IRS Warns of “Tax Transcript” Email Scam

The Internal Revenue Service has [warned the public](#) of a surge of fraudulent emails impersonating the IRS and using tax transcripts as bait to entice users to open documents containing malware known as [Emotet](#). Emotet is very destructive and spreads rapidly between devices on the same network.

The scam masquerades as the IRS, pretending to be from “IRS Online.” The scam email carries an attachment labeled “Tax Account Transcript” or something similar, and the subject line uses some variation of the phrase “tax transcript.” These clues can change with each version of the malware.

The IRS does not send unsolicited emails to the public, nor would it email a sensitive document such as a tax transcript, which is a summary of a tax return.

If you receive one of these emails, do not open the attachment. Report the email if you want to, then delete it as soon as possible. Tax or IRS-related phishing scams can be reported to the IRS by forwarding the message to phishing@irs.gov. To report phishing to FHSU Tech Services from your FHSU Outlook account, forward it to phish@fhsu.edu.

If you open a suspicious attachment, you should turn off the device and immediately contact TigerTech (FHSU-owned device) or a trusted IT professional (personal device).

2019-20 FAFSA Available!

The **2019-20 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** is available at fafsa.gov. The FHSU priority deadline is **December 1, 2018**. Because some financial aid programs have limited funds and are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, it is to your student's advantage to submit their FAFSA before the priority deadline. They will need parent and student 2017 tax information in order to complete the FAFSA.

Hispanic College Institute Leaders Application

The Hispanic College Institute (HCI) is a program sponsored by Fort Hays State University to help high school students prepare and succeed in college, become professionals, and give back to the community. Our goal is to serve 150 high school students by providing them with the opportunity to gain experience during a four-day, three-night college empowerment program. Leaders are responsible for serving as a guide, mentor, and leader to a familia of 10-12 high school students over the course of HCI.
