Parking Notice

On Monday afternoon, (8/12/19), the University Police Department will begin to barricade areas directly affected by students moving into the residence halls. UPD begins this process on Monday due to the time involved with identifying the owner of non-registered vehicles, and giving motorists time to move their vehicles. Once the barricades are up, UPD will begin contacting the owners of vehicles to ask them to move their vehicles. Employees will be allowed to remain parked in these areas until the end of the workday on Monday. Beginning Tuesday, no one will be allowed to park within the barricaded areas.

Beginning Monday, the following areas will be barricaded, Lot G behind McMIndes Hall, McMIndes Circle in front of McMIndes Hall, Lot F2 on the east side of McMIndes Circle, the circle drive in front of Custer Hall, the west side of Custer Drive between Dwight Drive and Agnew Lane, the east side of Lyman Drive between Dwight Drive and Agnew Lane and the portion of Lot I directly to the south of Victor E. Village.

On Tuesday (8/13/19), the University Police Department will continue contacting owners of vehicles that remain in the barricaded areas to have them move. These areas will remain barricaded until Thursday afternoon when the move-in has been completed.

If you work in the Residential Life area and park there Monday morning, you will be allowed to wait until the end of the workday before being required to move your vehicle. If contacted by UPD about moving your vehicle, advise them that you will do so at that time. All others parking in the Residential life area will be asked to move their vehicle as soon as possible. Keep in mind that the area will be barricaded and parking may not be available Monday afternoon through Thursday afternoon.

The Residential Life area of campus will be heavily congested with traffic on Wednesday and Thursday as the students move in. If you work in the Residential Life Area and arrive for work between 7:30 a.m. and noon on these days, expect to park farther away than normal and walk or take the University Shuttle.

The University Police Department wishes to express their sincere thanks to the University community in their cooperation with this matter. UPD would also like to remind you that parking permits may be obtained online (www.fhsu.edu/police) and picked up the following week or mailed through the campus mail system to avoid the traffic congestion in this area at these times.

Public Safety Advisory: Surviving an Active Shooter Event

In light of recent mass active shooter tragedies in El Paso, Texas and Dayton, Ohio, I'm sending out a reminder of Fort Hays State University "[Active Shooter Safety Guidelines](#)". Since most incidents are over within minutes, students, faculty, and staff must be prepared to react to the situation until first responders arrive. In an active shooter situation, you should quickly determine the most reasonable way to protect your own life. You should:

1. **Run:** If there is an accessible escape path, attempt to evacuate the premises and go to a place of safety and call 911.
2. **Hide:** If evacuation is not possible, find a place to hide where the active shooter is less likely to find you.
3. **Fight:** As a last resort, and only when your life is in imminent danger, attempt to disrupt and/or incapacitate the active shooter.
4. **Resources:** Refer below for more detailed information on surviving an active shooter event.

2019-2020 Parking Permits

2019-2020 Parking Permits are on sale now.

FHSU Zone 1, Zone 2, and motorcycle/moped/motor scooter parking permits will be available for purchase. The FHSU Police Department encourages you to save time by **purchasing your permit online** accessed through your TigerTracks in the Online Services tab. <https://fhsupd.t2hosted.com/Account/Portal>.

Permits must be purchased and properly displayed no later than **August 26, 2019** for any vehicle parking on campus. All faculty, staff, and students are required to register their vehicles online each school year in order to receive their permit, regardless if the vehicle had been registered the prior year.

Choose to pick your permit up at the University Police Department, located at 112 Custer Hall. If you choose another delivery, make sure your address is updated...USPS delivery may result in delayed delivery of your permit. (It is recommended that you not select your permanent address.) When you pick up your permit be sure you have a current ID with you.

ZONE 1: You are commuting and do not live in the Residential Life Halls.

ZONE 2: (a) You live on Campus in a Residential Life Hall or (b) **ONLY** want to park in the Cunningham Hall/GMC parking lots.

How to Purchase your Parking Permit Online

Step 1: Log into Tiger Tracks

Step 2: Go to Online Services

Step 3: Scroll down to Parking Permits

Step 4: Click on purchase a parking permit

Step 5: Click on Manage Account and login

-Make sure the Information is correct

-Click on vehicles at the top of the screen and verify information

-Click add if your vehicle is not in the system

Step 6: Click on Permits and select Get Permits

Step 7: Select what type of Permit you need and click the agreement box

Step 8: Check which vehicle you want that permit for,

-if you have multiple vehicles and then click next

Step 9: Click where you would like it mailed or pick it up at University Police

- Your local address is the preferred location

Step 10: Select payment option and click Pay Now

Step 11: Congratulations You're Done!!

Perseid Meteor Shower Watch Party

- Kansas Wetlands Education Center to host Perseid Meteor Shower Watch Party August 9 at 9pm, travel to KWEC for FREE, family fun activities. The Perseid shower results when debris from the Swift-Tuttle comet enters the atmosphere. As the particles burn up, they appear as shooting stars radiating from the constellation Perseus.

Participants can rotate through activities including:

- An inflatable planetarium, which allows for viewing the sky even if the weather does not cooperate.
- Egg Drop, lunar landing STEM challenge - can you make a safe, economic lunar lander for your "eggstronaut"?
- A craft to make a constellation luminary – a good, take-home reminder.
- Glow-in-the-dark wiffle ball, a crowd favorite from years past.
- Smores, with the fire pit manned by a local Boy Scout troop.
- A “moon dust” footprint photo, in which visitors can have a photo taken of their own re-enactment of the footprints Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin left 50 years ago.
- And a craft to make solar-system hats, courtesy of the Great Bend Public Library.

- Once it is dark enough, visitors will be encouraged to stargaze and look for the meteor show. Bring blankets and chairs for comfort.
