Mid-Term Grades Dues Monday, October 15

FALL 2018 MID-TERM GRADE ENTRY
DUE MONDAY OCTOBER 15, 2018 BY NOON

All mid-term grades for **full-semester (16 week) on-campus classes** must be entered through the online TigerCentral grade entry system.

REMINDER: MID-TERM GRADES ARE DUE FOR FULL-SEMESTER ON-CAMPUS COURSES ONLY. THERE ARE NO MID-TERM GRADES FOR VIRTUAL COLLEGE CLASSES.

Faculty can access the grade entry system by clicking on the TigerCentral link under “Faculty/Staff” at the top of the FHSU home page. The system will then ask for your TigerNet ID Username and Password. After logging in, hover over the “Teaching” tab, and click on “Grade Entry.” On the “Mid-Term” tab, click on “Enter Fall 2018 Hays Mid-Term Grades.”

Everyone (full-time, part-time, adjunct, etc.) must use their TigerNet ID Username and Password to enter this secure site. If you have problems or technical difficulties with your Username and Password, please call Tiger Tech at 785-628-3478.

Mid-Term grades are **not** saved until the following steps are **all** completed:

- Enter a mid-term grade for each name on the class roster
- Click the Submit button
- A red checkmark appears next to the course title
- Mid-term grades **cannot** be changed or entered after the mid-term grade entry deadline day

All mid-term grades must be submitted by Monday, October 15, before Noon Central Time.

PLEASE NOTE: Due to the ease of accessing class rosters through the TigerCentral, the Registrar’s Office will no longer print the mid-term class rosters. Faculty may view and/or print class rosters from TigerCentral.

Faculty and Staff Exchange Opportunities in Xi'an and Lanzhou, China – Summer 2019

Northwest University of Political Science and Law (NWUPL), located in Xi'an, China, and **Northwest Minzu University (NWMU)**, located in Lanzhou, China, have faculty and staff exchange partnerships with FHSU.

Both universities send faculty scholars to FHSU during the Spring semester and, in exchange, FHSU is invited to send 10 faculty or staff for about 2 weeks to each of the universities.

1) For NWUPL, FHSU has chosen the dates of May 20-June 2

FHSU will provide for international airfare, single-occupancy hotel (Xi'an Ji Yuan International Hotel) immediately across the street from the NWUPL campus, and the cost of a China tourist visa. NWUPL will provide meals or stipends for meals, local transportation and entrance tickets for sightseeing. Terracotta Soldiers, Wild Goose Pagoda, and Shaanxi Museum are just a few of the cultural experiences faculty may enjoy. FHSU faculty and staff are responsible for delivering at least one presentation during the visit.

2) For NWMU, FHSU has chosen the dates of May 20-June 2 for Group 1 and May 25-June 9 for Group 2

NWMU will provide for international airfare, lodging, meals, and local transportation. FHSU will provide for the cost of a China tourist visa. FHSU faculty and staff are responsible for delivering at least one presentation during the visit.

If you are possibly interested in applying for any of these 2-week educational and cultural experiences in Xi'an or Lanzhou, please attend an introductory meeting on **October 11 at 3:30 p.m. in McCartney Hall 104**. The **deadline for applications is October 31**. Both NWUPL and NWMU will select 10 participants for each university.
