basis, it is to your student's advantage to submit their FAFSA before the priority deadline. They will need parent and student 2017 tax information in order to complete the FAFSA.

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## Hispanic College Institute Leaders Application

The Hispanic College Institute (HCI) is a program sponsored by Fort Hays State University to help high school students prepare and succeed in college, become professionals, and give back to the community. Our goal is to serve 150 high school students by providing them with the opportunity to gain experience during a four-day, three-night college empowerment program.
