Next to "Look in" it might say "On My Computer." Click the arrow next to this box to switch it to "LNapps/FHSU." In the box below, scroll down to "apps" and open, then scroll down to "Track II Reassigned Time" and open. The process will open and will also be placed on your Workspace for future use.

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## Fall '19 Mid-Term Grades due 10-14-2019 by Noon

REMINDER:

**Fall '19 on-campus 16-week mid-term grade entry is due Monday, October 14, 2019 by Noon.**

Please remember, mid-term grades are only reported for on-campus 16-week courses.

Mid-term grades are NOT reported for virtual classes or short courses such as 8-week courses.

Please Note: For instructors teaching short courses (on-campus or virtual), such as an 8-week course, FINAL grade entry does not begin until after the 16-week mid-term grade entry period described above has ended. This semester, 8-week **final** grade entry does not begin until October 15, 2019.

All mid-term grades for **full-semester (16 week) on-campus classes** must be entered through the online TigerCentral grade entry system.

Instructors (full-time, part-time, adjunct, etc.) can access the grade entry system by clicking on “Faculty/Staff” at the top of the FHSU home page. Then, under the “Logins” heading click on the TigerCentral link. Click on “Sign in with CAS”, and the system will then ask for your TigerNet ID Username and Password. After logging in, hover over the “Teaching” tab, and click on “Grade Entry.” On the “Mid-Term” tab, click on “Enter Fall 2019 Hays Mid-Term Grades.”

If you have problems or technical difficulties with your Username and Password, please call Tiger Tech at 785-628-3478.

Mid-Term grades are **not** saved until all of the following steps are completed:

- Enter a mid-term grade for each name on the class roster
- Click the Submit button
- A red checkmark appears next to the course title
- Mid-term grades **cannot** be changed or entered after the mid-term grade entry deadline

All mid-term grades must be submitted by Monday, October 14, before Noon Central Time.

  - b. Has been employed by FHSU, full-time or part-time, for at least three years (must have at least three years of service as of July 1 of the nominating year).
  - c. Has not previously received this award in the last five years.
  - d. Will receive a certificate and a \$500 check.
2. FHSU Student
  - a. A current full-time student at FHSU.
  - b. Employed as a student employee within the Campus Operations & Services job family or as a student employee providing services for the FHSU food service.
  - c. Has been employed as a student employee by FHSU for a period of at least one year as of July 1 of the nominating year and enrolled as a full-time student for the upcoming academic year.
  - d. Has not previously received this award.
  - e. Will receive a certificate and a \$250 check (two awards will be given, one for Food Services and one for Campus Operations & Services).
3. FHSU Food Services Employee
  - a. Currently employed at FHSU food service providing services for FHSU students, staff, faculty and/or University guests.
  - b. Has been employed at FHSU food services providing services for FHSU for a period of at least three years as of July 1 of the nominating year.
  - c. Has not previously received this award in the last five years.
  - d. Will receive a certificate and a \$500 check.

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## Faculty and Staff Exchange Opportunities in Xi'an and Lanzhou, China – Summer 2020

Northwest University of Political Science and Law (NWUPL), located in Xi'an, China, and Northwest Minzu University (NWMU), located in Lanzhou, China, have faculty and staff exchange partnerships with FHSU.

Both universities send faculty scholars to FHSU during the Spring semester and, in exchange, FHSU is invited to send 10 faculty or staff for about 2 weeks to each of the universities.

1. For NWUPL, FHSU has chosen the dates of May 18-31.

FHSU will provide for international airfare, single-occupancy hotel (Xi'an Ji Yuan International Hotel) immediately across the street from the NWUPL campus, and the cost of a China tourist visa. NWUPL will provide meals or stipends for meals, local transportation and entrance tickets for sightseeing. Terracotta Soldiers, Wild Goose Pagoda, and Shaanxi Museum are just a few of the cultural experiences faculty may enjoy. FHSU faculty and staff are responsible for delivering at least one presentation during the visit.

2. For NWMU, FHSU has chosen the dates of May 18-31 for Group 1 and May 23-June 7 for Group 2.

NWMU will provide for international airfare, lodging, meals, and local transportation. FHSU will provide for the cost of a China tourist visa. FHSU faculty and staff are responsible for delivering at least one presentation during the visit.

If you are possibly interested in applying for any of these 2-week educational and cultural experiences in Xi'an or Lanzhou, please attend an introductory meeting **October 14 from 3:30-4:30 PM** in the **Field Conference Room of Sheridan Hall**. The deadline for applications is October 31. Both NWUPL and NWMU will select 10 participants for each university. Once announced, FHSU's Office of Global Partnerships will hold additional
