Freshman ACCESS to Student Success Program

As you were informed at the end of last semester, on Monday, December 17, the administration of the Freshman ACCESS to Student Success Program moved to the Academic Advising and Career Exploration Center. This is the program for new on-campus freshman during their first year that requires them to meet with their academic advisor three times during their first two semesters at FHSU. This is to help with both their transition to the university and their success as a student through Advising, Connections, Circle of Support, Education, and Sense of Self. During the early spring, there will be Focus Groups to collect feedback on this program and make changes to begin in the fall 2019.

We have released a new advising report for advisors to be able to monitor which of their major one advisees is required to complete ACCESS to Student Success meetings throughout their first year. The report can be ran through TigerCentral

Advising by clicking on the CSV/Excel Advisee ACCESS Report.  This will download your on-campus advisees who are required to complete the six freshmen meetings during their first two semesters at FHSU. Advisors will be able to run it at any time.

The spring deadlines for ACCESS are below. Please make sure that you are sharing these with your advisees for them to avoid an enrollment hold on their account.

Friday, March 29 at 4:30 p.m. – Deadline for Spring 2

RAVE Test Scheduled for Friday, January 25

RAVE is our emergency text messaging system. It is not a highly used system, but it is one that is critically important for notifying the FHSU campus about urgent or emergency type situations. Last fall, we used this system one time, and we found that not everyone received the notification that should have received it. Because of that, Technology Services researched the problem and it is believed that the issues have now been resolved. The only way for us to know for certain though is to test the system. So, this next Friday, Jan. 25, 2019 at approximately 4:00 PM we will be sending out a test text message to try and see if system is working properly.

If you do not receive a text message from the system on Friday afternoon, and you believe that you should have, please send an email to RAVEtest@fhsu.edu to let us know that you did not receive the message. This will help us determine any additional issues and let us continue working to improve the system. After the test message is sent, we expect to discover

issues with phone number data in Workday and/or Tigertracks. For those issues that we find, we will be emailing individuals asking them to correct the information in the specific system we identify (Workday and/or Tigertracks).

Prior to the test, starting early next week, some individuals will be receiving an email notifying them of an issue with their contact information information. The email will explain what the issue is with the contact information, and what you need to do to correct it.

FHSU and K-State Juvenile Justice Initiative Seeks Locals

A team from Fort Hays State University is partnering with the K-State Juvenile Justice Collaborative on a project awarded funding by the Kansas Department of Corrections and the Kansas Advisory Group. The project, titled “Our Town, Our Kids,” aims to work with local communities in developing support systems for youth and families in order to prevent youth from entering the juvenile justice system and to provide services that maximize their chances of leading productive, successful lives. Michael Walker, director of the Docking Institute, and Dr. April Terry, assistant professor in the Department of Criminal Justice, are providing content expertise in the areas of data management and juvenile justice. They are joined by Luis Montelongo and Dr. Jian Sun as data analysts. The K-State JJC is comprised of Dr. L. Susan Williams, professor of sociology and criminology; Dr. Greg Paul, associate professor and interim department head of communication studies; Dr. Elaine Johannes, associate professor of family studies and human services and Extension specialist; and Bruce Chladny, K-State Research and Extension specialist.

Over the next two years, the group will work with stakeholders in 23 pre-selected Kansas counties (please see the website for a full list). They will build community capacity in data collection and analysis and foster community collaboration in support of youth and families. Professionals from K-State Research and Extension will facilitate local conversations that identify areas of concern and develop knowledge bases that will prepare communities to deliver best-practice programs in their respective areas. As part of the effort to engage positive community support, the group will develop a comprehensive toolkit for all Kansas communities that will facilitate local, sustainable systems that serve unique needs of youth.

POLS 675 VB: Latino Politics – A New 8-Week Online Short Course!

For the first time in university history, a seminar course focused on Latino political opinion formation and socio-political behavior is being offered by the Political Science department. The online seminar will explore a wide array of topics, such as the following:

- what are the social and political factors that led to the development of the pan-ethnic labels of Hispanic and Latino to describe diverse ethnic groups?
- which considerations can consistently predict whether individuals are comfortable identifying as being a member of a pan-ethnic group?
- why do major Latino ethnic groups display differences in ideological views and voting participation levels?
- under what circumstances do Latinos form political alliances with other prominent racial/ethnic groups (e.g. African Americans, Asian Americans, etc.)?
- how might recent controversies regarding immigration policy shape Latino political attitudes or beliefs about the American political system?
