Graduation Honors discussion continues

Provost Rodolfo Arévalo and the Council of Deans will review the graduation honors policy at their meeting Friday.

Arévalo said a decision will be made no later than early November.

"My intent is for us to examine what needs to be examined and make a decision," Arévalo said.

Prior to the change, Fort Hays State's honors requirements were lower than comparable universities in Kansas.

"I think right now the new policy is much more similar to the other campuses," Arévalo said.

Arévalo explained the process which brought about the new policy began with Faculty Senate Recommendation 43-93/94 in May, 1994.

"The resolution prompted the deans to look at the honor roll policy," Arévalo said. "And based on that, the deans came up with the recommendation."

The Council of Deans' recommendation designated students with a 3.6

GPA eligible for the Dean's Honor Roll and raised the requirements for graduation honors to 3.6 to 3.79 for cum laude, 3.8 to 3.89 for magna cum laude and 3.9 or above for summa cum laude.

The requirements were approved by President Edward Hammond in June, 1994 and were originally scheduled for implementation in September, 1994.

To inform students, the new requirements were first printed in the Fall, 1994 schedule. However, Arévalo said attention was not drawn to the fact the requirements were different; the new requirements were simply listed.

"After talking to the deans early in January, we decided we would not implement the policy until Fall, 1995," Arévalo said.

By implementing the new honors requirements this fall, an 18-month period would pass from the time the policy was approved until potential

Senate maintains hold on agricultural research grants

WASHINGTON (AP) — Let scientists rather than Congress decide who gets millions of federal dollars for agricultural research? No way, the Senate voted last week.

Sen. Russ Feingold, D-Wis., tried to strip his colleagues of the power to earmark nearly \$41 million for Special Research Grants to tackle problem areas in agriculture in the coming budget year.

He and his ally, Sen. John McCain, R-Ariz., saw their proposal rejected by a 64-34 margin after a debate in which opponents aired their distrust of "some fancy group of scientists."

Feingold proposed that public re-

search universities and other public institutions compete for research dollars handed out by the Agriculture Department to supplement state and private spending.

"In too many cases too many projects are being funded for political reasons rather than scientific reasons," he said.

"An agricultural researcher's chance of getting federal tax dollars should not depend on whether that researcher has a person on the Appropriations Committee."

But opponents, including Sen. Thad Cochran, R-Miss., argued that scientists would favor their "buddies" in the academic hierarchy in the Northeast and Midwest and bypass projects in other regions when doling out the money.

Feingold noted that grants from

the department's National Research Initiative, budgeted for \$100 million in 1996, go only to projects found worthy by a scientific panel.

Looking at what gets money under the two programs, it's hard to tell them apart.

The Special Research Grants "fund research on designated problem areas," the Agriculture Department said in one budget request. The National Research Initiative supports research "on the most urgent agricultural, food and natural resource problems," the department said in another.

The research initiative, created in 1990, is supposed to do basic research that may increase understanding but not solve immediate problems. Genetic mapping is one example. The money is available to scientists from

everywhere.

The special grants are supposed to tackle more immediate problems, such as fertilizer pollution or weeds. Still, the categories aren't clear.

The Appropriations Committee's budget for the Agriculture Department lists about 100 special research grants and the amount for each.

The grants cover broad areas such as fish-farming, biotechnology, human nutrition and rural development. Some grants are more specific, taking aim at pest problems like soybean cyst nematode, jointed goatgrass, phytophthora root rot.

Different places get grants for research on the same issue. State universities in Hawaii, Illinois, Hawaii, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi and Oregon are down for \$2.5 million for fish-farming.

The budget for the competitive research grants just lists categories: plant systems; animal systems; nutrition; natural resources and the environment; processes and new products; markets, trade and policy; water quality; less use of pesticides; and the impact of pesticides.

The administration has cut the earmarked grants in its budget requests in favor of the reviewed grants. The House and Senate put money back into the earmarked grants.

