### Workday DOWN this weekend for Milestone 1 Implementation

**WHAT:** Workday Milestone 1 being put into production

**WHEN:** THIS WEEKEND, Dec. 7-8

**IMPACT DETAILS:** Workday Milestone 1 is being put into production **this weekend, Dec. 7-8**. For this to occur, Workday will be shut down this weekend **starting at 8:00 AM Saturday, Dec, 7**. The expectation is that Workday will be **back online and available Monday morning, Dec. 9**. Milestone 1 puts course information and the basic University academic hierarchy into place (colleges, departments, programs, etc). Additionally, the HR external site (applying for positions) will be down this weekend. Student applications for admission will be available this weekend! However, the **Admissions module** within Workday will be down this weekend and this module will not be available until approximately **Dec. 12**. FHSU's Curriculum Management system in Workday will be "Live" by Dec. 16, 2019.

The Graduate Office will be unable to forward admission applications to graduate faculty for review nor render application decisions during this enhancement.

Undergraduate applications can be submitted during this time, but will not be processed until on or after Dec. 12<sup>th</sup>.

**REQUESTED TOPICS:** All topics are welcome. NSSE data indicate need in some particular areas:

**1. Collaborative Learning** (Per NSSE data, both seniors and freshmen at FHSU are behind their peers in the following areas: asking other students to help them understand course material, explaining course material to others themselves, preparing for exams by discussing topics or working with other students, working with other students on course assignments, and giving course presentations.)

**2. Student Interaction with Faculty** (Per NSSE data, seniors at FHSU are behind their peers in these areas: talking to a faculty member about their career plans, working with faculty members on activities other than coursework, discussing course topics, ideas, or concepts outside of class, and discussing academic performance with a faculty member.)

**3. Student Participation** (Per NSSE data, seniors at FHSU are behind their peers in these areas: participation in an internship, co-op, field experience, student teaching, or clinical placement; holding a formal role in a student org or group; participation in a learning community; participation in study abroad; working with a faculty member on a research project; and completing a culminating experience- capstone, senior project or thesis, comp exam, portfolio, etc.)

**NEW at this Professional Development Day:**

**1. Revisit sessions:** Did you present at a prior PDD (or another event)? Would you be willing to meet with those who have attended your session/s, to discuss how they are doing with implementing the strategies you presented? Host a conversational session (These will be placed in conference rooms) to discuss a prior topic, and share what you've learned with colleagues.

**2. Networking UnCommons:** Some of the best PD is found in casual conversation with colleagues. At this event, the Black and Gold Room will be a designated area for such casual conversations. There will be both tables with designated

table topics and open tables, to facilitate meaningful discussion. There will also be beverages available in this area throughout the day.

The Fort Hays State University Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Winds will perform their second concert of the year, entitled "Stars and Surprises" on Friday, December 6th at 7:30 in the Beach/Schmidt Performing Arts Center.

The Fort Hays Symphonic Winds, under the direction of Dr. Peter Lillpopp, will open the concert with Sergei Prokofiev's *Athletic Festival March*. Prokofiev, familiar to many as the composer of *Peter and the Wolf* was a lifelong sports fan who penned the jaunty march during the years 1935-37. Directly following, student conductor Abigail Hirsch a senior music education major from Abilene will lead the ensemble in Franz Beibl's *Ave Maria*.
