All current full-time Fort Hays State University faculty and unclassified staff members at levels comparable to academic faculty are eligible to apply. Support is paid to the faculty member in the amount of **60% of 1/9 of his/her base salary**. Successful applicants who are awarded a Summer 2019 Grant for Research, Creativity or Grants Activity must have the permission of the Dean if they want to teach a course in Summer 2019. Only complete proposals will be reviewed. Additional information may be attached, but all materials must be submitted by the deadline.

Please note that awards will be made based upon available funding. Completed applications must be submitted to the Office of Scholarship and Sponsored Projects on or before **February 15, 2019** (no later than 4:30 p.m.).