"I am not ready to delegate to some fancy group of scientists in some other state the authority to decide where the tax dollars that are paid by Mississippians are spent in agriculture research," said Cochran, chairman of the Appropriations subcommittee on Agriculture.

Cochran secured \$51 million in research money for his state through various programs.

Scientists, he warned, have a powerful network.

"They're going to have their own buddy system in effect, and you may see states and regions that are left out," he said. "And I think it may be my region that might get left out."

He warned that the "larger, more wealthy and well-entrenched hierarchy of academia in the Northeast and Midwest" would divide up all the money.

The Appropriations Committee, meanwhile, has told the department to use 10 percent of its competitive grant money on an experimental program "to stimulate competitive research."

AIDS Quilt display leaves impressions with community

This past weekend, a section of the Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt made a visit to the community of Hays.

According to the Names Project Foundation, the entire quilt covers 18 football fields when it is displayed with a walkway, and weighs 41 tons.

The section that was displayed in the Gross Memorial Coliseum covered the floor and the inner walls of the building.

Getting the quilt to Hays was no small undertaking.

"It's been a year or better since we decided to try to get the quilt," Ellie Gabel, University Nurse, said. "We had to apply for it, be accepted, and then raise money to offset the costs of transportation."

Gabel, who was in charge of coordinating the many volunteers who gave their time and efforts to the quilt, said the response she received was overwhelming.

"I had a lot of clergy volunteer, the local church women baked cookies for the volunteers and lots of local businesses gave food. Dairy Queen donated 100 Dilly Bars."

"Many of the volunteers who signed up for three-hour shifts, and

then many of them asked to come back and work again," said Gabel. "and I didn't turn anyone away."

Gabel was also pleased with the public response to the quilt.

"Eight thousand two hundred and one people showed up to look at the quilt," Gabel said. "and I think that says a lot for this community."

"I volunteered for the unfolding team, as a quilt monitor and I worked at the merchandise table," Amber Applegate, Hays Senior, said, "and it was a neat experience."

Applegate said that for her, being around the quilt was very sobering.

"I had chills from the minute I got there to the minute I left."

Gabel was also impacted by seeing the quilt.

"I was really anxious to see it, and when I finally did, it made me very sad."

Gabel said the panels which were dedicated to children were the ones that affected her the most.

"I have to admit I shed some tears," Gabel said. "But I also got more hugs in that week than I had in a long time."

Gabel said despite all the work that was involved, she feels that it was well worth it.

"The quilt is a very moving thing," Gabel said. "and I think that it speaks for itself. I would recommend that everyone try to see it."

The Heartland Display of the AIDS Memorial Quilt visited Hays last week and I was very moved with each and every one of the "Labors of Love."

In the weeks preceding the display, the media educated us on the most dreadful disease that has plagued the earth.

I had to think of what the future will hold for my children. The display made me realize the generation gaps that are being bridged now.

In my generation, young girls and boys did not even think about discussing tabu issues such as sex, but now they do.

I am glad we can talk about many things more openly, but I am also aware of what our generation will pass to the younger one.

When the media disclosed that AIDS is the leading cause of death among Americans ages 25-44, and that one of the fastest growing group of newly infected American adults is women ages 16-36, I knew something had to be done to prevent this.

AIDS is contracted mainly by interchange of bodily fluids and by sharing needles.

Knowing how teenagers are, I realize I cannot preach abstinence. I was a teenager once and times have not changed since then.

But the media failed to tell us that alcohol is the biggest influence for contracting AIDS.

As a non-alcoholic person, I always felt sheltered from many dangers in life.

I saw what liquor did to my friends and family, so I refrained from drinking, nor did I try other drugs.

In my youth, I was not a saint, but I believe that for being a sober person, I exercised better judgments regarding many things around me.

AIDS is contracted mainly by irresponsible behavior and that is what alcohol does to people.

I don't know how many times I have heard young people say, "I was so drunk that I don't know how I got home."

