## Forsyth Library Presents the “George F. Sternberg Exhibition”

The George F. Sternberg Exhibition is now on display in the Special Exhibits Gallery on the main level of Forsyth Library. George F. Sternberg was a pioneering vertebrate paleontologist and fossil collector. From the 1910s through the 1950s Sternberg participated in paleontological digs all over the world. He helped found the Sternberg Museum of Natural History. The George F. Sternberg Collection held by the University Archives contains a variety of materials related to his paleontological research including field notes, journals, fossil lists, personal letters, lecture notes, scrapbooks and nine photograph albums. The materials displayed represent George F. Sternberg’s remarkable career and the history of paleontological study at Fort Hays State University.

1. A paper copy of the Campus Directory will be distributed to your campus mailbox this week. Every effort has been made to provide the most up-to-date information in this directory, using data collected through August 1, 2019. However, change frequently happens throughout the University and organizational structure, titles, personnel, telephone numbers, and office locations may have changed since the date of publication. Please email all corrections to [directory@fhsu.edu](mailto:directory@fhsu.edu). All University employees have the ability to update their own contact information in WorkDay and are encouraged to do so when changes arise.

2. The current online directory on the university webpage will be replaced with a new and different type of A-Z Directory maintained by University Relations and Marketing. This directory is organized alphabetically by budget unit and is linked to departmental webpages. Please email all corrections to [directory@fhsu.edu](mailto:directory@fhsu.edu).

3. The placement of a student, faculty, and staff online directory will be available in TigerTracks and Tiger Central that will be password protected. This means anyone with a TigerNetID account can access the directory but it will no longer be publicly available under the "Directory" tab on the University's initial webpage.

These are changes that will assist faculty and staff in accessing information promptly to provide excellent customer service to all of our constituents. In addition, with this information unavailable for external clients, we are hopeful it reduces email spam.

If you are wondering about the Campus Directory Work Group, here is a bit of information. The Work Group was created by President Mason to review the need for a campus directory that can be efficiently accessed electronically. In the interim, a paper copy of the directory has been created to fill that void until a technological replacement can be created. ### **What is a Biometric Screening?**

Knowing cholesterol or blood glucose values can help you identify serious risks and manage or prevent health problems before they occur. - Total Cholesterol, HDL, LDL and total Cholesterol to HDL ratio
