- 1. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 3:32pm
- 2. Attendance through Zoom

 - Rob Byer moves to approve the agenda as presented; seconded by Bill Stark. **Approved.**
- 4. Approval of February 9, 2021 Minutes
 - Helen Miles moves to approve the agenda as presented; seconded by Jeni McRay. **Approved.**
- 5. Announcements and Information Items
 - a. Guest Announcements
 - i. Provided by Provost Arensdorf
 - 1. **Low Enrollment Programs**: Report shared and approved by the board on 2/17/21; <u>Low Enrollment Program Report</u>
 - 2. **Online versus Remote Teaching**: A document was shared to help people better understand differences between online and remote teaching. President Mason has been testifying regrading an amendment (i.e., refunding tuition for classes that were moved online or were canceled). The document about online versus remote teaching will be used to both educate and justify decisions made when managing COVID 19.

- 3. **Enrollment**: 20th day enrollment numbers are not final; students enrolled in 8-week classes starting in March and final numbers from China partnerships are not included.
- 4. **Strategic Plan:** Work continues for year two initiatives; work will begin on year three strategies soon; a university-wide update will be shared in early April.
- 5. **Spring 2021 Commencement**: Work continues and plans will be shared March 15th.

6. Advising:

- a. Advising task force formed 19/20 that brought forth ideas for moving forward with advising at FHSU; some next steps for advising will be announced this spring; minimal change is expected at this point.
- b. Workday advising is underway. Please seek out help as needed from Patty Griffin and her team; they are setting up a trouble shooting room and additional resources to help students and advisors successfully manage enrollment; more resources also can be found on the Workday website: https://www.fhsu.edu/workday/
- 7. **Budget:** FHSU is facing a unique scenario given our enrollment is down for the first time in 19 years. The budget committee is navigating being down in enrollment combined with state-wide budget cuts; goals are to get the on-campus enrollment steady and then work to grow online enrollment.
- 8. **Tenure and Promotion Task force:** Please see Cabinet notes for more information; first meeting of this group will be March 18th.
- 9. **Dean Search**: All searches that were ongoing are now complete.
- **Discussion**: Tony Gabel asked for more information on budget concerns. Provost Arensdorf and others are focused on areas of growth, ways to absorb state-wide cuts, and taking calculated risks (e.g., what are the right risks that we take now to invest in our future; focused on where there might be room to add certain positions; efforts to move forward with strategic enrollment initiatives). Provost Arensdorf urges us not to get caught up in national and state-wide dialogue (e.g., KBOR policy). FHSU is not planning to use that policy.
