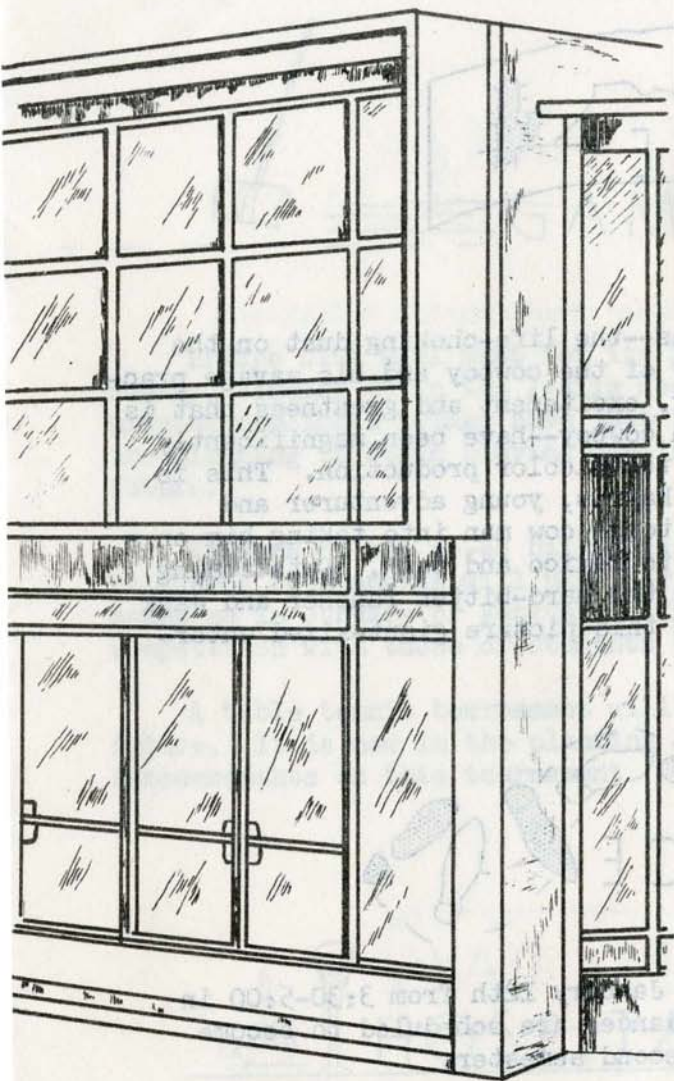

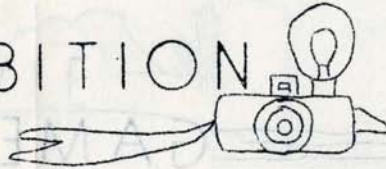

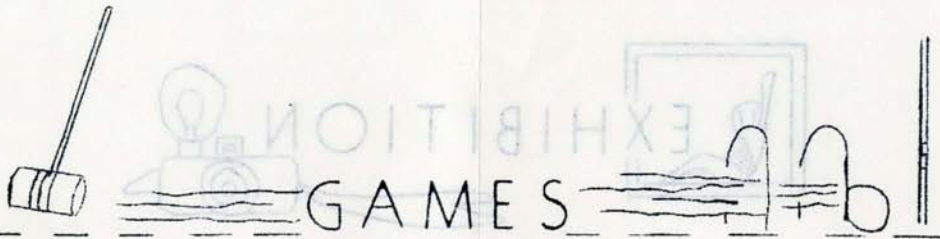
JAN. 14 COWBOY

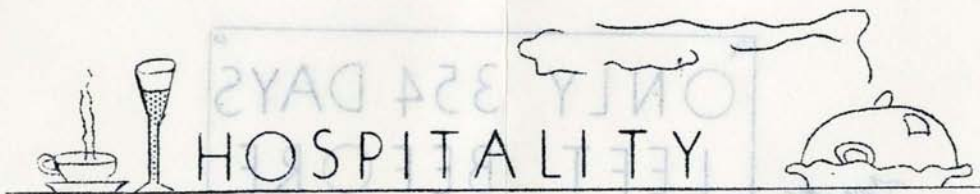

A table tennis tournament will be held sometime in the near future. It is now in the planning stages. Keep watch for further announcements on this tournament.

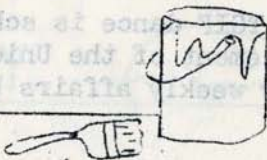