In those instances, rape is almost always inevitable.

Usually drunk women give in more easily than sober ones; intoxicated guys do not use condoms. Yes, alcohol makes people do stupid things.

Some of those mistakes can cause people to waste otherwise productive lives.

Someone said, "Money is the root of all evil," but I know that alcohol is even worse. It has caused accidents, deaths, rapes, abuse, incest, bankruptcy - and the list can go on and on.

I would like to see as much support and energy go into research for Cancer as does love into the AIDS Quilt.

Domino's Pizza has a national logo that is well advertised: FAST, FREE, FRIENDLY delivery.

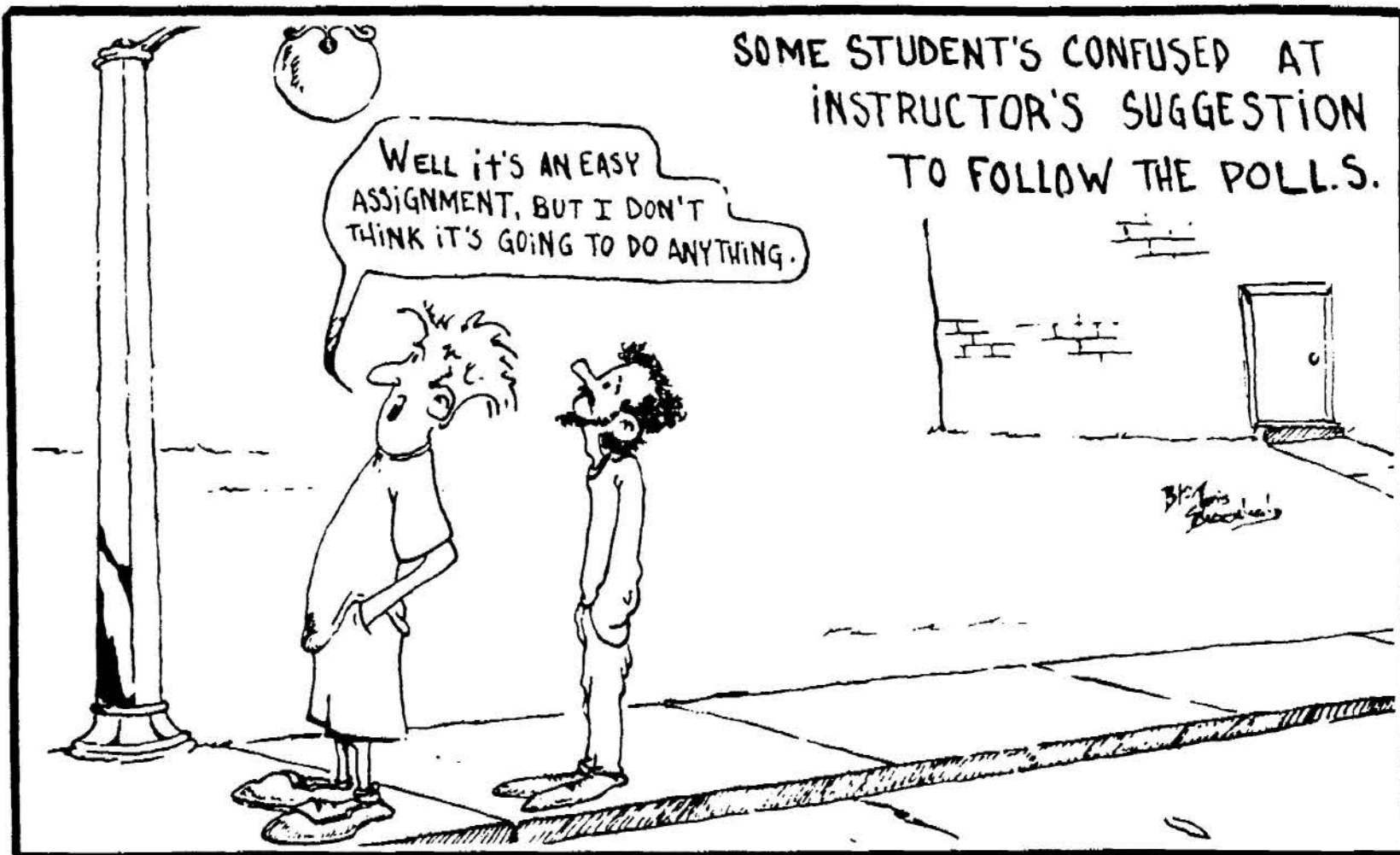
Domino's Pizza in Hays and nationwide does not charge for delivery and never has, contrary to the "reporting" done in this article.

