[Eric Gerard Completes Police Officer's Basic Training Course](#)

On May 10th, 2019, Eric Gerard completed the Police Officer's Basic Training Course at the Kansas University Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center (KLETC) in Yoder, KS. The course is a fourteen-week block of instruction where officer candidates learn the basic skills of a law enforcement officer.

Eric was hired by the UPD in October of 2018 and began his training at KLETC in February on 2019. Eric worked in various occupations in Hays and graduated from Fort Hays State University with a Bachelor's of Science in both Justice Studies and Psychology.
