Once logged in, follow these simple steps to schedule your screening:

- Login or create an account on the Online Scheduler
- Select Hays from the list of cities
- Select the Location/Date you want to attend
- A list of times will appear. Select the time that works best for your schedule.
- Answer a few simple questions and click Create Appointment

### What is a Biometric Screening?

Knowing cholesterol or blood glucose values can help you identify serious risks and manage or prevent health problems before they occur. HealthQuest sponsors free biometric screenings at worksites statewide. Testing is conducted in 30 minutes or less using a simple finger stick. Results you will receive include:

- Total Cholesterol, HDL, LDL and total Cholesterol to HDL ratio
- Triglycerides and Glucose
- Systolic and Diastolic Blood Pressure
- Height, Weight, and Body Mass Index (BMI)
- Waist Circumference

Remember for best results to fast for a minimum of 9 hours prior to your appointment. Water, tea and black coffee (no cream or sugar) are okay. Take medications as usual also.

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## Email Policy

In December, 2018, FHSU Cabinet approved an updated email policy. The updated policy can be viewed at <https://www.fhsu.edu/policies/info-access/index>

The main purpose behind this change was to clarify the language about forwarding email. The policy now reads: "Faculty and staff are not to automatically forward their official @fhsu.edu e-mail to another vendor for themselves including their @mail.fhsu.edu Google account. Unauthorized automatic forwards will be removed by Technology Services." We will start enforcing this portion of the policy on **Friday, March 8, 2019**. Tech Services will remove the "forwarding" setting on any account forwarded to another email system. We will also remove any mail rules that redirect email to another email system.

Security and legal requirements are the primary reasons for keeping all FHSU email within one mail system. We can't ensure that data are being protected in accordance with FERPA, HIPAA, and other regulations when internal communications are being forwarded outside of FHSU's control. We're also required to report privacy breaches to our students, which is impossible to do when our internal communications are funneled to outside platforms. We've invested in additional security features and protection for our Outlook email system, which is why we aren't allowing Outlook email to be forwarded to FHSU Gmail. Additionally, keeping all FHSU email within Outlook also gives us the ability to respond to litigation holds and Kansas Open Records Act requests.

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## TILT Tip: Learning Objectives Series – 6 Create

“Create” is the highest level in Bloom’s Taxonomy, and it relies on the foundations of knowledge and skills built on the previous five levels. In other words, it requires substantial knowledge and skills in a subject area to create something new: a theory, a model, a product, etc. Therefore, learning objectives related to this level are more likely to appear in advanced courses than foundation courses. Imagine if you ask a group of elementary students to create a business proposal, - however fun and creative their proposal might be, it probably will not work. However, the same assignment makes much more sense in a business school master level course. We usually use the following verbs in writing learning objectives related to “Create”: generate, hypothesize, propose, plan, design, produce, create, construct, make, develop, etc. Assessments on “Create” should utilize in-depth and complicated activities, such as: authentic problems for students to solve, real world cases, research project, paper, etc.