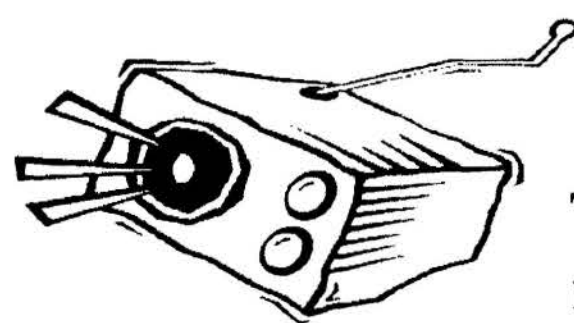

graduation for students. During that time, students could logically take 36 units of course work and affect their GPA, Arévalo said.

He explained the decision to raise honors requirements was not a response to grade inflation. The primary reason for the change began when adjustments to the criteria for the Dean's Honor Roll were needed.

Prior to the current policy, to qualify for the Dean's Honor Roll, a student had to have a 3.4 GPA and be in the top 10 percent of his/her college.

"Only the top 10 percent could be on the Dean's Honor Roll even though a much larger percentage could qualify."

"In Fall, 1991, we had 3,046 students eligible for the Dean's Honor Roll. Almost 60 percent of the student body could have been on the Dean's Honor Roll," Arévalo said.

He said with such high numbers qualifying for the Dean's Honor Roll, the honor of being on the honor roll diminished.

By raising the criteria for the Dean's Honor Roll to 3.6, the requirements for graduation honors were raised to reflect that change, Arévalo said.

The rationale for the change is that it should be more difficult to maintain honors designation over a four-year period than to be placed on the Dean's Honor Roll for a semester.

"The students who are claiming grade inflation are looking at one print-out of one semester. That doesn't determine grade inflation. You have to look at it over time," Arévalo said. "I believe our average grades are high, but I don't necessarily think it's grade inflation."

"Over time (with grade inflation), you see the average grades on this campus getting higher and higher and that's not the case," Arévalo said.

Arévalo said students should realize the new honors requirements probably only affect 30 potential graduates.

Despite placing four runners in the top 20, the Tiger men did not fare as well as the women. They scored 56 points, two less than the University of Missouri-Kansas City, good enough for 3rd. The Tigers top placers were freshman Jeth Fouts and junior Jason Shanahan, who finished 8th and 9th.

Junior A.J. Lee and two freshmen, Brian Michael and Carl Mackey, rounded out the scoring for the Tigers.

"They moved the ball very well up and down the field, they just were not able to put it into the end zone,"

Cortese said.

Senior full back Clint Bedore gained 106 yards on 20 carries, most of which came in the second half after he replaced Emmett Pride at the tailback position.

Pride went out of the ball game early in the third quarter with a bruised knee.

Although the Tigers were finally able to put some offensive points on the board, Cortese remains concerned about his offensive unit.

"It's nice to win, but we made some dumb mistakes. Twice the quarterback turned the wrong way. We're just not doing some of the little things that we need to do," Cortese said.

The win should give the Tigers some momentum as they head into conference play in the RMAC. The Tigers will be on the road Saturday as they take on Fort Lewis College in Durango, Colorado.
