All current Fort Hays State University faculty and unclassified staff members at levels comparable to academic faculty are eligible. **All disciplines are eligible.**

The successful candidate exhibits many, if not all, of the following attributes:

- Supervises successful discipline-appropriate research performed by undergraduate students
- Promotes student dissemination or publication of undergraduate research
- Is recognized by colleagues for engaging students in undergraduate research
- Devotes time outside of class to working with students on undergraduate research
- Promotes interest in undergraduate research among his or her peers
- Seeks professional development to expand and inspire his or her own undergraduate research activities

TILT Tip: Knowledge Series Metacognitive Knowledge

Metacognitive knowledge is the knowledge regarding one's cognition, and Metacognition literally means "thinking about thinking". Pintrich (2002) pointed out that there are three aspects in metacognitive knowledge: Strategic Knowledge, Conditional Knowledge, and Self-Knowledge. These three aspects affect a learner's abilities to (a) recognize the need for new strategy in problem-solving, (b) develop new strategy to better problem-solve, and (c) evaluate when to implement new strategies.
