, J, N and Q of the State Employee Health Plan (SEHP) are eligible for a flu shot at no cost. Once logged in, follow these simple steps to schedule your screening:

- A list of times will appear. Select the time that works best for your schedule.
- Answer a few simple questions and click Create Appointment

What is a Biometric Screening?

Knowing cholesterol or blood glucose values can help you identify serious risks and manage or prevent health problems before they occur. HealthQuest sponsors free biometric screenings at worksites statewide. Testing is conducted in 30 minutes or less using a simple finger stick. Results you will receive include:

- Total Cholesterol, HDL, LDL and total Cholesterol to HDL ratio
- · Triglycerides and Glucose
- Systolic and Diastolic Blood Pressure
- Height, Weight, and Body Mass Index (BMI)
- Waist Circumference

Remember for best results to fast for a minimum of 9 hours prior to your appointment. Water, tea and black coffee (no cream or sugar) are okay. Take medications as usual also.
