  - a) Created between FS Student Affairs committee and provostial committee.

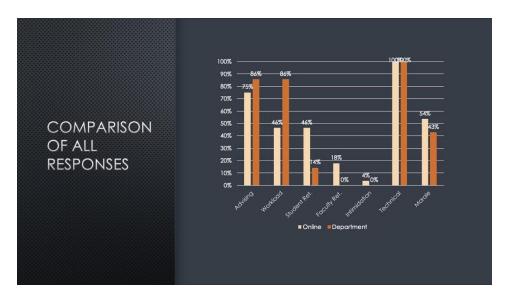
